

FROM YOUR SHEPWAY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

We are pleased to report that the councillors on the Planning and Licensing Committee accepted the planning officers' recommendation to refuse planning permission for the Lorry Park at Otterpool Quarry opposite the Airport Café. The grounds for refusal were objections raised by Kent Highways. It was agreed that an enforcement notice be served requiring the unlawful use of the land as a lorry park to cease and the unlawful buildings and structures associated with the use to be removed. The stop notice was served on May 11th 2017 with 14 days to conform. Initially, this may cause issues with increased lorries looking for somewhere to park but Enforcement Officers will keep a regular check on this situation and over time, lorries will know to use the M20 and not the A20/B2068 as a through route. (A further retrospective application for a change of use of the Airport Café to include a lorry park, two portacabins for toilet facilities and an extension of the existing parking area is due to be heard on May 30th.)

With regard to the proposed Highways England Lorry Holding Area, Shepway District Council has just been notified that because of the General Election, the hearing for the Judicial Review will be delayed - at least until October, unfortunately causing more uncertainty for local people.

The County Council Election and now the General Election has meant that the dates for the latest round of Otterpool Park Community Engagement sessions had to be postponed. The new dates are:

WEATHER FACTS FOR APRIL 2017

Minimum temp. -3.0°Thur.30th. Mean night temp.3.61 °C Maximum temp. 21.0°Sun.9th.. Mean day temp. 12.24°C

April dawned with cloud cover but sunshine in the afternoon and was promptly followed by a foggy night. The following day was cloudy with breaks and a little sunshine once again followed by fog during the night. The first rain was recorded on the night 3^{rd} - 4^{th} but only 0.508mm (0.02in). There were only 5 days on which rain was recorded during the month the total being 6.223mm (0.245in) 17% of the April average. Temperatures were near normal for the month in-spite of the very low sunshine hours. There were only two frosts recorded, the lowest being -3.0° on Thursday 20^{th} which caused considerable damage locally.

Nearly 5,000 people voted in our Elham Valley division (which includes Sellindge) and I received 54% of the vote (up from 44% from the previous County Council elections in 2013). My vote was 2706 with a majority of 2067. The rest of the votes were spread fairly evenly among the rest of the candidates. Turnout was slightly up at 36% (compared to 35% last time) and this was higher than the average turnout of 32% across Kent. I thank everyone who voted for me and those who helped with my campaign. I promise to do my best for everyone in the division.

For Kent as a whole the Conservatives had 50% of the vote and won 67 of the 81 seats. Labour won 20% of the votes but only 5 seats and lost all their sitting councillors. The Liberal Democrats won 14% of the vote and kept the same number of councillors (7) and now become the official opposition. UKIP lost all the 16 seats they won four years ago. The boundary review makes direct comparisons difficult but in the Shepway area the Conservatives won 43% of the votes (up 10% from the 2013 election) and five seats and the Greens won 15% of the vote and one seat. All the results are available on the KCC website.

At the start of a four year term all the newly elected councillors must undergo security checks and submit a variety of forms required by law. We are also given briefings on our responsibilities especially those concerning our role as corporate parents to the children in care. We are allocated committees or special responsibilities and I am pleased to be appointed KCC's Cabinet Member for Customers, Communications and Performance which includes responsibility for (among other things) our website, internal and external communications, performance monitoring, risk management and audit.

There have been two important Government announcements since I last made a report to you. The site for the Lower Thames Crossing was announced - a decision that the County Council has been pressing to be made for the last 15 years. The Lower Thames Crossing will be a tunnel (less subject to weather disruption than a bridge) linking the A2 east of Gravesend in Kent and Tilbury on the Essex side of the Thames. Nearly 47,000 people responded to the public consultation on the Lower Thames crossing and this was the route supported by the majority.

The benefits to our area are significant. At present, most of the traffic to and from the Channel ports goes on the M20 because it is the quickest route. The Lower Thames crossing will offer a faster route for traffic between Dover and the Midlands which is where most of the HGV traffic is bound. This will relieve pressure on our roads by dividing the traffic between the two routes. Such a project will take many years to deliver but it is at last on the way.

The other piece of good news was the extra £2bn allocated by the Government for adult social services over the next three years. Kent's share of this is £26m this year (£52m in total over three years) which is a significant increase to our £364m annual social care budget. We will be debating how best to use the extra funds at our first full council meeting on 25 May which will be webcast if you want to watch.
