

#### THE LOST ANCESTOR

This has been a busy time for your Council; there has been the normal Parish Council Meeting and the preparation for the event on Saturday last week.

There was the usual list of items, Minutes of the last meeting to agree, any matters arising etc., although the headings are the same, some of the content is different.

Planning is the normal area where there is most interest and many of you will be wondering what is happening at the Otterpool Quarry site, but to date there has been no updates from either the Planning Department at KCC or the company Countrystyle. Your PC continues to monitor.

The Airport Café now has applied for retrospective permission to allow around 9 extra lorries to park overnight. While this application is outside the Parish of Sellindge, your Councillors are concerned that this will encourage more lorries coming through the village. They also have concerns about safety issues and what would happen if there was a spillage of fuel or whatever the lorry was carrying. Your council have made comments to the District Council and have asked to be called in to the Shepway Planning Committee the PC will be monitoring this as well.

Finally a big thank you to those who attended the exhibition held on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup>, there was around 60 of you who came along, which makes Councillors feel that work to prepare this was appreciated.

The event was for two planning related issues, the first was for the Taylor Wimpey development which some of you may have been aware of having been involved or had visited the event in around 2012.

For those of you who did not live in the village when this project has had a lot of public consultation and was eventually agreed as a Master Plan for Sellindge by Shepway District Council in 2013.

You can view the plans either on the website or by coming to the office. If you are not able to visit on the Tuesday morning or Friday afternoon when the office is open an alternate arrangements can be made.

By the time this is printed and read by you, our third Garage Safari will have taken place, if you supported this event

you're Clerk and Councillors hope it was a success for all 19 of you. If you have not joined make sure you keep a look out for adverts, next year and get involved.

While writing this report it is hard to believe it is nearly October, as the weather is so warm. It would be nice to think it remained so for the next week as I am on holiday, so the office will be managed by your Councillors.

After such a wet August, it has been good to enjoy some sunshine, even though the children are back at School! Along with a lot of local residents, I visited the Exhibition on the Taylor Wimpy Planning Application put on by the Parish Council – comments should be made to SDC either on line or in writing and will be accepted up until the date of the Development Control Meeting.

Children's Play Ground – there are still some issues relating to the roundabout and zig zag slide that need resolving. I asked the Grounds Maintenance Manager at SDC to visit and we now await his advice.

I attended the opening of the Triennial and Payers Park in Folkestone on 30 August. I was very fortunate to go on a tour of some of the Art Pieces with the Lord Lieutenant of Kent, Roger De Haan, the Curator Lewis Biggs and other dignitaries. The theme of the Triennial is "Lookout" and there is a lovely young person's activity guide called 'Lookout with Lenny'. I was invited to Boulogne to preview arrangements for Schools from Shepway to visit the WW1 Exhibition and to take part in workshops with French Schools. French children will then come here to visit and take part in workshops relating to the Triennial.

I attended the funeral of George Bunting, who I first met as the Agent for Albert Costain. He was a long serving and well respected Shepway District Councillor, who spent his whole life serving others. My thoughts are with his family at this time.

#### FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Member for Elham Valley, KCC - 01303 670 561

It is very good news indeed that the threat of a massive 2,057 lorry park being sited on the outskirts of Sellindge has been lifted. Councillors at KCC have agreed to endorse a report which recommended the proposed site just over the Sellindge boundary in Aldington 'is not pursued'. The report said the facility was 'unaffordable and hence undeliverable'. I have been making the case against this lorry park for over six years, however large it would never cope with the traffic generated by a major spell of Operation Stack and would cause considerable environmental damage itself. I do not believe the County Council should be providing overnight lorry parking at all. Our budgets are under great pressure because our funding from central government is reducing and demand for social services is rising. I am therefore opposed to the latest plan by KCC to build a 300 place lorry park at Westenhanger near Junction 11. This would be the first of a network of similarly sized lorry parks across Kent over the next decade or so. If only such a lorry park would indeed resolve the problems of nuisance lorry parking and Operation Stack. It will however be hopelessly inadequate for the scale of the problem and the extra places will be taken by reputable operators whilst those who don't want to pay for parking will continue to park where they will. I have yet to see any plan for enforcement and it seems improbable that Kent Police will have the resources to round up lorries at night and force them into Westenhanger.

We need to keep the lorries on the motorways, off our local roads and encourage transit rather than stopping in Kent. Some of you will be aware that from 07 May 2015 the number of councillors at Shepway is reducing from 46 to 30 and all the ward boundaries are changing. Sellindge will join with Etchinghill, Lyminge, Postling, Stanford, Stelling Minnis and Stowting. The new ward will be called North Downs West and have two councillors. The local Conservatives have selected Jenny Hollingsbee and me as their two candidates for the new ward. I have always enjoyed working with Jenny as a colleague at Shepway and in our respective roles as County and District councillors for Sellindge and I'm delighted we will be running mates.

August was not a good month of summer weather. Average temperatures were down by 1.59°C by day and 0.56°C by night. On Sun.10<sup>th</sup> Tues.12<sup>th</sup> and Fri.29<sup>th</sup> there were strong South west winds. Rain was recorded on 16 days with a total of 95.123mm (3.75in) being 38.7% above month average. After a bright start on Saturday the Bank Holiday weather deteriorated. Monday 25<sup>th</sup> and 24 hours of non-stop rain a total of 38.10mm (1.50in) the wettest day since the Saturday of August Bank Holiday 2013.

We see the 73,000 gates Love ones names proudly displayed From 1914 to today


