
FLYING THE RED ENSIGN

THE ELECLINK ROUTE THROUGH THE VILLAGE



The Eleclink route does come straight down the Main Road (A20) before heading off across the fields near the M20 bridge. It is undoubtable that there will be some degree of disruption while this happens, but the company have confirmed that in the event of the M20 being closed, they can finish what they were currently doing



and restore the road to full usage condition while the incident is on going. The contractor doing the work is Balfour Beatty, who have done major work in the village before, they were the contractor that built the High Speed Link through the village.

It was Balfour Beatty who donated to the Village Hall the large piece of Kentish Ragstone rock that is at the entrance to the Village Hall car park The route of the cable leaves the Sellindge Convertor Station as a ac current comes under the motorway bridge then up across the field to the A20 then down the A20, near the motorway bridge it turns East and across the fields towards Kennent Lane, it then goes down this Lane,

which will have to be closed while this work takes place, then across Stone Street, and across towards junction 11 of the M20, at Shrine Barn the cable follows the A20 again, after the woods it cuts out across the fields but stays near the A20, due to a water course that runs alongside the road to Etchinghill the cable will be moled at this point so there should not be any road closure, it carries on across the fields (which are MOD ground) to Newington where it goes across the King George V playing field, where it is moled under the road due to the river pent running alongside the road and makes its way into the Channel Tunnel complex where is goes through the tunnel to France.

SPEED OF VEHICLES THROUGH THE VILLAGE - SPEEDWATCH ?

There was a very interesting debate on the Sellindge Village Facebook page this week, concerning the speed of some vehicles coming through the Village on the A20.

As many people in the debate said, we have been trying for years, the Parish Council, Sellindge Primary School Governors, and residents in general have all tried. We did have an element of success with the Wimpy development, where one of the 106 conditions was reduction of speed to 30mph between Moorstock Lane and the Motorway bridge, with traffic calming measures, this was all agreed. We are just waiting for the development to happen.

The speed limit used to be 30mph until the M20 was built, then it was increased to 40mph due to the A20 being the alternative route, if the M20 is closed.

I have been on the Parish Council since 1998 and have seen many attempts to KCC Highways get the speed reduced, but it is not only KCC Highways, the Police have their say as well. I can remember one of the comments from the

Police in the early 00's was that they would like the speed limit increased the 50mph. Thankfully it did not happen.

Another item that came up in the debate was Speedwatch. This was quite successful at the start, but now we are down to too few volunteers to make it work. We still have the equipment, which was quite expensive and brought as a joint project with Lympne Parish Council.

So let's get Speedwatch up and running again. We need as many volunteers as possible, who will have to do a couple of hours training, which hopefully we can arrange to be done at the Village Hall, High Viz clothing will be provided.

July was a very mixed month of weather, with over average sunshine, much needed rainfall (13 days) and some high temperatures. Rainfall recorded was 68.961mm (2.715in.) from the 13 days, the wettest July since 2012, and 13.12% above a July average. The highest temperature was on Thur.6th with a reading of 29.0°C (84.2°F), not as high as the 32.25°C the previous month, still the hottest day this year.

At the end of July were took part in a study trip to Poundbury near Dorchester in Dorset which has been created by the Prince of Wales to show how new homes and jobs should be provided. It is very impressive. The streets were laid out in a way that naturally limited traffic speeds, the car parking was also well planned and there were no yellow lines, hardly any traffic signs and no overhead wires at all. We liked the way the social housing (35% of the total) had been so well integrated that you could not distinguish it from the other housing. Poundbury is also a model for how jobs can be created and the target was to create one job for every home which has been exceeded. Apart from the factory producing Dorset cereals and another producing chocolate, most of the 185 businesses located in Poundbury were quite small and so far there are 2,100 jobs. In addition to these jobs there are a further 550 people employed in the construction of the next two phases of Poundbury.

We met with the Poundbury project team who shared some of the lessons they learned in creating this new community and came away determined that what we do at Otterpool Park matches the vision and quality of Poundbury. We both attended Sellindge Parish Council on August 8th where we reported on our Poundbury visit and other Council business. Jenny also attended the monthly Sports & Social Club Meeting, the Stowting Parish Meeting and the Eleclink Exhibition which is a project to build, install and operate an electrical interconnector between France and the UK by installing two cables in the Channel, building a converter station at the Eurotunnel Terminal and connected to the Sellindge substation via an underground electric cable. The work for this is likely to start in 2018 and last for 18 months following the A20 through the main part of Sellindge. This will involve some control of traffic with lights but disruption will be kept to a minimum by undertaking work in sections in order to keep traffic moving.

It was July 31st 2014 when the outline application to build 250 homes adjacent to the village hall car park in Sellindge was first submitted and January 19th 2016 when the planning agreement was signed. As part of the planning conditions the developer agreed to pay for the cost of traffic calming measures along the A20 which would allow the speed limit to be reduced to 30mph. Kent Highways has been holding off major repairs to the A20 to do them at the same time as the traffic calming measures. As the law stands, a landowner cannot be compelled to build their permitted scheme and Kent Highways have decided they can no longer wait for this development to start. The repairs and resurfacing work to the A20 through Sellindge are scheduled to take place between 7 30pm and 5 00 am from $6^{th} - 8^{th}$ September (weather permitting) which is almost as late as it can be for such works before the cold and wet weather sets in. If there are outstanding pothole repairs you know about, do please report these to Kent Highways for attention on 03000 41 81 81 or online at www.kent.gov.uk as they too are best done before the weather worsens. By the time you receive this newsletter the repairs should be complete to the streetlights in Sellindge, including the thirteen that have been 'necked' (reduced in height to stumps) because the columns were judged to be unsafe. The replacement lights will be LED (Light Emitting Diode) which give a better directed and less harsh light (less light pollution), cost less to run (saving money and carbon emissions), last longer (saving money as they don't need to be changed so frequently), report themselves if about to fail or failed and can be dimmed or increased as suits the conditions. All of Kent's 118,000 streetlights are switching to LED, a project that is costing £40m but will recoup its costs within six years.

It's not just your District Council that provides parks (see the District Councillors' report on the new play facilities and fountain at Radnor Park in Folkestone). Kent County Council provides nine Country Parks and five smaller countryside areas. Our nearest Country Park is at Brockhill Park near Hythe and it has Green Flag status which is a quality mark for its level of maintenance and facilities. The parks cost £1.6m a year to run and generate £1.2m income which means the cost to Kent taxpayers is £400,000 a year or 21p per resident. In 2015/16 the parks had 1.6m visitors and visitor surveys found an average rating for the parks of 9.25 out of 10. Seven of the Country Parks have Green Flag status, one is a National Nature Reserve, three are Sites of Special Scientific Interest and three are Local Wildlife Sites. KCC has just published a Country Parks strategy about its plans for the parks over the next four years and is open for consultation until September 11th at www.kent.gov.uk/countryparksstrategy contact me for paper copy.
