**SELLINDGE DEVELOPMENT** – The Taylor Wimpy development of 250 homes has approved by Shepway District Councils Planning Development Control Committee, this included full planning permission for 50 homes, the village green and a 40 space car park extension to the village hall car. There are 10 affordable homes in this phase, which consist of 2 x 1 bedroom apartments, 6 x 2 bedroom homes and 2 x 3 bedroom houses. To be eligible for one of these homes, you will need to be registered on the Shepway District Council Housing List, and select Sellindge as your first choice. Work should start on phase 1 of the development soon.

Your Parish Council met in January, due to the colds and flu viruses that were going around just after Christmas, some Councillors were missing. Let's hope the weather improves soon so that they and everyone else who has been suffering will feel better.

The normal agenda headings were listed.

Matters Arising included an update about Stone Hill. There are still pot holes to be repaired on this road, but due to the road needing to be closed while the works are carried out, road closures have to be advertised before work can start. As your Clerk I have been informed that the (KCC Highways) will let us know as soon as this is arranged. Also on Stone Hill some of you may have been affected by the lorry that while trying to turn road, got stuck and had to be rescued. Some work has been done to repair the verge, but the ground needs to dry out a bit more before any further work can be completed.

The Path outside the Village Hall has been waiting to be completed for a while now. Your PC purchased the materials a while ago and it had been hoped that volunteers would help lay it. As no-one came forward your Council obtained a quote and after a debate it was agreed that this should go ahead. The cost will be around £1,500. After the meeting, our Ward Councillor contacted the Chairman and has agreed that she will make a contribution, and may even pay the full amount. Your Parish Council is very grateful for this.

The application for the Taylor Wimpey development was considered at the Shepway District Council Development Control Committee and some of your Councillors attended the meeting. As the Clerk and Proper Officer, I was tasked with addressing the members of the Committee. The Shepway Councillors then debated the application before a vote took place. One of the often repeated comments was how well the developer had worked with the Parish Council and residents of the village. The Vote was unanimous in favour of the development. The next step is to hear how the project will be taken forward. Taylor Wimpey and their agent have said they will be working closely with Shepway and the Village to ensure that there is as little disruption as possible during the building works. Your Council will be keeping you up to date when further information comes in.

Various letters were received and Sellindge has been invited to attend the working group meetings in Ashford in relation to the new M20 J10a motorway junction.

The Chairman will be attending a Civic Service in Rochester Cathedral, this is a service that is held annually to acknowledge the work undertaken by Parish Councils and other voluntary organisations in Kent.

Also there was an invitation for people who been involved with Speed Watch to attend a days conference in Maidstone. As your Clerk I will be finding out if any of our 'speedwatchers' would like to attend.

Your next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> February, in the Durling Hall. Your Council do appreciate residents coming along, so put this date in your diary.



### NEW FOOTWAY

Work to re – new the footway between Sellindge and Smeeth crossroads has now started. This will make walking to Ashford a lot safer, it is

surprising how many people do. The work has been ongoing now for 2 weeks, and will take quite a few weeks to complete.

There is no doubt that the situation regarding Lorry Parking in and around the Village is increasing. Lorries parking opposite the School and opposite the Co-op, particularly during the day is totally unacceptable. They also park in every available space cutting up the grass and creating a "mud pond". This is an issue I bring up at every meeting possible and I am pleased to report that Shepway District Council have now agreed to investigate the possibility of "clamping" lorries. (Ashford have started to do this.) Watch this space!

At a Shepway Cabinet Meeting on 21 January, the Draft 'Shepway Places and Policies Local Plan' is due to be considered. The document represents an excellent opportunity for the general public and key stakeholders to engage with the Council on a range of key issues and options. Although, a very large document, there are suggested options on Policies which we can all comment on during the consultation which runs from 29 January to 11 March see www.shepway.gov.uk for further information.

I am pleased to report that Shepway's Budget Strategy for 2015 / 2016 includes a 1% reduction on Shepway's share of the Council Tax which is to be welcomed.

As we move to the General / District / Parish Elections on Thursday 7 May, it is important to check that you are on the register. Also if you are likely to be away or unable to get to a polling station you can apply for a postal vote. You will need to complete an application form which requires you to supply your date of birth and signature. Your ballot paper will be sent to you about 10 days before the election. I am sure people will be pleased to learn that as a result of the response to the consultation on the Community Wardens, KCC will be keeping the link between the Wardens and their present areas, which in our case means Sue Covus who covers Lympne and Sellindge.

Another consultation that will be of interest to many is a proposal to set up a charitable trust to run Kent's library services. You can find details on the Kent website, in the libraries themselves and there will be a roadshow calling at Folkestone on 21<sup>st</sup> February, Canterbury on 12<sup>th</sup> March and Hythe 28<sup>th</sup> March. The consultation runs until 8<sup>th</sup> April. Other parts of the UK have seen wholesale closure of their libraries but here in Kent we have nearly 100 and we have made major investments in our main libraries and archive service. If we are to keep our service (and adapt it to suit changing needs) we need an organisation that can apply for grants and other funding that are not available to local government and a charity seems the best way to do this. As ever, your views count so please read the consultation and respond.

By the time you read the newsletter you will have seen KCC's budget proposals which we will be debating on 15 February. Our main government grant has been reduced by £55.7m (about 15%) which is our share of the savings needed to balance the public finances. Together with demographic pressures i.e. more frail elderly needing care, more people with disabilities, more children needing school places, we need to make savings / raise income by £90m. We are therefore proposing a Council Tax increase of just under 2% which will raise about £10m. This equates to £18.96p extra a year (around 36p a week) for a Band C house (Band C the most common rating for a house in Kent). We are planning to make most of our savings from back office costs as we will either outsource many of the services or implement internal plans for at least 25% reduction in costs. We are continuing our transformation programme to deliver services differently and reduce demand for social care. We are also working with the NHS to keep vulnerable elderly people out of hospital and to get them into appropriate care just as soon as they are well enough to leave. Locally I was very pleased to join villagers at the Pop In session at the Village Hall on Christmas Eve to officially 'open' the new ramp which I helped fund with a KCC Member grant. As well as a hand rail at normal height there's a lower one that allows wheelchair users to pull themselves along so they can use the ramp unaided. Another improvement to the hall is small room created between the Main Hall and the Durling Hall which was funded by a grant from the Community Chest fund at Shepway District Council. Sellindge Village Hall is one of the busiest Halls in Kent and those involved in the fundraising and running of it deserve a round of applause. Finally, Jenny Hollingsbee and I are planning to deliver a booklet to homes in Sellindge produced by the Kent

Resilience Forum which has information on what to do / who to contact in an emergency. If you have not received a copy and would like one, please contact me.

#### WEATHER FACTS FOR DECEMBER 2014

The weather in December continued with the unsettled pattern of the preceding months. It was a month of very changeable conditions, with rain one day and sunshine the next. On 7 days high winds up to 49.25mph were recorded, and on some, temperatures were as low as 2 to  $4^{\circ}$ C with others in excess of  $10^{\circ}$ C. Average temperatures were near normal, while rainfall was 5% above average with 80.01mm (3.15in) from 12 days. The total rainfall for 2014 was 1042.54mm (41.045in) which is the  $2^{nd}$  highest record since 2000 which holds the record for Sellindge with 1133.01mm (44.607in). Records are dated from the year 1960.

I would like to make residents aware that we have had some burglaries and attempted break ins, in the local and surrounding areas. These range from sheds, garages and houses, also the Village Hall and Parish Council Office were targeted. Please be aware that if you do come across a crime scene whether in an out building or in your home and there are obvious signs of a break in **DO NOT TOUCH ANYTHING.** This is important as evidence can easily be contaminated and evidence lost and call the police on 101 or 999 if you think somebody could still be present. The normal advice applies, make sure sheds and outbuilding are securely locked. When leaving the house even for a short period shut windows and lock doors. If you are going away for a longer period of time leave a light on, preferably on a timer. These incidents are still fairly rare but you can be targeted.
