Hello, due to illness last month Nigel kindly put a few words together for the February Newsletter and I would just like to say thank you to him.

The February meeting took a little longer than normal due to the items to be discussed; here is a short update on each. Pot holes continue to be reported to KCC by the Village Caretaker and myself when requested. If you report anything to KCC, do let your Parish Council know then we can monitor and ensure it gets repaired.

During the open session a member of the public asked for the draft minutes to be placed on the website. It was noted that as the current method – waiting for them to be agreed – was a Council decision; this will have to be discussed at a future meeting.

A short discussion about the idea of having a large East Kent District Council, comprising of Thanet, Dover, Canterbury and Shepway took place. There was no voting on this although the public present and Parish Councillors had some reservations. There is to be a formal consultation about this later so do watch the papers and other media information and respond. Hopefully there will be more details.

Susan Carey kindly gave Jenny Hollingsbee's report as well as her own, but these can be read elsewhere in the News. Your Parish Council considered an application for some tree works on Trees that have a TPO. Given that some of the trees appear to be diseased, your Parish Council agreed they should be removed, but any healthy ones should be left. The Quinn Estates application was debated as they have considered your Parish Councillors concerns and replied. During the debate it was agreed that your Parish Council should respond further and this is being done.

Your Parish Council have removed the old metal and Perspex bus shelter at Barrow Hill and given that the use of the shelter was not very nice (people using it as a toilet) it was felt that a seat and planter should be placed there. Your Parish Council has already been contacted by a resident who is willing to plant and weed it.

Under the heading Correspondence your Parish Council considered three consultation documents; they were for Freight in Kent, Open spaces and Drug & Alcohol Strategy.

Lamp posts are being removed through the village on the Main Road, this is due to their poor condition. At this time they are not being replaced. It has been reported to your Parish Council, by KCC that they will be replaced and this is expected sometime in the new financial year.

The penultimate item was the **SPRING CLEAN** in Sellindge, this is taking place on Sunday the 12th March, meet at the Village Hall at 10am and return by 12 Noon for a cup of tea and biscuit. We need as many people as possible (last year only 2 Councillors and the Clerk turned up) to ensure that as much litter is collected before the hedgerows starts to grow. Please phone and leave your name if you can come along. Bags, gloves and litter pickers will be provided. The ultimate item was a report from Cllr Chris Mason, he has attended an Emergency Planning Day at Canterbury and Cllr Janet Tritton has also looked at the document. The Emergency Plan is for anything that may need a response by a large group of teams; i.e. flooding, accident on the motorway. All parishes are being encouraged to have a plan and so if you think you could help in any way for example you have a 4X4 and could collect people do come forward. Either contact the Parish Council Office or Janet or Chris with your contact details.

The next meeting of Your Parish Council is on 14th March in the Durling Hall at 7.30pm.

Dog Poo Bags – The Parish Council is still providing these for use free of charge, members consider that this has made a difference to the village. Simply come to the Parish Council office Tues 9am – Noon & Fri 3pm – 5.30pm

The Chairman and other Councillors would like to say 'thank you' to all those who are taking the time and trouble to pick up after their dog/s.

DISSENTING VOICES

Having read in the Parish news letter over several months, the one sided discussion on the New town proposal at Otterpool and how marvellous it will be for us, the condescending tones of our District Councillors and others are almost at the level of a Headmistress at a primary school telling the children it is for their own good, so it must be the right thing to do? I also remember that the village has had an 'all inclusive' survey on the needs of the village regarding housing and what we wanted. However, the point I am trying to make is, why bother with such surveys when another idea comes along and the original plan is totally disregarded by the elected council members. Ok it is outside the village, but will detrimentally affect us all in the locality. We have recently seen what happens when the proletariat has had enough, Brexit and Trump are but two examples of dissent towards the establishment. It is high time the role of councils and their minions were returned to the position of servants of the people rather than their masters, as it seems to be at present. I feel the only way forward from here is for the electorate to vote with their feet, and at election time to forget political allegiances of old, and vote for the candidates who are actually listening to us rather than the establishment stooges we have at the moment!

The New Year started with mist and rain all day. Many nights were clear with frosts, 13 in all. On Thursday 12th after rain in the morning it turned to snow, some 1inch by early evening. The latter part of the month only had very light winds (if at all) with clear sky evenings and early mornings. January total rainfall was 77.343mm (3.045in) from the13days on which rain was recorded only 61% of a January average.

In response to request by a resident, Veolia has been asked to replace bins, once emptied, to where they took them from. If this continues to be a problem please let us know. On another issue, Veolia has repeatedly cleaned-up the lay-by near Otterpool but it littered again very quickly. Shepway will continue to clean this area when it is reported and will seek to prosecute anyone caught littering as the costs of this clean up fall on us as all as taxpayers. The project to replace the ageing swimming pool in Hythe with a new leisure centre that has a swimming pool and gym facilities took a big step forward when the Shepway cabinet agreed on 07 February to put forward a planning application for the new leisure centre, parkland and houses at Princes Parade in Hythe. The houses (which will include 30% social housing) will help fund the new building with the rest of the funding coming from developer contributions and the eventual sale of the present Hythe pool site (it is planned the present pool will stay open until the new one opens). The plans include significant widening of the pedestrian parade, extra parking for the leisure centre and the new housing and the same amount of on-street parking as present. We believe this is a good use of the site which was previously used for landfill and will provide excellent new facilities for Shepway residents. Jenny was involved in a 'Safety in action' Day for Year 6 children from 22 local Primary Schools which covered road, fire, sea, rail, health and personal safety and it is hoped to extend this to all Shepway Primary Schools next year. As reported last month, the Kent & Medway Armed Forces Covenant Conference will be held at the Leas Cliff Hall on 14 March. If any organisation associated with the Armed Forces has not received an invitation to attend please let Jenny know.

Jenny attended the District Councils Network Annual Conference on 02/03 February and heard Gavin Barwell MP, the Housing Minister and Sajid Javid MP the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government emphasise the role of District Councils in providing housing of all types for future generations. Shepway is certainly doing that and the next round of consultation meetings for the Garden Town proposed at Otterpool Park are now expected to be held in April (the Shepway website will have venues and dates nearer the time).

Jenny is the Shepway representative on the local Health and Wellbeing Board and reports that at their last meeting there was a presentation on Otterpool Park to ensure all Health Services are fully aware of the proposal and involved in the master planning process.

Susan attended Sellindge Parish Council meeting on 14 February where she covered most of the issues in this report and answered questions from the Councillors and members of the public.

Finally you may have heard there is a proposal to abolish Shepway, Canterbury, Dover and Thanet Councils and establish a new East Kent Council to save money. The Councils will be debating this on 22 March and, if the Councillors think the idea should be taken further, there will then be public engagement about the idea. Jenny is still uncertain about the merits of the proposal and Susan thinks the benefits are too small and the risks too great. We will let you know more in our next report.

Among the issues raised with me at Sellindge Parish Council on 14 February was the removal of several streetlights in Sellindge which are considered to be structurally unsound. It is vital that these lights are replaced promptly and I shall be making sure that Kent Highways give this work a high priority.

At the previous Parish Council meeting I was asked if the stumps of streetlights near the Barrow Hill entrance to the village could be removed. I have looked into this and established that they are post bases needed to power the lit signs because the main UKPN service ends at this point on both side of the road. They could be replaced with feeder pillars but as they would be about the same size as the posts there is no real gain in doing so.

March will see KCC launch two campaigns and another consultation. The first campaign is *Keep Kent Clean*. This is the time of year when all the litter by our roadside is at its most visible and it is depressing to see it all. The District Councils have the responsibility for street cleaning most roads and Highways England are responsible for the motorways. There are also many individuals and community groups who give their time to help put things right (including Sellindge Parish Council). The Great British Spring Clean organised by Keep Britain Tidy starts the first weekend of March and KCC plans to support those taking part with equipment and to put extra resources into sign cleaning and repainting the white lines. The campaign will continue with advertising (mostly on social media) to encourage people to behave with more respect for their environment.

The other campaign will be about the apprenticeship levy which starts in April. KCC will itself be doubling the number of apprentices it employs and providing information to Kent businesses about how to employ an apprentice under the new scheme and to young people on how to become an apprentice. (Under the new scheme apprentices can be any age but it's those who feel 'stuck' at school post 16 who will probably benefit most). The campaign launches in Faversham on 07 March. There will be information available on line – look for 'Made in Kent'.

The consultation is about combining two of the services that KCC provides for people with mental health problems to improve the way they are delivered and do so more efficiently. The consultation runs until Friday, 24 March 2017. You can find out more at www.kent.gov.uk/mentalhealthconsultation and it is open to everyone.

I am pleased to report that KCC's work to support defence personnel and their families has been recognised with a bronze award from the Armed Forces Covenant Employers Recognition Scheme. Many Councils now have a formal covenant with the Armed Forces but it's particularly important for Kent where the British Army has a major presence. My term of office as County Member for Elham Valley is nearly at an end so next month instead of a report in this newsletter I'll be delivering a leaflet to you. It's up to you if I return after the election on 04 May. It is a privilege to represent such a beautiful part of Kent and its people.

Dear Friends,

It feels as though spring may be tapping me on the shoulder and the weather girls, on television, tell us that temperatures are improving. Well that is good news especially as we have not had a hard winter and already thoughts are turning to spring. The taste of the Christmas pudding and mince pies is still with me as we check that we have all we need to produce pancakes on Shrove Tuesday. Note to self, we said that we would have pancakes at next meeting of the youth group – must check supplies!

How quick time flies as we jump from one festival to the next. Shrove Tuesday – the day before Ash Wednesday which is the start of Lent, the forty days leading up to Easter. Each year people ask 'What are you giving up for Lent this year?' Chocolate, or sweets or cheese or....something else? It amuses me each year to point out that Lent starts on Ash Wednesday, First of March this year, and last for forty days until Easter. But try looking at your calendar and adding the days between Ash Wednesday and Easter, you'll find, there are more than forty days! Take out the number of Sundays and you will be back to forty. The result is that Sundays are not included in the Forty day calculation. On a serious note though, let me encourage you to use this Lent period to your advantage. It is traditionally a time of self-reflection and examination; a time to consider our own shortcomings and frailties, a time of preparation for the coming of Easter. A few weeks ago we were all joyfully celebrating the birth of the Christ child, now we remember how people turned against him and he finished up being nailed to a cross on the day we call Good Friday. How fickle the people were and how they followed the louder protestors when they felt threatened, I am not sure if anything has changed in 2000 years.

Anyway, back to this Lent and the question 'what will you give up?' How about giving up ten minutes a day to find a quiet place and to be alone with your thoughts and questions and maybe even take the opportunity to offer your worries and problems in a prayer to God. You know, they say that a problem shared is a problem halved and you never know what answers you may discover, you may be surprised.
