DISRUPTION TO THE ASHFORD TO FOLKESTONE BUS SERVICE



OPPS !! – There was some chaos caused on Wednesday January 17th at around 11am, at the Stone Hill / A20 junction when the 10A bus from Ashford managed to get well and truly grounded while trying to exit Stone Hill and negotiate the Eleclink road works in the area. The bus was firmly stuck for over an hour, and was finally towed back into Stone Hill by a heavy duty tow truck.

Stagecoach suspended their service for the area with the following statement on their website.

10/10a Unable to serve Stone hill/Plain road due to roadworks 17 Jan to 26 Jan 2018 Roadworks Stone Hill

Due to ongoing roadworks on the A20 routes 10/10a are unable to access Stone hill and Plain road. Buses will continue to serve Brabourne lees via the Ridgeway and Church road only.

We will resume normal route once the works have moved past the junction of Stone hill and the A20.

By the time you read this report, a month of 2018 will have already passed us all by. But we should not be too sad as it means the spring flowers that always make us smile when you see them, will be that much closer to brightening up our lives.

Your Parish Council met at the beginning of January, three Members of Sellindge gave their apologies so we did not have a 'full house'; and there was a small group of people present in the public gallery.

Jenny Hollingsbee was not able to be present, however Susan gave a very good report, most of which I am sure, will be set out somewhere in this edition.

As you may recall in the November issue of the Sellindge Village News, we asked for nominations for a person or group to be put forward for the KALC Community Award 2018. We had a good response and the person or group with most nominations has been put forward for this award. But so as not to spoil the surprise I will need to ask you to wait until May when we can present the award to the person or group.

(If you were at the meeting, please try to keep the secret until then.)

Fortunately, there was not much post so soon after the Festive holiday period, which meant your members were not bogged down with letters etc.

The open session had a fairly lengthy debate regarding the road works, or should I say works that are taking place in the road to be more accurate. We can only wait and see how much longer this will take. I know this does not help if you are affected by it each day, but the workers are just as frustrated at the problems they have encountered. Can I ask that your patience continues a while longer.

As you know there was a question about Sunday working and of those who replied said yes! Let's get it done. If the decision by SDC not to allow Sunday working is reviewed and they get the go ahead, it would mean that on alternate weeks, one end of the village would have the works taking place.

The Core Strategy Review was debated on January 16th by Shepway's Overview and Scrutiny Committee, so it should go to consultation soon. As soon as it is published and live for comments, the Parish Council will get a link on their website, and also put posters with details of how to comment in all five Parish Council notice boards. It will also be posted on all three Sellindge Facebook sites.

The budget had been discussed at the Finance & General Purposes Committee, and the Members of the Committee did agree the figure in principle, although it is up to the full Council to put their mark on it, which it did.

The Sellindge Parish Council's part of the Council Tax is 0.3% of the total being asked by Shepway and they then pay the other authorities – Kent County Council, Police & Kent Fire & Rescue etc.

The County and District Councils are, we understand, increasing their income to around 4 to 5 percent; and although Sellindge is asking for 10%, this is 10% of 0.3%, works out around a pint of beer for full year per band D household. From the money raised your Parish Council will be completing some of their projects, these are:

Further tree works required in both burial grounds, Graffiti under the railway / motorway bridges. Re-vitalising the Speed watch, renewing some of the seats and at least one of the bus shelters

There was even a suggestion of Twinning with a Village/Town in Holland.

Where the hedge has died away outside the burial ground, to replace with a fence.

There was only one planning application your Parish Council considered and this was in Chislet Close.

This was a re – submission of an application that your Parish Council objected too, and was also refused by Shepway Planning. As the re – submitted plans rectify the objection that the Parish Council had made before, therefore your Parish Council did not object to the re – submitted plans.

Your Parish Council would like to send their condolences to the family and friends of Phil Cogan who has passed away. He joined the Parish Council early last year but within a few months stepped down due to ill health; with the promise he would re-join once he had recovered, sadly this is not to be.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday 13th February at 7.30pm in the Durling Hall. From your Parish Council Clerk Linda Hedley

I was able to attend Sellindge Parish Council's meeting on 09 January. Since that meeting and since my last report in the newsletter there have been two important changes in the financial equation for Kent County Council. The first is that the Government has raised the limit on how much council tax can increase for local authorities from 2% to 3% in acknowledgement that inflation continues to be at this level. Those Councils that are responsible for social care are allowed to raise an additional 2% on top of this specifically for extra social care spending. The KCC budget for 2018/19 will be debated and agreed on 20 February and it is likely that the Council will agree to take full advantage of this and increase council tax by 4.99%. This rise will protect front line services and enable us to increase spending on social care for both adults and children by £16m.

The extra money will also enable us to substantially reduce the savings proposed on subsidised bus travel from $\pounds 2.25$ million to $\pounds 0.45$ million. We still believe there are smarter, more responsive ways to deliver these services than we do now and KCC will be holding a series of conversations with Parish Councils and communities on alternatives – mini buses, care and taxi sharing are all possible options. Talks with the bus companies themselves are also finding ways to make the savings we need.

Another piece of good news is that the Government has selected Kent to be a pilot area for retention of business rates. This will benefit not just the County Council by an estimated £6m but the District Council and Kent Fire and Rescue Service as well.

I recently met the officer at KCC responsible for archaeology and heard about the work going on to survey the Otterpool Park Garden Town for potential historic remains. The name Barrow Hill in Sellindge indicates that there are ancient burial plots in the area and trenching has indeed found some Bronze Age barrows including one in someone's garden. The survey is also trying to find the remains of a Tudor Knot Garden as its thought likely there would have been one near Westenhanger Castle. It would be quite something to be able to recreate this garden as part of the new Garden Town. As more is discovered there will be reports and presentations on the finds and the green space and housing will be planned to make the most of them.

December had a very mixed month of weather. There were 19 days with rain and 2 with snow recorded. Fortunately there were only small amounts of snow in Sellindge which did not cause the sort of problems there were over the rest of the country. Total rainfall for the month was 60.16 % above average with 122.047mm (4.805in) recorded making it the wettest December since 2012. There were 9 frosts on nights when fog was not present and just to add to the mix in December 8 days or nights had winds in the mid 30's or mid 40's m.p.h.

FROM YOUR SHEPWAY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

Recent headlines may have been dominated by the decision to change Shepway District Council's name to Folkestone & Hythe District Council, but of far more significance is the publication of a draft of the Core Strategy Review which sets out where houses and jobs will be located over the next 19 years in our District whatever it is called. This draft, 178 pages long and with links to many more pages of supporting evidence, went to Shepway's Overview and Scrutiny Committee on 16 January (you can see it on the District Council website, item 6 for this meeting).

The main changes from the previous Core Strategy adopted in 2013 are the plans for Otterpool Park Garden Town which is expected to provide nearly half (5,500) of the new homes needed by 2037 and 350 more houses in Sellindge itself. In total the Review plans for 12,200 homes across the district.

The 350 proposed new homes in Sellindge would be in addition to the 250 new homes that already have planning permission but have yet to be built. This is a significant extra number of houses and whilst they would come with community benefits such as a bigger primary school we both want to examine the supporting case as it may be possible for the new Garden Town to deliver sufficient new homes in the timescale needed without the need to expand Sellindge. We will be meeting with the District Council's officers to discuss this.

The Core Strategy Review is expected to be issued for a six week public consultation later this year (we don't yet know when). The responses to the consultation are reviewed and changes made as appropriate. The finalised plans would then be submitted to the Government which appoints an independent Planning Inspector to examine the plan in public. The examination in public will also provide further opportunity for the public to have their say. The Planning Inspector is able to change the plan and any significant modifications would then also need a period of consultation before the Inspector issues a final report. If the Inspector finds the plan 'sound' the Council can adopt it. It's a lengthy and very thorough process and is expected to take until 2019 to complete. We will be making sure we keep you and the Parish Council informed throughout this process.

A final word about the District's new name. The change takes effect from April but items such as stationery, uniforms, vehicles etc will only be rebranded when they need replacement (you may have noticed we still have some street names with 'Elham Rural District' on them which predate the 1974 change to Shepway). We both supported the change as very few people outside the District know where Shepway is located and we are often confused with the Shepway estate in Maidstone or the Isle of Sheppey. The change brings us into line with the name of our Parliamentary Constituency and should therefore help when we are dealing with Government bodies.
