

#### SHEPWAY DISTRICT COUNCIL DEVELOPMENT CONTROL MEETING - MAY 25th 2017

The Development Control Committee (also known as the Planning Committee), met on Tuesday May 25<sup>th</sup>, the only item on the Agenda was Y16/0068/SH the retrospective planning application for the use of Otterpool Quarry as a 24 hour lorry park. The Planning Officers had recommended that the application be refused permission, also that enforcement action be taken to ensure the Lorry Park is closed and KCC Highways had grave concerns about safety.



There were spokespersons from the Parish Council and the residents of Sellindge, who both spoke against the application there were also applicant speaking for the application.

The meeting was well attended, and the debate continued for around one hour, after which it went to a vote, with the result being nine Councillors voted for refusal of the application and one for permission.

Therefore the application was refused permission and the Otterpool Lorry Park will be closing.

Your Council met for their April meeting. The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed and these will be on the website ( www.Sellindge-pc.gov.uk ).

During the highways updates, it was reported that the County Council are to spend an extra £4 million, for repair of pots holes in the county. So as Susan Carey always says when she is doing her reports, do report potholes etc. to KCC. But do remember that if you let your Parish Council know we can monitor the works.

A member of the public asked if your PC could arrange for a notice board to allow public notices to be advertised. As a reminder, the centre of the notice board at the bottom of Swan Lane is for this very thing and is accessible without a key. Your Parish Council will look at this at a later date to see if any other ways to have public notices.

While writing about notices, as your Clerk (and Proper Officer – a title given by law) I reported the damage that has been done to the Parish Council owned bus shelter at the bottom of Swan Lane. Your Parish Council has purchased some cleaner in the hope that this will remove the dried glue without doing any damage, otherwise the costs of replacing the Perspex will be required.

By fly posting notices around the village it makes the village look un-cared for and has caused damage to various items in the village.

Elsewhere there is a letter from a local resident regarding this issue.

Your Council considered two applications and supported one of the unanimously and one with further comments. Some of you may have remember the hedge that died outside the Old burial ground. The replacement hedge that was planted has not thrived and looks like it will not grow; it was agreed that a fence should be placed there. In addition there appears to be further die-back and so your Parish Council will be monitoring this.

And last but by no means least, Phil Coggan your newest Councillor has had to resign due to health issues. Councillors wish him well and hope he makes a full and quick recovery has he stated in his letter of resignation he would love to come back once his health issues have been resolved.

The next meeting of the Your Council is on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> May and will be the Annual Meeting of Your Council. On Tuesday May 16<sup>th</sup> the Annual Parish Assembly will be held in the Durling Hall from 7am. From your Parish Council Clerk – Linda Hedley

#### OTTERPOOL PARK

The Otterpool Park community engagement events scheduled for 18-20 May have had to be postponed as Shepway District Council will be in a period of restricted publicity in advance of the General Election to be held on June 8<sup>th</sup>. Shepway District Council is subject to pre-election restrictions set out in Section 2 of the Local Government Act 1986, as amended in 1988.

This is the same reason why we were unable to hold events in the run-up to the May 4<sup>th</sup> County Council Elections – They were obviously unaware that a General Election would be called when they announced the dates.

They will reschedule the events to happen as soon as possible after the election is held but that will be subject to venue availability. They will send further details of the schedule of events once these have been finalised.

#### WEATHER FACTS FOR MARCH 2017

Minimum temp. – 0.50°C Tues.7th. Mean night temp. 5.22°C Maximum temp. 20.75°C Tues.30th.. Mean day temp. 13.58°C

March had a very mixed month of weather. Rain was recorded on 7 of the first 8 days but all very small amounts and there were three further wet days before the end of the month. The total rainfall was only19.558mm (0.77in.), 48.64% of the March average. Winds of up to 39mph were recorded on several days or nights of the month. Temperatures both day and night were above average. On Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> a reading of 20.75°C was recorded, which is just under the highest March reading in my records - 21°C recorded in 2012.

#### FROM YOUR SHEPWAY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

This week I met with the Chief Constable, Alan Pughsley, who explained the new Policing Model which will be implemented from September. He was pleased to report that he is able to put more Police Officers' on the front line and will also be able to retain 300 PCSO's. 210 will be dedicated to community policing and 90 dedicated to proactive work in communities to reduce harm to potentially vulnerable people. He would like to set-up a pilot scheme for Volunteer PCSO's who would increase this number and invites applications from local residents who are keen to support their area. (If you are interested, please let me know and I will pass details on). The 'on-going' issue of lorries parking illegally was discussed. The Police are moving lorries on, mostly from the slip roads but they will also move them on from residential areas. I recently went out with the Enforcement Officers and 8 Fixed Penalty Notices were issued in an hour around J11 and the A20.

By the time you read this, we will know the result of the retrospective planning application for change of use of Otterpool Quarry to a 24-hour lorry park. The Shepway Planning Officers have recommended that this be refused by the councillors at their meeting on 25 April. They also recommend that councillors agree that enforcement action be taken to stop the present activity.

I reported last month that a leaflet entitled "Your questions answered" on Otterpool Park would be delivered to all residents in Shepway. Delivery had to stop on 24 March because of the KCC election campaign during which both the District and County Councils have to follow strict rules about publications. However, the booklet and the Stage 1 Arcadis Stage 1 Feasibility Report can be viewed on line at <a href="https://www.shepway.gov.uk/Otterpool">www.shepway.gov.uk/Otterpool</a> or you can get one from

the Parish Council Office. Further Community Engagement Sessions were planned for the end of May but with the announcement of the General Election and the 'purdah' rules these have had to be postponed until after 8 June. Other Work Shops are also planned with the Business Community and local Schools.

I attended the Annual Meeting of the Sellindge & District Playing Fields last month and it was great to see the final pieces of equipment being erected in the Children's Play Area. I am very grateful to the Methodist Church for their donation of £2,500 which purchased two 'Springers' and made a contribution to the 'Blissford Plus (Climbing frame and slide)'. Special thanks go to Alan Hewitt and Terry Preston for recommending that this donation be made from the sale of the Methodist Chapel. This project, which was started several years ago is now complete - many thanks go to George Oakley and all those who have helped with fundraising - the Boot Fairs, the Firework Nights and other events.

Now the next project begins .....

I attended the monthly meeting of the Parish Council. I attended the recent meeting of the Age UK Hythe & Lyminge Trustees and they are keen to expand their Home Delivery Meal Service (£6.90 per meal 7 days per week) and their "in-house" meals (£5.25 per meal 5 days per week). Meals can be for one day, or any number of days. A range of other services are provided, see <a href="www.age.uk.org/hytheandlyminge">www.age.uk.org/hytheandlyminge</a> 01303 269602. Volunteers are also needed so if you have a few hours to spare to help others, the Lyminge & Hythe Centres would love to hear from you.





As I am sure you will know, Shepway Councillors voted against moving forward with the proposal to create a new council for East Kent. This means that none of the councils involved can proceed with the idea but does not rule out working together as separate councils where it might save money or give a better service through economies of scale.


