

**Green Grant Programme** – I was pleased to support the applications in the North Downs West Ward as follows – Postling Village Hall – £11,700 - Solar PV & battery storage systems

In the Sticks Childcare - £10,944 - Solar PV & battery storage systems for Lyminge nursery Rebel Farmer - £1,000 - Conservation event Lyminge

**Folkestone** – **A Brighter Future** – Work is now fully underway on this £20m regeneration scheme initiated under the previous Administration. At the last full Council Meeting I raised the issue of traffic disruption all around the town. I understand KCC are directing the works and are working hard to resolve problems.

**Princes Parade** – The Leader of the Council has confirmed that the Princes Parade site will remain exactly as it is for the time being. It will be interesting to see how this changes under the Local Government Organisation.

Otterpool Park – a further collaboration agreement has been signed with Homes England and I await to hear further details.

**Local Government Re-organisation** – the 14 Districts of Kent and Medway continue to meet to try and come to a consensus as to how Kent & Medway should be divided into unitary bodies and how many. I attend the FHDC working group and from the information I have heard and read, if there is not a consensus by the 28 November 2025, then Government will direct. We do know that the timeline is for new shadow unitary bodies to be set-up in May 2027 and for the new structure to go live in May 2028.

**Ward Budget** – I still have some funding available to support local organisations – please email me with any request up to £500. I have recently supported Canterbury Beekeepers to the tune of £274 to provide an Asian hornet trap in North Downs West.

I was sorry to hear that 'Jim' Bryant has recently died and I send my sincere condolences to his wife and family. Jim has lived in Sellindge all of his life and most people would have come across him in one way or another either through the Parish Council, the Sports & Social Club, tending his allotment or walking around the Village. I have known him since Primary School days! May he rest in peace.

**Reforming Kent's Roads** – The new Administration at Kent County Council pledged to address the problem of potholes in Kent, which was raised constantly during the May 2025 elections. So in response, KCC has agreed to invest £67 million to repair, renew and protect Kent's 5,400-mile road network. Some 12,000 potholes have been repaired between April and the end of July 2025, and additional crews are on the roads dealing with repairs and improvements. Please report road defects and potholes to KCC on-line if possible, or by telephone if it is easier.

Budget Consultation – Closing date 29 September 2025 – Kent County Council has to set a balanced budget and therefore is consulting the public currently regarding the budget for 2026/27. Most of KCCs budget comes from Council Tax, business rates, government grants and income from service users. The cost of delivering services is expected to rise by £124 million and the funding is forecast to grow by only £74 million. So, the funding gap for the next financial year will be at least £50 million. KCC is keen to hear residents' views on which services they would be happy to see cut or protected, and suggestions on how to make savings and increase income.

Member Community Grants – Each elected Member of KCC has a small amount of funding to allocate in grants to voluntary and not-for-profit organisations, primarily for events and activities. The grants are usually in the region of £250 or £500 and aim to enhance the wider community. ### STOUR DOWNS PARISH Vicar's letter – September 2025

Rev. Susan Vicar, Stour Downs (Brabourne, Mersham, Monks Horton, Sellindge, Smeeth and Stowting).

Right now, in the church we are looking forward to harvest festivals which now support our foodbank. In Sellindge church it takes place on September 14<sup>th</sup>. We have boxes in all our church porches, and you can leave things there for the foodbank anytime, but we particularly make collections at harvest time. Harvest is an opportunity for us to thank God for his provision.

Rural life is deeply attuned to the rhythm of the seasons, and perhaps no one understands change better than those who live by the land. Each spring, the earth wakes from its slumber, fields blush with green, and lambs totter unsteadily in the dew. Summer brings abundance, autumn a slow, golden fading, and winter, a hush and a promise. Our church calendar, too, marks the year's passage with feasts and fasts—Easter's resurrection hope, The Harvest Festival where we thank God for his provision, Advent's anticipation, and Christmas's joy. Just as the hedgerows adapt to frost and sun, so too do we, learning to weather times of plenty and times of want, trusting in God's provision.

Our farmers remind us daily that change, while sometimes unsettling, is also renewal. A storm may flatten a crop, but from fallen trees and scattered seed, new life emerges. In this way, the land mirrors the Christian message of renewal and resurrection—reminding us of God's promise to make all things new.

Change is a constant companion, quietly weaving its way through the tapestry of our everyday lives. In our village, nestled amid winding lanes and ancient hedgerows, and in the churches, we find comfort and strength in our faith, gathering each Sunday to worship, pray, and reflect. Our sense of continuity is rooted not just in familiar faces and stories passed down, but also in the enduring presence of our church and the teachings that guide us. Even the most time-honoured traditions have grown and evolved, shaped by the gentle, persistent hand of change and the steadfastness of Christian hope.

Change will continue to arrive, sometimes quietly, sometimes with great fanfare. Our village will keep evolving because we are a living, breathing community. There will be debates, mistakes, and learning, but also moments of joy and pride as we remember all we have achieved. As we look forward to the coming school year, let us remain rooted in the values that have always defined us—kindness, resilience, neighbourliness, and compassion.
