Before the report of general items that were discussed, your Parish Council would like to welcome Mr Chris Brace who has been co-opted. This means that your Council now only has one vacancy left to fill.

Jenny gave her normal very detailed informative report, and this will be contained on other pages in the Newsletter. Your Council looked at three planning applications; they were Brook Farm – and as there were no planning reasons to refuse, supported the application. However, it was noted that also outstanding were applications for Lawful Development; your Council does not have the legal opportunity to comment on these, but did raise issues which had been noted on the plans.

The application by Balfour to use the old Quarry as a storage area while the work at the Channel Tunnel takes place was supported; caveats were required in that no lorries should be arriving through the village, this was already mentioned by the applicant and your Council asked that Shepway ensure this takes place by making it a condition on the application. It is expected that this will only be required for a two year period.

The Old Methodist Church. Your Council strongly objected to this application on the grounds that they could see no apparent changes to the plans.

An amount of £116.00 has been banked, however since then more has come in; full details will be in the next News. Street Lighting in the Village. (Now completed – we hope)

The lighting engineer visited the Parish Council office prior to the meeting with a letter from 'residents' in Barrow Hill. Since then your Council have received the same letter. No –one could reply to this which was such a shame; your Council had the information that would have put everyone's mind at rest. This information was that KCC knew there were still light posts to be completed, but had stopped work when the engineers started surveying for the electric cables that will be going through the Village, and the person who was responsible for checking the safety of the completed work had been seriously unwell. It's now known that all these items have been resolved and that any lights still to be completed will be in due course.

As Clerk, if you write to the Parish Council I am unable to reply to you unless I have your name and contact details. Your Council have continued to get complaints regarding the height of the grass in the Churchyard; can I reiterate that your Council is only responsible for the Burial Ground adjacent to Harringe Lane and the old one furthest from the Church and, as such, can do nothing. Any complaints of this kind need to be addressed to the Church Wardens.

Dog Poo Bags – The Parish Council is still providing these for use free of charge, members consider that this has made a difference to the village. Simply come to the Parish Council office Tues 9am - Noon & Fri 3pm - 5.30pm

Homelessness is a growing problem both nationally and locally. Over the last year the number of people approaching Shepway for help has risen 10% and we have 70 families in temporary accommodation (mostly bed and breakfast). Whilst the council will help everyone with advice we only have a legal duty to house the most vulnerable. The new Homelessness Reduction Act will change that and from April next year our duty is extended to everyone. We expect applications for help to rise by at least 50%.

The problem is made worse by London boroughs placing their homeless in rented accommodation in our area. This reduces the number of homes available for locals and pushes up rents.

We know we will need more housing for single people and some of the council housing we are building will be one or two bedroomed. We are also looking to acquire more temporary housing and we have been allocated more money by the government for staff to put together personal housing plans for those who come to us for help. These measures will help but ultimately our district (and the rest of the UK) needs more homes if we are to have enough social and privately rented housing.

If you or someone you know is at risk of homelessness then please ask Shepway for advice. There's information on www.shepway.gov.uk and a comprehensive report to councillors at the Overview and Scrutiny Committee on 12 September which can also be found on the website.

We are now halfway through our financial year and have allocated about half of our Shepway ward grant. Among the projects we are supporting is the purchase of a minibus for the Shepway Sports Trust which will take children to and from sports facilities and competitions and also be used for sports clubs. We are also supporting Sellindge Village Hall with a grant for new chairs.

Jenny attended the regular monthly meeting of Sellindge Parish Council on 12 September, the Sports & Social Club Meeting and also the Commemoration of the 77th Anniversary of The Battle of Britain Service at St Stephen's Church Lympne. Susan joined villagers at St Mary's church on 10 September for the tea party. We've both seen some of the Folkestone Triennial which runs until 05 November and recommend a visit. It's a world class show on our doorstep, free to see and is part of the changes which are transforming Folkestone.

As I write my report we are still in the aftermath of the terrorist attack in London with KCC staff involved in the response. Much of the work KCC does in this area must necessarily remain confidential but I can tell you our staff are trained to work on prevention and identification of radicalisation and that we work closely with Kent Police. I was recently at a presentation about the work of Kent Police given by Paul Brandon the Deputy Chief Constable. We were given a snapshot of weekly demand – 830 emergency calls, 2,437 calls for assistance, 12 children (under 17) and 35 adults reported missing, 345 crimes, 86 arrests and much more. We were told about the work under way to deal with people with mental health problems, investigation of gangs, child sexual abuse both current and historic and not least the work being done to deal with terrorism and radicalisation. Like so many public services there is an increasing demand but limited resources. One way Kent Police were coping was by making more use of technology such as online reporting of crime via their website and the use of body cameras by Police officers which has led to a big drop in complaints.

There's no doubt that Kent Police have a very big job to do but their entire presentation made no mention of traffic offences yet all councillors know that this is one of the biggest concerns of our communities. Both Matthew Balfour, KCC's cabinet member for Highways and I raised these concerns with Paul Brandon. His response was that Kent Police do have teams dealing with speeding but their priority is accident black spots. It is of course reasonable to prioritise limited resources but if we want traffic offences further up the list of Kent Police priorities then it would help to let them know it matters. Matthew Scott, Kent's Police and Crime Commissioner undertakes regular surveys on public priorities so please let him know your views. Here in Sellindge we also have equipment and if there are enough volunteers we can run our own Speed watch.

Whilst housing is the district council's responsibility it is KCC that has to provide the schools, roads and other infrastructure needed for every new home. Some of this is funded by contributions from the housing developers but it's never enough and KCC has around £1billion of borrowing for the school places and roads it has funded over the last few decades. The Government has recently announced a £2.3bn Housing Infrastructure Fund and invited bids. I'm pleased to report that Otterpool Garden Town stands a very good chance of being the principal project that KCC puts forward in its bid to this fund. The grant could be as much as £250m which would go a very long way to providing the roads and schools we want in advance of the houses being built.

The works to the streetlights that needed repair/replacement along Main Road in Sellindge were interrupted by staff sickness but I am told it will be completed on 20 September. There has also been a streetlight problem at Bern Hurst Close which is due to be fixed. This problem has been reported anonymously so Kent Highways have asked me to include in the newsletter that they have received the report and the repair will be done.
