The weather in June once again proved to have under average rainfall for Kent. Rain was recorded on only 7 days of the month and then only small amounts. The total rainfall was 43.815mm (1.725in) which is only 76.05% of average June rainfall. Many days during the month were bright and well over average hours of sunshine were recorded. The hottest day of the year so far was on Wed. 21st with a high of 32.25°C (92.05°F).

FROM YOUR SHEPWAY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

There are no high rise council homes in the Shepway District but following the Grenfell Tower fire, Shepway has been working with the Kent Fire and Rescue Service to identify all residential buildings of six storeys (including the ground floor) or above in the Shepway District. Twelve buildings have been identified in Folkestone and one in Hythe and if anyone knows of others in our district, do please let us know. Some two years ago we distributed a booklet entitled *What to Do in an Emergency*; written by specialists from the emergency services it covered a wide range of emergencies including fire. We hope you still have your copy and completed the section on making a safety plan for your own household. Contact us if you want a copy.

Jenny attended the LGA (Local Government Association) conference where the need for more housing was the main topic and she also went to an academic briefing at Essex University on garden towns and their benefits.

The latest round of community engagement meetings for the new Otterpool Park Garden Town was held at the end of June. Jenny went to most of these and we both attended a workshop with local businesses. There is now an outline plan which can be changed in response to comments. In Roman times the area was thickly forested, in Medieval times it was a deer park, later on it was cleared for farming and the race course but pockets of ancient woodland survive and the Otterpool Park plans aim to extend the wooded areas and protect the ancient woodland. The plans will also restore the original westward entrance to Westenhanger Castle so it will be seen rather than hidden away.

Locate In Kent held their summer networking event at Westenhanger castle on 12 July and Gary Young of the architects Farrells gave a presentation concentrating on the business and employment plans for Otterpool Park based on the work done at the much praised development at Poundbury. By the time this newsletter appears we will have visited Poundbury ourselves and will report

on this in the next newsletter. The Otterpool Park website has been updated with information available from these events is available at <u>www.otterpoolpark.org</u> Another event we both attended was, Shepway Sports Trust Awards evening held in Folkestone on 14 July and among the winners was Sellindge resident, Dave Motley won award for his work on the Active 50 Programme. $\rightarrow \rightarrow \rightarrow$ Since its launch in 2014 the trust has done an enormous amount of work to engage more people in physical activity. Shepway District Council was able to offer free use of the Leas Cliff Hall in Folkestone for the awards and this vast venue was full, the energy and excitement of those attending was remarkable. Jenny also attended the School Summer Fair, Parish Council, School Governor and Sports & Social Club Meetings.

Finally, the latest news on Highways England's proposal for a lorry holding area near Stanford is that the Judicial Review originally scheduled for 27 June will not now be heard until 6 December. At the July meeting Club members Vera & Tony Orsbourne presented a really interesting illustrated talk entitled 'Sellindge Past and Present' (which was put together using postcards and slides loaned to them by Mike & Deirdre Barnes Beginning with an 18th Century map of the Village, then on to the Church - building originally began in 1066, then added to many times.

In Moorstock Lane there was Rose nursery named Roserie which bred Roses, among many others they bred a Rose called 'Dainty Bess' which won numerous awards. It is not readily available in this country but Vera does have one in her garden. We saw views of so many places and events in the village (sadly too many to mention here) but to name a few, Talbot House in the 1400s, the original Primary School built in 1900, and bringing us more up to date a Steam Rally in 1970. the M20 Motorway built in 1979-80, Converter Station in 1984, the Channel Tunnel Rail Link action group SABRE, the new Surgery which opened on 24th April 2004, and ending with the Tour de France in 2007. Following the Grenfell Tower fire, KCC has been carrying out extra fire safety checks on the approximately 1,000 buildings for which it is responsible. So far none have been identified as having cladding of the type used at Grenfell tower but work is continuing on all cladding and insulation and to check that the Fire Risk Assessments for all the buildings are up to date. If you'd like to know more you can see the Property Management and Health and Safety officers present an update to KCC's Scrutiny Committee on 07 June on the recorded webcast or read the minutes of this meeting on the KCC website.

Ever since responsibility for Public Health returned to local government in 2013 we County Councillors have learned more than we ever expected when we entered politics about obesity, smoking, depression and more of this ilk. We have also learned that the answer to just about all of these woes is greater physical activity – even a little will help and that, however late you start, exercise will bring you health benefits. This is why the work of the Shepway Sports Trust (see the District Councillors report) is so important in helping people across our district find a sport they can enjoy.

The Trust would like to do more to reach people in rural areas and to help get children and clubs to competitions and is now fundraising for a fleet of four minibuses. I have started their appeal with a \pounds 1,000 grant from my KCC Member Fund and they hope to raise the \pounds 23,000 they need for the first vehicle by September.

Part of my new responsibilities at KCC includes the stand at the annual Kent County Show held at Detling. This year our theme was apprenticeships which have changed radically from April this year being open to anyone over 16 and not just for entry level jobs. Our stand hosted partners from the NHS, builders, Gillingham Football, EDF energy (Dungeness power station), forestry and the hospitality industry and both people looking to be apprentices and businesses wanting to take on apprentices visited our stand. If you know anyone or a business that would benefit from an apprenticeship, do please look at the *Made in Kent* campaign on the KCC website www.kent.gov.uk for more info.

Matthew Scott, our Police and Crime Commissioner for Kent is once again holding a public consultation on the priorities for Kent Police. It's available online at www.kent-pcc.gov.uk/listening-to-you/public-consultations or phone 01622 677 055 for a paper copy. It's the best opportunity we have to influence what Kent Police do and in my personal response I shall be asking for more to be done to stop speeding and other dangerous driving.

My reports to you in this newsletter only skim the surface of the work of KCC and its councillors. I have recently had a work experience student shadow me for a week and she has been surprised to find just how much is involved both in time and the breadth of what's covered.
