### SELLINDGE VILLAGE HALL GOES LIVE !

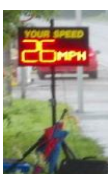
Sellindge Village Hall went live on October 15<sup>th</sup> 2017.

Thanks to all the Sellindge Villagers for supporting the Sellindge Village Hall Charity (number 302833) by nominating it for the Co-Op Community Grant allocation of 1% of items brought through their Co-Op card which raised the sum of £924.00. It has made it possible to provide the Village Hall with Broadband, and this will make it possible for the Pop – In Centre to provide even more services – Broadband Access – Computer Help – Emails – Photo copies at 20p per sheet – Information sheet printouts and Projector Screens.

Broadband Access and the Projector Screens will also be available for Village Hall hirers and groups to use.

Your Parish Council met on Tuesday October 10<sup>th</sup>, and the meeting was attended by all current Parish Councillors, but there is still one vacancy waiting to be filled. So if you are interested in helping keep Sellindge a nice place to live, then do come along to the office on a Tuesday morning or Friday afternoon and learn more about the importance of keeping the Parish Council active.

### **Reports**

Jenny gave a very detailed report, and on behalf of Susan updated those present on the future of the Kent County Council budgets. There is still time to make comments on the consultation; if you log on to the KCC website you will be able to read about the proposed cuts that are required to allow the budgets to balance. KCC are looking at making a band C property for 2018/19 £1,089.68 for the year.

### **Parish Council Budget 2018/19**

While on the subject of budgets; do you have a project in mind that would improve the village or be beneficial to all, and that your Parish Council could lead on or help with? If the answer is 'yes', then do let me know, as the Clerk I can let your Parish Councillors know and it can be considered before the end of January 2018, which is when the Parish Council have to set the budget.

The accounts have been audited with no problems noted by the auditor, and are on display in all the five Parish Council noticeboards around the village, and also on the website.

Your Parish Council continues to receive complaints about unsocial parking in Greenfields, and would ask that residents consider others when parking and also think about the buses that have to circumvent the estate.

Your next Parish Council meeting is on 14<sup>th</sup> of November, as normal it is in the Durling Hall and will start at 7.30pm so do come along.

## FROM YOUR SHEPWAY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

As you will see from Susan's County Council report, KCC has made a bid to the Government's Housing Infrastructure Fund for £290m for Otterpool Park Garden Town. There are several benefits from being the chosen bid for Kent as it means the KCC officers are helping with the early planning work needed for the infrastructure. If the bid is unsuccessful this work can still be used but the infrastructure would be delivered over a longer period.

Shepway District Council has recently published a charter for Otterpool Park which expands on the principles set out sixteen months ago and makes our commitment to create a place that is environmentally, socially and economically sustainable. We hope people will give their comments and help shape the development. The masterplan is continuing to be developed and the Government has recently given Shepway a grant of £155,000 towards the costs of the masterplan, design statement and Environmental Impact Assessment.

Shepway District Council is also making its own bid to the Housing Infrastructure Fund for a grant to clean up the contaminated former gasworks site in Ship Street, Folkestone so that 85 houses can be built there. As with the KCC bid to the Housing Infrastructure Fund, we will know if we have been successful in a few months' time.

Shepway District Council has recently submitted a planning permission for new homes, a leisure centre and public space on the former municipal tip at Princes Parade in Hythe. The leisure centre would replace the existing swimming pool on the seafront in Hythe which is well past its useful life and it would also provide space for a café, exercise classes and gym stations which will help support the running costs of the pool. The plans would nearly double the width of existing walkway along the seafront, take the road behind the proposed new houses and slow traffic speeds. Jenny attended the Health Promotion and AGM at the Sellindge Doctors Surgery where tips were given on sensible eating and ways of measuring portions using our hands, together with a talk and information on the NHS Health Walks held in Sellindge every Tuesday which start from the Village Hall at 10 30 am prompt - all welcome. Thanks were also expressed to Dr Del Bianca for her service to the Community over many years and she was wished a long and healthy retirement. Jenny also attended the start of the 50th Anniversary Celebrations of the Sellindge Playing Fields (Sports & Social Club). It is hoped to arrange further events throughout the year. She also attended Sellindge Parish Council Meeting on 10 October.

I am pleased to confirm that KCC has chosen the Otterpool Park Garden Town as the project in Kent most likely to win funding from the Government's £2.3bn Housing Infrastructure Fund. This fund is intended to speed up house building by providing infrastructure such as roads, utilities, schools, medical facilities, community space and in the case of Otterpool Park there is also a bid for a platform extension at Westenhanger station so the High-speed train service can stop there. Another unusual part of the Otterpool Park bid is tree planting to enhance the pockets of ancient woodland that are already there (at least 30% of Otterpool Park will be publically accessible green space). There will be many other projects applying for this funding and nationwide we expect less than ten will be successful. KCC's officers believe Otterpool Park stands a good chance of securing this funding and we will know the result in a few months. Our bid is for about £290m which would be a real boost to our local economy and work could start as early as next year on the infrastructure in advance of the homes. If we win the bid it would be repaid when homes at Otterpool are sold meaning that in future years KCC would be able to reinvest the funding to support other projects across Kent.

Someone has suggested KCC uses this grant to solve its budget challenge for next year. That won't work because we haven't won the £290m yet and it has to be spent on a particular project not day to day expenditure. KCC's budget challenge is, as ever, that we face rising demand for social care as our population ages and our funding from central government reduces. The Government's funding plans for local government assume that we will raise council tax by the maximum allowable before a referendum must be held (currently 2%) plus an extra 2% social care levy – 3.9% in all. Even with this rise and the savings we have planned we expect we will have to reduce some services. There's a consultation on what our priorities should be. What matters to you most – subsidised bus services, road maintenance, youth services, care for the vulnerable, library services? Search online for 'KCC budget' to take part in the consultation or contact me for a paper copy.

I know many of you have had disturbed nights from the diversion during works to the M20 by Highways England in October. An emergency diversion is one thing but planned maintenance is quite another and there should not be a diversion of motorway traffic to residential roads at night for such a long period. I hope you will join me in writing to Highways England to ask them not to do this again. 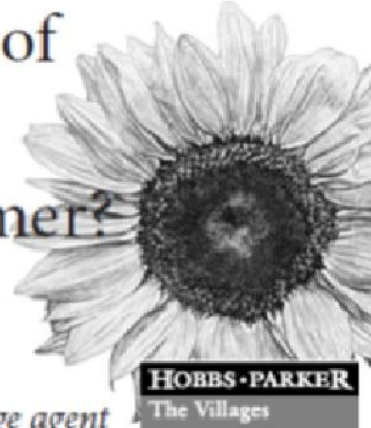
