SELLINDGE VILLAGE HALL GETS A BUS STOP

A new bus stop has been installed in the Village, located at the Village Hall, (it already appears on Goggle Earth). Having the bus stop here will make it a lot easier for people who catch the bus to attend the Surgery, or visit the Pop In. A few years ago, a resident of the Village informed the Parish Council that there should be a bus stop within a certain distance of a medical centre. This led to a lot of correspondence between the Parish Council and the Bus Company and KCC Highways. Last year bus drivers were told they could stop if asked, but this did not really work. Earlier this year the Parish Council asked the resident, if he could arrange a petition, (the Parish Council cannot arrange petitions itself) which worked and during September the new bus stop was installed.

Your Parish Council met for an Ordinary Meeting on September 10th in the Durling Hall.

At the Parish Council meeting in August, a member of the public suggested that the two seats at the junction of Swan Lane and A20 by the bus shelter should be removed and replaced by a wooden seat to match the bus shelter and the new notice board. Your Parish Council has considered this and agreed in principle with the idea; once further details have been obtained this will be back on the agenda for further debate. Councillors further agreed that the blue and white metal seat will be moved and replaced by the new bus stop outside the village hall.

Jenny Hollingsbee gave her normal informative report to Council Members, she explained that Shepway district Council and the Kent County Council are still required to make further cuts in their respective budgets.

The District Council no longer sends paper copies of planning applications, so if members of the public wish to see what is being debated, your Parish Council has to print each set of plans from the website. This is very time consuming and not very environmentally friendly. Your Council is now the proud owner of a projector which was kindly arranged by Jim Bryant before he resigned from the Council. At the meeting the planning application comments were projected onto the wall for the first time. Teething problems did occur, but Nigel soon got that sorted out. The Comments were about Bernhurst and Otterpool Quarry, these comments can be viewed on the Parish Council website or come to the Parish Council office, where they can also be viewed.

Also discussed with the public was a presentation with SDC, PC and Taylor Wimpey who are expecting to put in an application for the development of the land opposite the Co-Op and between the A20 and the motorway if not before Christmas then soon after. There will be a public meeting arranged by Taylor Wimpey to get input from residents on their proposals. With regards to Otterpool Quarry, there have been no further comments from Countrystyle. The County Council are considering whether or not they need further information, before taking the applications for the 3 conditions forward. Stan Bull was elected Chairman now that Jim has resigned. Also your Councillors agreed that this position would be reviewed in December.

Your Council agreed to proceed with the housing survey; this is important due to the proposed development that is to be taking place in the future. The next meeting of the Parish Council is on Tuesday October.8th at 7.30pm

During the short time he has been on the Council, he has been seen almost every morning walking round the Village, whilst also carrying out a range of physical tasks on our behalf without any cost. Many thanks for all his work. I wish, Stan Bull, who has been elected Chairman until the next Annual Meeting of the Council, every success.

On planning issues, although I am no longer a member of the Development Control Committee, I can still deal with issues in my Ward and if necessary call then in for discussion at the Committee. I continue to visit many sites and talk to all local residents on planning matters, whether they are making the application or have concerns about them. As part of my Communities Portfolio, I have been appointed to the Children's Organisational Group which has replaced the Children's Trust Board. I attended my first meeting of the Health and Wellbeing Board for Shepway and Dover where mental health and emergency treatment were the main focus – it was good to meet representatives from different agencies and I am sure that these contacts will be very helpful to me. As with County, Shepway is looking for ways of saving £2 million in the budget for 2013/14 and this is an exercise that has meant many meetings and debate about different ways of working within the Council and how services can be provided in different ways without being cut – not a mean feat!

Just a brief note on Sellindge Playing Fields (Sports & Social Club) - The Parish Council called public meetings to discuss Sports facilities in the Village and, in October 1967, Sellindge and District Playing Fields Society was formed and registered as a charity. George Walker led this project and on the Club Wall Plaque is the list of founder members which includes John Ward, David Yarnold and John Fifield who led the fundraising, Lt Col Metcalfe who organized a direct appeal and covenants. Pat Low was in charge of the development of the Playing Fields, along with Rev Peter Jaquet, Les Birch and Mike Barnes. Others involved included Joan Ibbotson, Ted Rix, John Batchelor, Roger Sparshatt and Dorothy Hine who run the 200 Club for many years. I was also a founder member – for further information please see the website at www.sellindgeclub.co.uk and the Club Wall Plaque.

SELLINDGE MASTERPLAN UPDATE

On Monday September 23rd a meeting hosted by TaylorWimpey was held in the Durling Hall, various people from the Village were invited, the Chairpersons of the Parish Council, Parish Council Planning Group, Sellindge and District Residents Association, Village Hall, Sports and Social Club, there were also Doctors from the Sellindge Surgery, the Head Teacher of Sellindge Primary School, a person from KCC Education, a person from KCC Highways, a person from Stagecoach buses, both our District Councillors, three members from Shepway Planning department. TaylorWimpey are the developers that will be building the development agreed at the Sellindge Future consultation that was held in 2010. This is the start of another round of consultation. Although this first meeting was an invite only meeting, their will be a full public exhibition where the public can ask questions and leave feedback. FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Member for Elham Valley, KCC – 01303 670 561 The latest news I have about Otterpool Quarry is that Countrystyle has been asked for more information in response to questions raised during the public consultation on the conditions they must fulfil. This is likely to be a very long process and I will share information as it becomes available.

At County Hall I am working on our budget proposals for 2014/15. Once again we face having to make major savings -£262 million over the next three years. As we have already saved roughly that amount over the last three years and frozen council tax without much noticeable change to our frontline services you might think we can easily do it again. However, it gets increasingly difficult to make such large savings and our major effort now is in trying to reduce demand for social services. You may have heard about the Troubled Families project; it's a nationwide attempt to turn round the lives of families who are failing and in the process causing disruption to their own lives and those of their neighbours as well as costing a fortune in public services. Typically the adults in the family will be out of work, the children truanting from school and they may also be in trouble with the police. Rather than see multiple people from different public agencies they get one 'family champion' who works with them to get them back to work/school and break the cycle of bad behaviour. There have been some promising early results and this should help reduce our costs particularly for children who need to be taken into care as well as improving life for everyone.

We are also making savings at our call centre and from 01 October the main contact number at Kent County Council will be 03000 414 141. You will continue to pay just a local charge and it will be cheaper to use than the former number if you are using a mobile phone. You can use this number for all departments although there are also some direct numbers such as 03000 418 181 for Highways and 03000 416 262 for the Blue Badge scheme. The saving comes from only dealing with calls 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday with only emergency calls dealt with outside these hours. KCC used to deal with all types of business 24 hours a day such as renewal of library books or registration of births but with so many people now using the website rather than phoning this has meant we are providing a full service that relatively few people are using and it makes sense to change the hours as we change the contact numbers. And to finish with some unequivocally good news – Kent's schools have had some truly excellent exam results both at primary school and secondary school. The GCSE results were particularly good; our best ever and significantly ahead of the rest of the country (a 4% increase in the numbers of students reaching the target of five good grades in GCSEs including English and Maths against a national decline of 2% because of a tougher marking regime).

The summer weather looked as if to last as August dawned and 23.5°C was recorded at 9.0a.m., by mid –day the temperature had risen to 31.25°C (88.25°F). This was promptly followed by a thunder –storm and rain on Friday 2nd, but it was a minimal amount compared to other parts of Kent. Temperatures remained in the low to medium 20s for the month. By Friday 23rd and the bank holiday only 11.176mm (0.44in) some 16.24% of an average August rainfall had been recorded. Saturday 24th and it rained all day adding a further 34.798mm (1.37in). Total August rainfall was 45.974mm (1.81in) only 66.78% of the August average. Sunday and Monday of the holiday saw an improvement in the weather with sunshine and little cloud.



In September 1843, Revd. Robert Stephen Hawker asked his congregation at Morwenstow on Cornwall's Atlantic coast to gather together in the chancel of the Church on the first Sunday of the next month and there receive, in the bread of the new corn, that blessed sacrament. So began the modern yearly opportunity to reflect upon the glory of creation, the changing seasons and the cycle of life for which we give praise to God each Harvest Festival. One hundred and seventy years ago communities were totally dependent on one another for their food. Windmills to grind the corn were once numerous in our towns and villages. Local craftsmen and skilled women contributed to the general good of the community when 'home produced' meant skills used in the home or on the farm made those goods. We enjoy the traditional but we live in a changed world where we are dependent on people working in countries great distances away for our everyday needs.

Yet in terms of flying time, the earth seems to have shrunk and our supermarkets are full throughout the year with food that once would have been very seasonal. We take it for granted that supplies will always be available and that the large supermarket warehouses will continue to be restocked from every corner of the globe. We also assume that gas, oil and electricity will be in plentiful supply, providing we are able to pay for it. We have become totally dependent on others. People whom we will never meet, people who hold to a different faith from ours and those of no faith at all. The secular world goes about its business, we receive so many benefits and we often fail to acknowledge the overall presence of God and his goodness in providing for us. Our thankfulness for the harvest of every day will be celebrated at Sellindge Primary School at 9a.m. on Friday 4th October and on Saturday 5th and Sunday 6th at 11a.m. at St. Mary's Parish Church and all will be welcome.
