@ParishSellindge Your council met during the month of May, this was the Annual Council Meeting where the Chairman and Vice Chairman were elected. Under normal situations other representatives and committee members are agreed. Your Council decided that due to the 3 vacant seats this should not take place until after the elections. Due to the dates clashing between the publication of the Newsletter and the notice of a poll, it was not possible to place any information in last month's newsletter, although your Councillors did take the time to ensure that notices were placed on the notice boards.

During the public session a debate took place with some residents and the Council over communication with Mr Lello. Mr Lello felt that although your Council had published a withdrawal of their remarks about comments made in a previous newsletter item. Mr Lello felt an apology should also be given. This was not done at that time as Council Members were under the impression that all Mr Lello wanted printed was a withdrawal to bring the matter to close. This was not to be the case so your Parish Council is now apologising for any misunderstanding and hope this will be the end of the matter.

There are 4 people standing and your Council wish good luck to all have taken to the time to come forward and stand to represent the village. The Polling day is on 20th June so by July all the committees will be able to be filled.

Neither your District nor County Councillor were able to attend this month, however they always ensure that there is an update each month so please see their respective reports.

There was no planning to consider, confirmation that the Shepway D C has confirmed the Tree Preservation Order at Bern Hurst. The Clerk updated Councillors and the public on the Action Log Items. This is still work in process, but your Council and Clerk are picking up and monitoring more local issues that affect Sellindge residents.

The Next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday 11th June at the normal place in the Durling Hall. Due to hall bookings The Annual Parish Meeting or Public Assembly is a little late this year and will be held on Tuesday 18th June arrive at 7.15pm for refreshments. The Annual assembly is taking a new incentive this year, so why not come along and see what is in store, meet you current Councillors and the candidates for the elections as an invitation is being sent to all four candidates. The last two years have been very hectic and demanding but extremely rewarding. I have met so many unsung volunteers and have been humbled by the time they give to organizations ranging from East Kent Hospice, Age UK, Cubs, Scouts and Guides, Youth Facilities, Music, Art, Dance and Sports Clubs to The Red Cross, St Johns Ambulance, Citizen Advice Bureau, Breast Feeding Peer Mentoring to name just a few. I have been extremely impressed with our young people and the talent in our Schools is something to be proud of. My successor is Councillor Pamela Carr who represents Elham and Stelling Minnis and I wish her well. I have now been appointed to the Cabinet as Member for Communities which covers Corporate enforcement, Community safety, Arts and Culture, Leisure and Sport, Young people, Voluntary Sector, Town and Parish Liaison, Health & Wellbeing and Relationships with health related bodies - so no time to take a break! As part of its ongoing commitment supporting the local economy, Shepway has set aside £250,000 in discretionary rate relief to support businesses in the District that have the potential for growth and job creation. Also a Ward Budget scheme has been introduced for 2013/14 which will provide a delegated budget of £2,000 per ward councillor to spend on community projects. FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Susan Carey, Member for Elham Valley, Kent County Council I'm delighted to be returning to Sellindge Village News after a break for the election. Thank you to those who voted for me and an even bigger thank you to those who helped me deliver over 8,000 leaflets to the 15,636 electors in the Elham Valley division. Following my re-election to Kent County Council I have been re-appointed deputy cabinet member for finance so will be carrying on with the work to balance our books when income is frozen but costs and demand are rising. So far we have been able to make savings where they don't show but this becomes increasingly difficult and I expect your Council will face some unpalatable choices about services in the next four years.

Most of my work as your County Councillor is done at County Hall on Kent-wide matters but one of the best parts of the job is taking part in village life so do please invite me to local events and brief me on projects which I may be able to help with grants (while I still have them). I will also gladly help any resident with a County Council matter where they need advice or they find the system hasn't worked. Do please keep copies of correspondence or a note of any phone calls and who you have spoken to as this makes chasing progress much easier.

Finally, I recently attended the annual meeting at Shepway where Jenny Hollingsbee stepped down from her role as chairman of Shepway District Council. It is the general view that Jenny has been a quite exceptional chairman and Sellindge can be proud of its district councillor.

NORDIC WALKING FOR HEALTH

If you're out and about in any time after mid-May, you've a fair chance of running into a group of people, all striding purposefully, each with a set of walking sticks. To some, they might look skiers, in denial about the end of the snow season, but they're actually out doing something called Nordic Walking. As a low impact, load bearing, whole body workout, it's more effective for improving all-round fitness than walking, running or cycling, but feels much easier... in fact it's the perfect activity for anyone who thinks they hate exercise! Nordic Walking is an exercise activity that cuts across age and fitness barriers, allowing a wide range of people to participate in a pursuit that allows them to get fit and combat the effects of ageing without even noticing! It's even possible for those who are frail or recovering from illness to participate in separate, specially adapted "Wellbeing" classes. We start our walk training on local village greens before going on to walk slightly further afield on public footpaths and woodland trails. Classes are currently taking place in Smeeth, Aldington and Lyminge, but can extend to Sellindge if there is sufficient demand. SELLINDGE POP IN – A place for all age groups

The Pop In is now increasing in popularity, with people coming from as far away as Ashford, Folkestone and Dover. The Pop In is open Monday and Wednesday from 8.30am to 12 Noon, also now on Tuesday the Pop in is open from 8.30am to 4.00pm, where you can stop relax have a cuppa and a chat, browse the bric -a - brac or the good selection of books and meet friends or make new friends, you can also get information from one of the outside agencies who will be attending the Pop In on certain dates. The Pop In also holding information directories from Age UK and Case Kent (Shepway). The Pop In now has a Hearing library with a good variety of titles. Lots of good books to choose from. Reflexology can be arranged through the Pop In. On Tuesday's – Suzie is at the Pop In from 10.30am offering File and Polish, Mini Manicure or Classic Manicures. On Tuesday 11th Hi Kent the charity for the deaf, serving hearing aids etc.

John Brooks from Age UK Folkestone & Dover will be at the Pop In on Tuesday's 11th & 25th between 10.00am and Noon. 100's of books paperbacks 10p hardbacks 50p, loads of children's books 20p come and see for yourself.

KENT POLICE – Heating oil theft – advice – Police are urging all those who store heating oil to be extra vigilant. This includes businesses, schools, churches, farms and residential properties. In order to reduce the risk of your fuel being stolen, please consider the following security measures – Keep your yard or drive gates closed and locked. Ensure gates and fences are in good repair. Consider installing CCTV and security lighting – Make sure your tank is within sight of your home or office but difficult to spot by potential offenders. – Restrict access by planting thorny shrubs around your tank. Thieves will think twice before forcing their way through a prickly hedge, and the smallest trace of blood or shred of clothing can provide enough forensic evidence to identify the offender – Lock away tools so they cannot be used to access your tank.

Also it has come to me that the following e crime unit e mail the Police is a scam. If you have e mail delete as it carries a virus. Just a few tips on distraction burglaries. A few tips to keep you safe – If you're not sure who is at your door, don't open it! Check the identity of the caller by calling the company they are purporting to be from ie. Gas, Electricity, Water or Police. Use the telephone numbers listed in your local directory or provided independently by your service provider. Do not use any telephone numbers provided by the caller, they may be bogus. - Telephone a neighbour or friend nearby to come along and check out the caller before you open the door to them. - Some areas in the country have Neighbourhood Watch or Nominated Neighbour Schemes you can sign up to. Check with your local police Safer Neighbourhood Team to find out if there is one in your area. Many utility service providers like Gas Electricity and Water, provide password schemes or hotline numbers for customers to call, to check the identity of callers before opening the door. Speak to your utility provider - Don't keep large quantities of cash at home: put it in the bank or post office where it is safe. - Keep doors locked and windows secure at all times. Only put the door chain on to answer the door. - If somebody asks for your help, needs to make a telephone call, has lost a ball in your garden, needs a drink or request a pen and paper for example, refer them to a younger neighbour or assist them through a closed door. Or call a friend or neighbour to come and assist. - If you suspect a bogus caller has visited you, even if you didn't let them in, call the police straight away. We need to know! What is Distraction Burglary? - Distraction burglary is where criminals call at your house posing as officials or asking for your help with something. They make up a story to get in to your home. Generally targeting older people, they have just one intention: to steal! Remember A genuine caller will happily wait outside while you check on them by calling their organisation and or calling a family member or neighbour. Although the number of distraction burglaries is nowhere near the number of other crimes committed in the UK each day, In an emergency situation always call 999 "I'm from the "Water Board", there's a leak down the road I need to check your water supply" This will never be true. The phrase "water board" is no longer used by legitimate callers – only distraction burglars. Don't open the door. Even if they say "It's an emergency". Your water supplier can easily be contacted to verify any caller - their number can be found on your water bill and directory enquiries. If they continue to insist you open the door, tell them you're going to call the police on 999 - and do it! "I need to read your meter" Check with your utility company before you let them in. Call your electricity, gas or water

company direct. Use the telephone number from a recent bill or from your local directory. You may also be able to join your utility provider's password scheme. **"We are the police, we've caught a burglar, we think he's stolen your cash and we need to check your money is safe"** Genuine police officers **never do this**. Don't let them in. Some distraction burglars actually break in to your home then tell you they're the police "looking for a burglar". If you find anyone already in your home who says they're from the police, they won't be. **Call the real police on 999 straight away**.

Easter Monday 1^{st} . April dawned with no improvement in the weather. Although the sun was bright the North-east strong gusting wind pegged the maximum temperature down to 5.5°C. With the exception of 2 days when the wind was from the South west and hit a max. 20.25°C (both days) the day and night temperatures were below the April average. Strong gusty winds were recorded on 8 days. Snow was recorded on Wed. 3^{rd} and rain on another 10 days. Total rainfall was 32.893mm (1.295in.) some 4.78% below the monthly average.
