Household Support Fund – The Council, via KCC, have received funding to help families with children and pensioners. In terms of type of support, the emphasis of this funding is to support households with energy bills. Food and water bills also remain priorities. It can also be used to support households with essential costs related to those items and with wider essential costs. In exceptional cases of genuine emergency, it can additionally be used to support housing costs where existing housing support schemes do not meet this exceptional need. Low-income homeowner occupiers will be supported to explore energy efficiency measures relating to appliances and domestic boilers. UK Shared Prosperity Fund Following a successful bid to central government, the district council has been allocated £1 million over three years and this will be used to support residents experiencing challenges caused by cost of living increases. Cabinet members approved a local investment plan last week (20 July) which will see support provided through established services within the district. These include community hubs, food banks and local training and advice services. Interventions will include support to develop skills such as learning to cook on low budgets, healthier eating, reducing food waste and providing financial help.
