#### **SELLINDGE SURGERY – PATIENT SURVEY 2012**

Our survey held in 2012 was based on A&E attendance and urgent access. The scope of the survey was to determine how many patients have attended A&E during the last 12 months and how many of those were appropriate. We also wanted to establish how aware our patients are of the alternatives that are available to them when they wish to be seen urgently.

In total we received 110 completed forms. 90% are aware of the Emergency surgery (formally known as 'open Surgery') held every weekday morning for urgent problems that cannot wait for a booked appointment.

93% are aware of the existence of NHS Direct for advice on minor medical problems. 62% are aware of the Walk-in centre at Folkestone. 10% are aware of Minor injury services operating at Charing, Ham Street, Ivy Court in Tenterden, Kingsnorth, Woodchurch and Wye surgeries and only 9% are aware that every visit to A&E results in a charge to the Practice of between £54.00 and £139.00, even if you do not wait to be seen.

29 patients who completed the survey have attended A&E during the last 12 months and it was apparent from the comments they made that the majority were appropriate.

We would like to encourage any patient who needs to be seen urgently; in the first instance to contact the surgery and a member of the reception staff will advise you on the best option for you. If you ring after 6.30pm your call will go directly through to Out of Hours. Fridge magnets are available at the surgery with all the relevant telephone numbers, please ask at reception.

#### **SALT and GRIT BINS**

The Parish Council have purchased and installed a Salt / Grit bin at the junction of Barrow Hill Rise and Barrow Hill. There were plans to put a Salt / Grit bin at the junction of Whitehall Way and Swan Lane, but after a site meeting it was found that there is no grass verge to place it on, we cannot place them on public pathways. Shepway District Council has also installed Salt / Grit bin in the lower part of Greenfields. Now there are four salt bins in the Parish, the others being at the upper part of Greenfields and at the junction of Swan Green and Swan Lane. The Parish Council must point out that the contents of the bins are for the use on the highway and public pathways, and must not be used on private drives or pathways.

SELLINDGE PARISH COUNCIL www.sellindgepc.kentparishes.gov.uk From Your Parish Council Clerk Linda Hedley By the time you read this you will have eaten all the turkey – I hope – and are back to work. So I hope you had an enjoyable Christmas and New Year break.

Your Council met on December 11th, with all but one of your Councillors present. There was only one member of the public. There were no decisions from the District Council to report. However the Bernurst application was considered by your Council. This application was the second one for the site. Your Parish Council objected to the previous application. This was due in the main, to the intensification of the site, access to the site along with other issues raised by nearby residents. With the second plans your Council were pleased to see that their objections to the previous application had been carefully considered. Additionally Members of the Planning Group visited the site and with input from nearby residents have supported this new application. Since the Parish Council put their comments in, we have been informed by Shepway District Council that the large Beech tree and large Oak tree on the Bernhurst site have been given Tree Preservation orders.

The amount of correspondence has decreased leading up to the Christmas break, this allowed to meeting to end early. The projects that your council are following are varied, but unfortunately slow to come to fruition. Mrs Carey reported that the bus shelter at the junction of A20 with Swan Lane will be replaced in January. The bus shelter was a project started by your Parish Council, which Mrs Carev has kindly taken over and has funded the bus shelter from her KCC allocation from highways. As the Clerk to your Council I reported to members the length of time that it has taken to get through to the correct people to attempt to resolve the flooding in Moorstock Lane. An officer from the Highways department reported that some of the water had been sucked up by a tanker, but with the heavy rain a more permanent solution needs to be found. Potholes continue to be reported by Councillors and me. Your Council has paid for and filled with salt a salt bin Barrow Hill Rise.

The budget for the coming financial year was debated. Central Government changed the way that District Councils need to deal with Council Tax claimants; this has meant changes in the way in the Precept will be paid. For this year your Council is hoping for a transitional grant which will be paid to Parish Councils. This may not happen in future years so Parish Councils are being advised to make adjustments to their budgets to replace the losses. With all this information the budget has not yet been agreed and will be further debated in January. The next meeting is on Tuesday January 8th. As always you are welcome to attend.

#### FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Susan Carey, Member for Elham Valley, Kent County Council Not everyone is aware that the council tax you pay covers only about a quarter of the spending on schools, social care, libraries, roads etc... The balance is made up of funding from the national pool of business rates and come to us as a mixture of grants for specific purposes, (such as the Dedicated Schools Grant) and general grant based on a formula of population, deprivation etc. The system is fearsomely complicated and has always favoured Councils in London, the Midlands and the North. This matters because areas like Kent do not get an equal share of national resources to deal with the same level of needs such as care of the elderly. It's particularly unfair when other local authorities get a higher grant allocation per person and then place that person in a care home in Kent pushing up prices for local people. The same happens for Looked After Children where we have about 1,600 of our own but the same again placed in Kent by Councils from London and across the country putting pressure on our schools, the NHS and other services. Kent also faces special pressures from being a 'gateway' to Europe with heavy through traffic, costs in dealing with unaccompanied young asylum seekers and the infrastructure needed to support the housing growth in the Thames Gateway and Ashford. We are still making the case for fairer funding and it's even more important now that there is less money with the government trying to bring public spending back in line with income. Local government has already taken big reduction in grants over the last two years and we've done our best to make the savings through reducing staff (putting more services online), reconfiguring services (e.g. the registry service moving in to libraries), better procurement (employing specialist staff to buy goods and services at a lower cost) and selling more of our services to Councils outside Kent (e.g. our legal services). This has enabled us to save around £200m over the last two years whilst freezing Council Tax. But there's no doubt that it gets harder to make savings as the 'easier' savings have now been made. On December 19th, the Government announced the amount of our grants for 2013/14 and for Kent County Council the unwelcome news was that we need to find a further £15 million of savings on top of the £60 million we'd already planned for next financial year. Councillors will be discussing this in January with the budget being debated at full Council on February 14<sup>th</sup>.

I've received a letter from the National Grid about the works they are doing to upgrade the electricity network. From Monday January 7th, the temporary traffic lights will be going back in Church Lane and this time there will also be a 30mph speed limit which could be in place for up to 18 months.

On the good news front, January should see the demolition and replacement of the concrete bus shelter with a wooden one which should both be more weather proof and better looking; this project has been funded from the share of the Highways budget that I am able to allocate as your County Councillor. Happy New Year!

Congratulations go to Little Learners who have been successfully reaccredited with the Kent Quality Award by demonstrating high quality practice over the last three years.

#### KENT POLICE

Security – Take steps to secure your home and garden before you set off to help deter unwanted visitors while you're away. Make sure all doors and windows are locked and any valuable items are tucked out of view, as well as packaging or boxes from new Christmas presents. If you can, ask a trusted neighbour to keep an eye on your property and even park on your drive while you're away. Cancelling milk and paper deliveries and using timer switches on lights and radios will also help to give the impression that someone is home.

It's a good idea to secure the outside of your property too. Store expensive tools and gardening equipment somewhere secure and chain them together or to a ground anchor to make them harder to remove. Lock sheds, garages and outbuildings and make sure garden gates are locked from the inside. Secure boundaries, security lights and alarms around your property can all help to deter unwanted visitors.

**Cold Callers alert** - This is a reminder to all Neighbourhood Watch & Country Eye: We have received a number of calls about companies who cold call. In particular Carlton Security Solutions & Direct Response. Both selling security alarm systems. In some instances they are claiming to be working with Kent Police. This is not the case.

Please report any calls from these companies to Kent Trading Standards, who advise consumers to be wary when dealing with cold callers on your telephone & at their door. Consider carefully whether you do want the goods or services offered. To report any concerns you have or for details of Buy With Confidence traders call Trading Standards via Citizen Advice

Minimum temp. -2.25°C Fri.30th. Mean night temp. 3.27°C Maximum temp. 13.50°C Tues.13th.. Mean day temp. 10.31°C

The rainy weather from October continued on into November. Rainfall was recorded on 18 days of the month. The wettest day was Monday 26<sup>th</sup> with frequent heavy showers and strong winds, rain recorded being 23.876mm (0.94in). Total rainfall for the month was 98.552mm (3.88in) surprisingly only 0.78% above the months average. Night temperatures were 0.24°C below average, even so there were only 6 minor frosts. Day temperatures were up by 1.35°C, and sunshine hours were near the November average.
