Folkestone Sports Centre – It is great news that the Sports Trust has announced that it has purchased Folkestone Sports Centre and intend to reopen facilities as soon as possible. Once again, Roger De Haan has come to the rescue of Folkestone and instead of being considered for housing it is once again going to provide sporting facilities, including swimming for the Community. The Sports Trust will run Folkestone Sports Centre alongside the

Three Hills Sports Centre and F51 Skate Park. This is very welcome news for the District.

Local Government Reorganisation – initial feedback has been received from the Secretary of State. This feedback will need to be considered by all Kent & Medway Councils before any decisions are made on the next steps. It will be interesting to hear the views of the new administration at Kent County Council and to understand how the Local Government Re-organisation will affect local residents. Final proposals have to be submitted by the end of November 2025.

Road of Remembrance – We have recently been given an update on the landslip works above the Road of Remembrance undertaken by KCC. It is a very complicated scope of work that is required and the design has been agreed in principle. Once contract is awarded, work is expected to take approximately six months.

Personal – I have been overwhelmed by the flowers, messages and cards on the death of my husband Roy on 11 May. Please accept my thanks for such support which has been hugely welcome and has given me some comfort. After over 60 years together, I am finding it a very challenging time and appreciate enormously the kindness of friends, family and residents. Thank you.

KCC CLLR Christopher Hespe – (Reform UK) – Elham Valley – christopher.hespe@kent.gov.uk

Following the County Council elections on 1 May 2025, I now have the great honour of representing the Elham Valley division on the County Council. It is a large area of some 20,000 people and 8,000 homes, that includes Sellindge, with some of the loveliest countryside and villages in the Southeast. The Elham Valley division includes the larger settlements of Hawkinge, Densole, Elham and Lyminge, with smaller villages in the South such as Postling, Newington and Peene, Elmsted and Bodsham in the North.

Firstly, may I offer my thanks to outgoing County Councillor Susan Carey, who many readers will recognise as a hard-working champion of our beautiful area.

I will write again about my priorities as a Councillor, but rest assured, I will endeavour at all times to preserve all that is best about the area, whilst seeking to ensure any development is sensitive and fits with your neighbourhood plans.

The challenges for the new Reform UK administration in KCC are enormous. We have inherited a Council debt from the outgoing Conservative administration of more than £700 million and there are significant 'in-year' savings to be made totalling tens of millions of pounds. But there is real determination to get the best for Kent's residents and businesses, achieve value for money, and 'do things differently' if it makes sense financially and in terms of service delivery. We have pledged to make savings, so there will be wide consultation on proposals in due course, in which I hope residents of Sellindge will participate. We have a number of proposals to make life a little better in Kent, and these will be announced over time, but we will of course prioritise the continued delivery of our statutory core services of Adult Social Care, Special Educational Needs, Highways and Education.

The other 'big issue' on the horizon is **local government review**, with the prospect of the government potentially merging KCC and the district councils and dividing the County into three or four Unitary authorities. I would be keen to keep you in touch as proposals develop, but I can state that my view would always be to devolve power and responsibilities, where feasible and practicable, to localities.

Over time, Kent County Council, under the new leadership of Linden Kemkaran, will outline its position on a number of matters that will be of interest to residents of Sellindge Parish, including on the proliferation of proposals for excessively **large solar farms**; achieving good **community benefits** on the back of housing developments; the opportunities that should be presented through **disposal of KCC owned properties**, and the opportunities for **procurement** to benefit local small businesses rather than the large, multi-nationals.

Although I have worked for public agencies at national, county, regional and national levels and was a local government Director, I've never been an elected representative. But I am determined to do my best for you. Here are a few matters that will be of interest to the Parish:

Small Member Grants – Let me know if you have a project, event or group activity which you would like to be considered for a small grant from KCC. This is for voluntary organisations with a bank account; usually constituted. Recipients could be clubs, societies, voluntary groups, church groups and not-for-profit organisations. Usual size of a grant is £250 to £500. It could even fund small highways projects, such as lowering kerbs for wheelchairs or installing a new road sign. Should take 12 weeks maximum from you contacting me to us getting the money out of the door.

Waste Transfer Station Proposal, Westenhanger – The planning application for the proposed development of a waste transfer station, which would provide facilities to sort household waste, is continuing to go through the motions. There has been extensive consultation involving the Parishes of Aldington and Bonnington, Smeeth, Lympne and Sellindge (including from the Residents' Association).

Comments have been fed back to the applicant organisation (WW Martin and KCC).

Potential Port Delays – The EU Entry/Exit System is likely to come in to force at the Port of Dover in October or November 2025. This new scheme will require travellers to have biometric data eg face scanning and fingerprints, taken at the Port of Dover before French customs officials will allow travellers to cross the Channel. Although much of the information that will be required will be able to be uploaded from home electronically prior to departure, the Kent and Medway Resilience Forum fears that there may be significant delays at Dover, This may therefore necessitate Operation Brock being put in place, possibly for a lengthy period, as the Roundhill Tunnels can not be allowed to hold stationary traffic. Sometime in 2026, the EU will introduce a further requirement known as ETIAS, which is effectively a visa costing approx. £7, which will be required for each trip to the EU.

Let's Talk Kent – KCC has a portal through which all major consultations will be posted to seek the public's views and comments. The public can sign up to be a consultee. Currently, 60,000 people have signed up to 'Let's Talk Kent', which now covers consultations on local schemes, county-wide budgetary proposals, priorities and savings proposals, public rights of way changes and highways matters.

Dear all

June is a busy month for the church as we have Pentecost on 8th June when we remember the gift of the Holy Spirit and the week after is Trinity Sunday. This year on Trinity Sunday we are celebrating the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea which was the first time that the church got together to try and agree what we believe. The Council met in May and stayed talking until the end of the July. What came out of the Council was the Nicene Creed which is a statement of faith shared by the majority of Christian churches. It's considered the most widely accepted creed in Christianity, serving as a shared statement of fundamental belief. It says what we believe and is said regularly as part of worship in our churches. It really helps to have such a statement, but it is a bit tricky in places to unpick so from Trinity Sunday 15th June onwards the Church of England will have lots of things on its social media explaining it, if you would like to know more.

We have decided to extend the communion service at Sellindge church to the end of the year. I think we have a viable church community which we would like to see grow. It will be on the second Sunday at 11am. This month it will be on 8th June. Do come along, you will be very welcome.
