# **KENT SEARCH and RESCUE**

Search & Rescue with public awareness and fundraising. – You've heard of the RNLI and you've probably heard of Mountain Rescue... You probably haven't heard of Kent Search & Rescue (KSAR). KSAR is part of the nationwide organisation "Lowland Rescue" the national body for Search & Rescue teams in lowland areas of the country.

There are now 33 such teams in the UK and Kent is one of the oldest and busiest.

We provide specially trained search teams, including Search Dogs, Boat & Kayak and Flood Rescue Teams to Kent Police. Find out more at <u>www.ksar.co.uk</u>

Can you spare some time to help the people & communities of Kent ?

Over 10,000 people are reported missing in Kent each year. Approximately 360 of these are classed as 'high risk'. In the most serious of cases, the Police will call for KSAR assistance. In 2013 KSAR were called out 72 times - nearly 1.5x every week. Kent Search & Rescue have over 100 operational members but we now desperately need more Support Members. These "KSAR Champions" help us by raising awareness and raising money. We are often asked to talk about our work or are given the opportunity to raise money at shows but operational requirements mean we cannot attend.

Your Council met on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> April for their normal monthly meeting, and hope that you have enjoyed your Easter break, as by the time this is printed it will have long gone and the children will be back at school.

Some late items were added to the agenda as they had arrived after the agenda had been posted.

Your Council agreed to the 1<sup>st</sup> Scouts group being able to use an area of the New Burial Ground for their Community Badge work. They wish to plant and look after a wild meadow area. Your Council considered this a safe area as there are gates which will prevent the younger ones running out on to the roads. The piece of land had already been earmarked for a small garden to brighten up the area. The youth leaders are very happy with this and have accepted. Also related to the Scouts was their request to use the village sign as their Scout badge. At this moment in time they do not have one. Your Parish Council was very happy to allow this to be used..

Issues raised by the public included the Light Saving Switch Off. If any of the light switch off affects you do report it to KCC Highways department. If you are unable to do this, contact one of your Councillors or Parish Council Clerk. The suggested one way system in Greenfields was debated, and Susan Carey our KCC Councillor has offered to help with the finances if and when it goes ahead. The result of the questionnaire was positive. It is hoped that by making the road one way, the damage to the verges and the difficulty of the bus some-times turning will be alleviated. The second of the two seats has now been purchased and another litter bin has been agreed and ordered by your Council, at the request of the youngsters to go by the seat in Swan Lane.

Your Council has arranged a summer clean up on  $7^{th}$  June, it starts from the village hall at 10.00am. It is a week after the Steam Fair, so any litter left by visitors will be cleared up.

Under correspondence a letter from the highway department about hedges and trees was noted.

# 'If the boundary of your property borders the footway, then please be aware that:

The full width of the footway/pavement must be available for use by pedestrians.

As well, there must be a minimum height clearance over the footway/pavement of 2.1 metres / 7 feet for any vegetation.

# If the boundary of your property borders the carriageway, then please be aware that:

If you have vegetation that overhangs into the road, there must be a minimum height clearance of 5 metres / 16 feet, to accommodate buses and HGV's that may use the road.

If your property is rural, then vegetation should be 0.45 metres / 1'6" feet behind the edge of the road and all signs need to be kept clear of foliage for at least 20 metres.

The next meeting of your Parish Council will be on 13<sup>th</sup> May in the Durling Hall at 7.30pm, this will be the Annual Council Meeting where your new Parish Council Chairman will be elected for the coming year, and also for agreement will be positions for Planning & Finance Committees and representatives on outside bodies. The Annual Parish Meeting (or parish assembly as it is sometimes called) will be held on 27<sup>th</sup> May. There will be refreshments from 7.00pm and Councillors will be about to ask questions. # **BONFIRES**

There have been several cases of people lighting bonfires during the day in the Village. As we now have long light evenings, please light your bonfires in the evening after 6.00pm, this will allow people to hang there washing out during the day. Law - There is no exact law on bonfires, however if someone is regularly having bonfires which is causing a problems to others, you can complain the District Council, if they agree that it is causing problems they can issue an 'Abatement order', this will mean that they have to stop having bonfires and could face a £5,000 fine. Under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 – it is an offence to burn domestic waste, which may well contain plastics etc. Under the Highways Act 1980 – It's an offence to have a bonfire where smoke drifts across roads, if this happens contact Police.

# **BARKING DOGS**

# FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Member for Elham Valley, KCC - 01303 670 561

Just a few weeks ago there seemed a real prospect that Countrystyle's planning permission for the Otterpool Quarry site might lapse because they had not fulfilled a number of the conditions that had to be in place before the three year deadline for their planning permission lapsed. Unfortunately, the legal advice that KCC's planners have taken is that the work done so far by Countrystyle means the company has done enough to ensure that the permission does not lapse. In the meantime the Planning Applications Committee at KCC is expected to receive another report on the conditions Countrystyle has yet to meet on 14 May. There's still much to be done before Countrystyle can start work and the company must also satisfy the Environment Agency.

I am sure most people will by now have heard of the death of Les Birch on 13 April at the age of 95. Les was one of the people who made Sellindge a community and the founding of the Steam Special was just one of the ways he made a difference. His long life meant that he knew the background to many local problems and he had strong views on what needed to be done. He was enormously proud of his daughter Jenny Hollingsbee and her time as Chairman of Shepway District Council. I admired Les and will miss his robust common sense and forthright opinions. Les knew a lot about road maintenance and I hope he would have been pleased that Kent has been allocated a generous £8.6m by the Government to help towards the cost of repairing our storm damaged roads. March weather was a pleasant relief from the past months of constant rain and wind. Total rainfall was 53.91% of the average with 29.718mm (1.17in) recorded. Temperatures were up on average by 2.77°C days and 0.15°C nights. There were only 7 evening or night frosts noted the lowest being -2.5°C. A freak storm on 27<sup>th</sup> in the Folkestone and Hythe area was the most notable weather event, Sellindge had its wettest night of the month with rain hail and sleet.

# SELLINDGE GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION

The Gardeners are feeling very lucky with their speakers so far this year. In April Sue Scrivens came along a told us all about the rise and fall of a beekeeper. Sue became a beekeeper by accident really because there was so much blossom on the trees in their garden in the Spring, but she found it difficult to understand why there were no bees around. She later found out it was the wrong time of the year for the bees to gather the nectar and pollen to make honey - they were still waking up from the winter! Then suddenly she heard of a swarm nearby so with a little help and advice from a latent beekeeper she collected the swarm and so started her own voyage into the world of beekeeping. Sue is a very lively and humorous speaker and she makes everything she speaks about not only very interesting but also fun. None of us realised how many different honey bees there are and what their jobs are in the hive. Honey bees are the smaller bees - not the big fluffy bumble bees. We are in danger of losing all our bees, and we need them so much for all the work they do in keeping us supplied not only with honey but with our staple food. Sue won several national awards for her honey and was doing very well until one sting turned nasty and she became allergic to bee stings, so for a couple or more years she had to give up. She & John (her husband) kept the hives in their garden and now she is back in business as a beekeeper (always carrying an anti allergy pen in her pocket in case!). The members gave Sue & John a hearty round of applause, followed by quite a busy question time. The next meeting of the Gardeners takes place in the Durling Hall on Wednesday 21st May 7 for 7.30 pm.
