Other Information or advice:

- The most common theme for the North Downs appears to be theft from motor vehicles and other theft offences, there has been a number of thefts from motor vehicles across Folkestone & Hythe District, opportunists have been trying door handles on vehicles, working their way along streets & taking whatever items from vehicles that have been left insecure. Always remove valuables from your vehicle when possible and never leave them on display. But most relevant of all for this particular method is to lock your car!
- Heating Oil Theft With the price of fuel remaining at an all time high, this makes it highly desirable to thieves. Consider security options for your vehicle such as, parking off road/ secure parking, CCTV and dash cams.

 Burglaries – With the longer nights there is typically a rise in burglaries, remember to secure your property appropriately overnight. Remember to lock doors and easily accessible windows, and do not leave the keys where they can be seen or reached from outside the property. Thieves are generally targeting cash, jewellery, and small electronic devices that have value and are easy to sell on.
