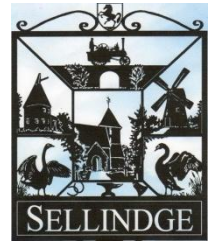

BT RED PHONE BOX

The Parish Council are very pleased to announce that they have successfully adopted the BT Red Phone Box at Greenfields.

Currently the Parish Council are sourcing the correct colour paint which is 'BT Phone Box Red', so it can be brought back to 'good as new condition'.

The Phone Box will undergo a complete internal and external refurbishment, early in 2018.

The Parish Council are considering having another defibrillator installed into the phone box and perhaps a DVD Library.

There had been suggestions of have a Book Library in the Phone Box, similar to the Phone Box in Stanford. However the Parish Council have concerns that as the KCC Mobile Library visits this location every two weeks, having a Library in the Phone Box at this location may jeopardise this service.

The Parish Council are now looking into adopting the other two phone boxes in the Village, located at the Co – Op and also down at the lay – by near the Church. But BT has said that they would have to carry out a consultation on these first.

Although these two phone boxes are of modern design, they could be refurbished and converted to another use for the benefit of the Village and become a Village asset.





The Parish Council met on Tuesday December 12th where six Parish Councillors, the Parish Clerk and the Parish Administration Officer were present. There was also four members of the public present.

The Minutes of the November meeting was found to be correct and signed and dated by the Chairman.

Unfortunately neither the SDC or KCC Councillors could be present, but there are reports form in in this issue.

The residents open session – several questions were raised.

- A Lady resident asked for an update of the **Red Telephone Box** (*see front page*)
- A Gentleman resident brought up the threat of axing the **18A Bus Service**, the resident said that it was being done without any consultation. However Councillor Fursdon has researched the subject and it will be going to consultation early in the New Year see separate article.
- Another Gentleman resident mention the confusion of having two Parish Council Websites. The Parish Clerk said that now there is only one www.sellindge-pc.gov.uk. The Parish Council had asked EIS who host the other website to take in Sellindge one down months ago, this has finally been done. The resident went on to ask why the Parish Council wait until the Minutes have been agreed before they are published. He had noticed that a lot of Parish Councils publish their Minutes in draft. Councillor Fursdon explained that in the Transparency Act 2015 it states that all Parish Councils with a precept under £25,000 have to publish their Minutes in draft within two weeks of the meeting. Parish Councils with a precept over £25,000 have to option to publish after they have been agreed.

There were no planning decisions from Shepway to report, but there was a resubmission application for Chislet Close, which will be considered by the Planning Committee before the next meeting.

It was agreed that the Parish Council should attend a KALC training day on ‘preparing for the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)’.

It was agreed to consider updating the Parish Council website, if the budget permits.

The Parish Council meeting closed at 9.30pm and all present enjoyed some mince pies and a glass of wine.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday January 9th 2018 in the Durling Hall at 7.30pm

18A BUS SERVICE

The Bus service 18A is a service that runs between Ashford and Canterbury. It only runs on Schooldays, in the morning it stops at the bus stop near the Dukes Head in the morning at 7.20am and the return journey in the afternoon it stops opposite the Dukes Head at 5.15pm.

However the service is really important to the Village as it is the only link for School Students who attend the Simon Langton Schools in Canterbury. It is also the only service for any resident who works in Canterbury, or anyone whom would like to spend the day in Canterbury. It also affects the Villages of Merham, Smeeth, Brabourne Lees, Lympne, Newingreen and Stanford for the same reasons.

With the Wimpy development of 250 homes soon to start, there may well be a greater demand for the service. In fact when the Parish Council were consulting on the Wimpy development, the idea of a regular service to Canterbury was put forward.

KCC are going to do a consultation on the matter – The KCC Bus Funding Reduction Consultation, will open on Wednesday January 17th 2018 and will close on Wednesday March 28th 2018 – <https://consultations.kent.gov.uk>

There have been some great Christmas events at the Village Hall, Social Club, Church and Primary School. Well done to everyone involved.

Just before Christmas we were pleased to allocate £400 to Sellindge Scouts for a noticeboard. We still have a small amount of funding for projects in our ward so do contact us if you have good local project.

We have received complaints about dog fouling from across our ward. It is sadly the case that there is more dog fouling in the winter months when people think they won't be seen. If there is a regular time and place that fouling occurs then do let the Shepway dog warden know so that these antisocial people can be caught and fined. (Bagged dog waste can be disposed of in any of the public litterbins so there is no excuse not to pick up.)

Shepway District Council is responsible for monitoring air quality and has recently added an extra monitoring station at Kennet Lane in Stanford to the 12 that are already in place across the district. The latest quarterly report shows our air quality to be well within the levels set by DEFRA for compliance and you can see more information at

Shepway District Council has also just published a Charter for Otterpool Park which sets out in more detail its aspirations for the garden town. It takes on board some of the comments made during consultation and can be seen on www.shepway.gov.uk The District Council has already received around £1m in a variety of grants from the Government for the planning costs for Otterpool and now is applying to the Design Quality Fund for help to produce the design guide. A design guide tells house builders what is expected of them and sets standards so that we get good design not standard boxes.

Shepway District Council offers a free business advice service through specialists 'Let's Do Business' to help Shepway residents start up or expand their business locally. One-to-one sessions with trained and experienced business advisors are available on 10 and 24 January, 7 and 21 February, 7 and 21 March and 04 and 18 April at the Civic Centre in Folkestone. WEATHER FACTS FOR NOVEMBER 2017

Minimum temp. –3.50°C. Sat.25th

Mean night temp. 2.3°C

Mean day temp. 10.53°C

The weather in November in the British Isles was dictated by the direction changes of the Gulf-stream which had crossed the Atlantic towards Europe. It was either wet and windy from the south-west or cold air and winds from the north-east. On 15 days rain was recorded with a total of 42.418mm (1.67in), surprisingly only 39.62% of a November average. The average day temperature was 10.53°C and the night average was 2.65°C. A total of 9 frosts were recorded for the month.

Thank you to those of you who took the time to respond to KCC's budget consultation. Most people who took part supported the proposed rise in Council Tax of just under 4% (1.99% for all services plus a special levy of 2% ringfenced for social care). As explained in this consultation, we still need to make savings to cope with increased costs and rising demand for social care as more of our population reaches frail old age. Our Government grant is also decreasing and will be completely withdrawn by 2020.

All discretionary expenditure is under scrutiny including the £7.5m a year we pay to the bus companies for services which do not cover their costs. 97% of the bus services in Kent run without a direct subsidy although they are indirectly supported through payments by KCC of £17m for travel on concessionary bus passes, as well as a £9m subsidy for travel passes for young people and £7m on home to school transport (these are annual figures).

These payments will continue. There will be a specific consultation in early 2018 on the direct £7.5m subsidy for uneconomic bus services with a view to getting the bus companies to pick up more of these services themselves (they have been raising fares above inflation for the last five years) and looking at better ways of providing travel such as community run bus services and car/taxi sharing options.

The routes which receive some subsidy for some of their services in the Shepway area are the 18A and the 17 (eves). Stagecoach staff will be undergoing training on disability/equality from this April which I know will be welcome news to those who have been helping young people with Learning Disabilities to use the bus.

One of the ways KCC has been making savings over the last few years is making more of our services available through our website. School admissions are now handled almost entirely this way and we have over 3,000 web pages covering over 300 KCC services. Each month an average of 216,000 people contact the site and view 880,000 pages. There's been an increase in use of the website by 36% over the last 5 years and more people are using their mobile phones to view the website.

Please use the website for reporting problems you see on the highways. There's an interactive map which makes it easy to pinpoint a problem such as a pothole and you'll be given a reference number which helps if you need to get me involved. Emergencies such as a tree blocking a road should be reported by phone to 03000 41 91 91 or if you think someone is in immediate danger then call the emergency services on 999.

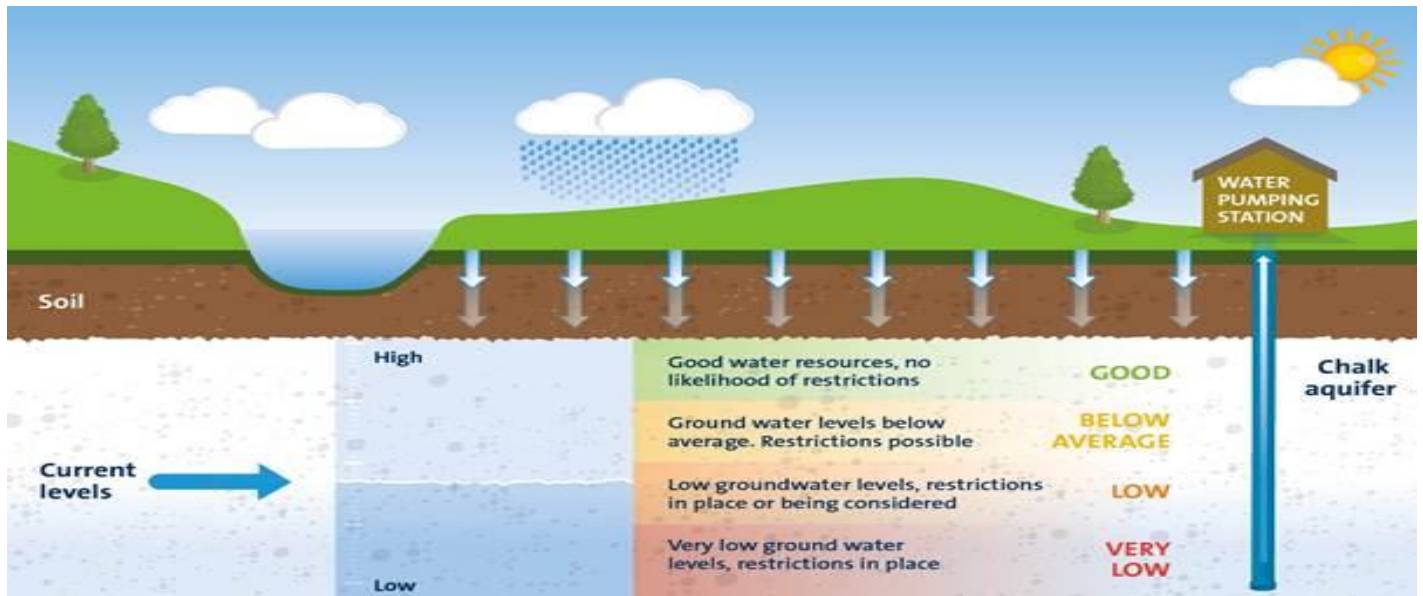

AFFINITY WATER – WATER RESOURCE UPDATE

Following the very dry winter in 2016/17, our groundwater resources remained below average all year and have now receded further due to the very dry start to autumn. This has increased risk of drought and water restrictions in 2018. The summer rainfall was welcomed, but aquifers only usually fill up from rainfall during autumn and winter, when there is less plant growth and evaporation. October to March is critical recharge period when rainfall is expected to reach aquifers (porous rock where groundwater is stored), which is used to supply 60% of Affinity Water customers. Now is the time of year when those water sources need to start being replenished, but the region Affinity Water serves only received a quarter of the long term average rainfall in October and just half of the long term average in November, this is considerably short of what is usually expected. This is having a noticeable impact on river flows in the communities we serve.

Above average rainfall will be needed during this recharge period before groundwater returns to average levels.

Groundwater levels – Here is a diagram showing our current groundwater levels.

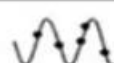
