

Your Parish Council met on 14th October. It was quite a busy meeting, with lots of updates on various items. Susan Carey gave an update on the current situation with regards to KCC finance, but I am sure she will be putting in a report of her own.

Shepway District Council has notified the Parish Council of planning applications they have made decisions on; these are Crestview, A certificate for lawfulness as using the garage for living accommodation was considered lawful.

Meadow Bank – to erect a two storey dwelling this was withdrawn,

11 The Cedars has been given permission to carry out some tree works.

The airport café retrospective application for extra HGV parking was discussed, with the report with further comments to the District Council being placed on the PC website. Your Council is concerned that no detailed plans for drainage are in place, nor how to deal with an emergency of any kind should it occur. It has also been noted that even if the extra 9 places are allowed the number that regularly park there are over and above that number already.

Further comments have been made on the Taylor Wimpey Development and these will also be placed on the website.

The Clerk gave an update on the current position of the Neighbourhood Plan. The PC are now waiting to hear from Mr Boot who has been leading the project, he is now developing the questionnaire that will be sent out to everyone. It is anticipated that an information sheet will be sent out shortly to all homes with much more detail.

If you have the internet please ensure you log on to the KCC website and down load the consultation document on **COMMUNITY WARDENS** and the way in which the County Council are looking at reducing the number of wardens from 79 to 40. Council Members feel that Sue Covus does a very good job and we don't want to lose her. One of the suggestions that have been put forward by KCC is that adjoining Parishes could work together and pay to keep the Warden in their villages. This needs much more investigation and would put up the precept for the coming year. If you have any thoughts on this, as Clerk, I would ask that you contact the PC office or one of the Councillors with any comments. If you do not have the internet or would like to have a paper copy of the questionnaire you can obtain one from the PC Office or contact any Councillor.

A Public Access Defibrillator (or PAD) was debated and it was agreed that the purchase of at least one should be purchased. Money would need to be raised to help towards the purchase, and the cost of installation. The amount would be about £1,000 each. During this debate S Carey offered the PC the opportunity to have a second hand one from a company she knows who are disposing of some, however the cost of installation still needs to be raised.

Your Council would like to thank all of those who come in for their dog poo bags, but request that

- a) They are not hung on the branches of the trees and hedgerows there are enough bins around the village and
- b) Please **do not** use plastic carrier bags they are not designed for disposing of this type of matter and cause odours making it unpleasant for people walking past the bins.

The next PC meeting will be on November 11th, in the Durling Hall at 7.30pm.

FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Member for Elham Valley, KCC – 01303 670 561

On 14 October I attended Sellindge Parish Council Meeting and answered questions about Kent County Council's budget proposals for 2015/16. There's currently a public consultation on these and you have until 28 November to let us have your views. The consultation is online at www.kent.gov.uk/budget or you can contact me if you don't have access to the internet. As well as details of the budget you will find a question about whether you are prepared to support an increase in council tax of just under 2% to help bridge the budget gap (it's a 20% rise if you don't want any savings). There is also a questionnaire which asks you to consider what £1,000 buys in terms of public services and asks you to choose from a list of what is most important to you and what is least important. The options keep changing so your preferences can be ranked. These responses will help us decide where we make our savings. Another consultation underway is on our Community Warden scheme which was introduced in 2002 to help fill the gap left by the Police in rural areas. KCC can no longer afford to fund this and the proposal is to reduce numbers and change the way the Community Wardens are deployed. Communities are also being asked if they wish to fund their own dedicated warden through their parish precept www.kent.gov.uk/communitywardenconsultation. People often ask why when the economy both nationally and in Kent is doing so much better we still need to make savings at KCC. KCC has already made savings of £269m over the last three years and next year we must make a further £93m which is around 10% of our budget (once the protected education spending is passed to the schools). Savings still need to be made as the nation is continuing to spend more on public services than it receives in taxes. This gap is the deficit and whilst the deficit has been halved since 2010 until it is eliminated we as a nation are still adding to our enormous national debt. At the end of August 2014 the national debt was £1,432 billion. Whoever is in Government from next May will face this problem which is why we expect at least three more years of reducing funds. If this all sounds horribly gloomy I want to stress that KCC will still be doing its core work but increasingly we will have to target our spending where it will do the most good. So do please respond to the budget consultation and let us know where you want the money spent.


