#### KENT FIRE and RESCUE SERVICE - HOT WEATHER FIRE AND WATER ADVICE

During this hot weather we all being extra alert to issues like health and vulnerable people as well as outdoor safety. **Outdoor fires** – Obviously we want people to enjoy the summer, but every year areas of countryside, crops, and wildlife habitats are destroyed by fire. While some of the incidents are due to deliberate fire-setters, many are actually started accidentally due to carelessness, so:

Please be careful about disposing of cigarette ends ------ Avoid open air fires during this dry weather Parents please make sure children know the hazards, consequences of playing with matches and lighting fires outdoors **Water safety** – In this hot weather rivers and lakes can look inviting, but a cooling dip can turn into an emergency, and as many waterways are so remote there is no guarantee that someone will hear your calls for help. Follow these tips to help keep yourself and your family safe around water:

Don't jump or dive in as the water can be far deeper then it looks, and have unseen hazards

Never swim near weirs or locks as there are unusually dangerous currents

Inland waters can be very cold, and can quickly cause cramp and breathing difficulties

Your Parish Council met on Tuesday July 9<sup>th</sup> and the Chairman welcomed the 3 new Councillors to their first meeting. The most controversial item on the agenda was the news that Countrystyle are now looking at the conditions which have been applied by the Kent County Council and licenses that are required from the Environment Agency (EA) that will allow the site operate. There are 37 conditions in total, so a lot of work has to be done by the company to produce the documentation ready for submission to either the KCC or the EA or both.

Your Parish Councillors visited the Countrystyle site at Ridham Dock to see what happens and how a site taking in waste will work. The biggest difference between the Ridham site and Otterpool is that Otterpool will be enclosed in a building with a positive pressure air and a two door lock. This means that the outer door cannot be opened until the inner door is closed and no lorries can tip until both doors are closed. The waste will be weighed in so that the site does not take in more than it is allowed under any EA licence.

Now back to the 37 conditions. The amount of waste that can come in to the site will be one of those conditions. Since the visit, as the Clerk I have, on behalf of your Council and the residents spoken to KCC and they inform me that the process will be as follows;

\*The applicant will produce the documents for the various conditions, (which ever ones they are applying for, as they will not be putting the conditions for 37 at once) these are then presented to the KCC or the EA who consider them and raise any queries. Once any adjustments have been made they are sent out for consideration to the PC.

\*The Planning Committee, at the time of the original application, made a report on issues that should be included or monitored, so as the application was given permission, these concerns already have been made aware to the applicant. \*Your Council was informed at the meeting that not all of the 37 conditions will be applied for at the same time so a watching brief will be maintained.

\*Countrystyle have asked that your Parish Council is the one stop information point on any queries you have so please contact me with any questions. This way there will not be a number of different people asking the same questions. \*In addition to the your Clerk relaying the questions you may have, Countrystyle have confirmed that they will relay updates on a regular basis to the Clerk, with the idea of having an update meeting later in the year. Dates and venues to be confirmed when this is arranged.

Now back to the other matters which your Council considered.

The action log has been kindly taken over by Colin, this will aid my work load, as sometimes you can be on the phone for a long time waiting for a reply on a query or update and that is just on highway problems. So thank you Colin. It has been a quiet month with no planning to consider, nor were there any decisions to report.

Correspondence was mundane with only circulars from companies touting for business from your Parish Council; needless to say these were filed for future reference. By now the Garage Safari will have taken place. Your Council hopes that it was a worthwhile event and look forward to another one next year.

From a personal point of view it was nice to meet those of you who came to the Council Office to join in. Now you know where the office is, please do come and visit if you have any questions on anything local. Either myself or one of the Councillors – it is arranged that a Councillor is present when the office is open – will be able to assist. The next meeting will be on Tuesday August  $13^{th}$ , in the Durling Hall.

I also attended the 700<sup>th</sup> Charter Celebrations at The Leas Cliff Hall and was delighted to form part of the welcoming party in Boulogne for 15 Shepway and 15 Boulogne students on a Tall Ship Project sailing from Portsmouth to Boulogne.

In the Village, I was pleased to open the School Fayre and attended the Sports Day. Many congratulations to all involved in the life of our happy and successful Primary School. I attended the July Parish Council Meeting and it was good to see some members of the public there. I have, as usual, received a number of requests on Planning matters, particularly relating to the 'New Ways of Working' that Shepway now operates under.

Unfortunately, the proposal to install parking bollards outside Brook Lane Cottages has been rejected by the Estate Improvement Programme. This is largely due to the fact that, of the 10 properties in Brook Lane, only 3 are now owned by Shepway District Council – and on this basis the improvements were felt to offer poor value for money.

FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Member for Elham Valley, Kent County Council KCC has been in the news lately with the announcement that we have £240m of further savings to make (nearly a third of our present budget excluding schools) over the next three years. There's no doubt that this new set of savings will be difficult and much depends on whether we can reduce demand for social care through measures to help people live independently in their own homes. We are also continuing to move more work on-line and are using procurement experts to help us make every pound count. You can expect to hear more on our budget plans as they develop. The other big story was the Government's consultation on the options for a new Lower Thames Crossing. Most people accept there is a need for an extra crossing as the delays at Dartford are bad and getting worse. You might think this is an issue that only concerns North Kent but it affects the whole of Kent as the present road network encourages most transit traffic to take the M20. In the long term we need a lower Thames crossing that can connect traffic from Dover to the Midlands and the North so KCC has asked the government to go for option C which would connect the M2 with the A13 and the M25 between junctions 29 and 30. We have also asked for as much of the route as possible to be tunnel to minimise the impact on the environment and we've taken the opportunity to make the case for other important improvements to the road network in Kent. The Government has said that it wishes to make the best choice for the long term rather than automatically choosing the cheapest option (which is to build a new bridge at Dartford) and wants to encourage more capital projects. It's very much in Sellindge's interests to have transit traffic to and from the Channel ports moved from the M20 to the A2/M2.

Locally, I was very pleased to be invited to the children's party hosted at Sellindge village hall on 14 July. The party seemed to have at least as many adults as children and all enjoying the summer weather. Sellindge village hall is one of the best used in Kent and there are always schemes on the go for improvement. I am told their next project is the levelling of the hall floor to improve access for those with mobility problems.

I have heard that Countrystyle may be close to submitting their case on how to fulfil the conditions they must meet before they can use Otterpool Quarry for processing waste. The conditions are demanding and I know both the Parish Council and your other local representatives will be scrutinising any submission. I shall let you know more as information becomes available.
