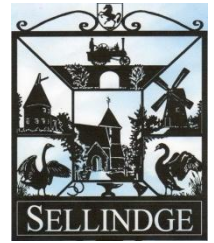

Your Council meeting in March considered a planning application for Brook Farm. Councillors looked at the plans and considered that there were no planning contraventions and supported the application.

The Village Spring Clean was a very successful event; with 29 people turning up and collecting over 60 bags of rubbish, some of which contained human waste. Your Council would like to say a big thank you to those who attended and hoped that the doughnuts, tea and coffee went down well afterwards.

The Clerk has reported the human waste to Shepway District Council but at this time there has been no reply.

Our next Village Clean-up will be in the Autumn after the hedge rows have died back and the rubbish will be easier to see and hopefully before it gets too cold.

Councillors were advised of the list of items for further reading and any comment and were invited to attend the Parish Council Office, before the next Council meeting in April.

It has been highlighted by several residents in Sellindge that they are having problems using the pavements around the village. Parents with small children have to walk in the road around these vehicles.

Your Council would like to remind people that parking in a manner that blocks the pavement is an obstruction and you could be fined. It is much easier to replace a car than a person.

Speaking about vehicles, it has also been reported to Your Council that there are cars that appear to be abandoned.

These should be reported to the Police not the Parish Council.

In May the Parish Council will be holding the Annual Assembly, where as usual the Parish Council will publish a booklet, with the village groups and organisations yearly reports in.

FROM YOUR SHEPWAY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

A large number of local residents throughout the Ward, turned out to support the “Great British Spring Clean” and many thanks go to all involved. I was unable to make the “litter pick” but with the support of Giles Barnard from SDC, I have cleaned a number of directional signs (Broad Street/Swan Lane, Moorstock/Swan Lane, Stanford North, Stanford Church and Kennet Lane. I have been asked by residents to clarify who is responsible for litter picking and the situation with regard to the Veolia Contract, particularly around J11, the B2068 and the A20 from Newingreen to Otterpool Lane. As I understand it, Shepway is responsible for the verges and have contracted Veolia to carry out this work on our behalf. However, there is a limit to how far Veolia go back into the verge and also the issue of closing roads for Health & Safety reasons. Our Community Engagement team also help as and when requested but, of course, their resources are limited. Our Officers are looking at whether road closure is always necessary and they will be carrying out more regular inspections in and around J11 to try and deal with the situation quicker. Highways England are responsible for the slip roads at J11 and the M20 and they have promised to send an inspector out to see the problems. Illegal lorry parking continues to be a major issue (which is where the majority of the litter/rubbish stems from) and although FPN’s are issued, over 3,700 since November 2015, there are still problems at the Stanford Interchange and the A20 Sellindge to J11. We desperately need to find a solution to this problem and it is never off my radar! KCC report that clamping in one area, just drives them to the next and also there are issues with insurance relating to perishable loads.

On Otterpool Park, a leaflet is being delivered to every house in Shepway, entitled “Your questions answered” and I hope that this will encourage local people to get involved and influence the master plan. The Government Housing White Paper – Fixing our broken housing market states “Since the 1970’s, there have been on average 160,000 new homes each year in England. The consensus is that we need from 225,000 to 275,000 or more homes per year to keep up with population growth and start to tackle years of under-supply. This isn’t because there is no space or because the country is “full”. Only around 11% of land in England has been built on.”

Air Quality is often a subject raised with me.

Shepway monitor Air Quality on a monthly basis at 13 different sites (one has recently been added in Kennet Lane Stanford) and all have shown 100% compliance as part of an annual assessment reported to DEFRA .

The compliance relates to the fact that we meet all air quality objectives set by DEFRA.

We measure the concentration levels of contaminants in the air compared to acceptable levels set by DEFRA.

At the Armed Forces Covenant Conference held at The Leas Cliff Hall, all three services invited applications from young people to apply for apprenticeships – if you know anyone who is interested please let me know.

Finally, further details on the proposed East Kent Merger will follow next month as at the time of writing, the full Council Meeting to debate this issue has not taken place.

I attended the Parish Council and the Playing Fields Committee Meetings last month.

The February weather was very varied with temperatures up and down, 13 days with rain and one night with snow recorded. On an odd few days there was strong wind and the edge of gale ‘Doris’ blew in from the Gulf Stream bringing heavy rain and strong winds for the rest of the country. Sunshine hours were low, but even so a temperature of 17°C was recorded on Monday 20th. Total rainfall was only 41.452m (1.632in) being 58.49% of a February average The snow which fell Friday 10th quickly went during the following day.

DEVASTATION: Ramraiders blasted their way into Sellindge post office

I was going through some old papers the other day and came across this article.

I remember it well, it was a bit of a surprise when I was walking the kids to school, as it was all ok the day before.

At around 2.30am on a Friday morning a gang of 'ramraiders' who had stolen a large digger from Otterpool Quarry and a tipper truck, tried to ramraid the Sellindge Stores. In those days, the area where they went in was where the Post Office used to be, it's believed the idea was to pick up the safe with the digger, put it in the tipper truck and make their get away, when the burglar alarm went off they fled, leaving a terrified tenant who had been peacefully sleeping in the bedroom above the Post Office.
