

I am pleased to report that Shepway District Council has arranged a "major litter clear up" around J11 and the A20 Newingreen to Sellindge. I have also requested that this includes Otterpool Lane, A20 to Link Park and Stone Street from J11 to Blindhouse Lane, also the top of Swan Lane. Other areas are also being looked at. As previously stated, the Highways Agency is responsible for the motorway and we hope to see action there soon!

I have allocated the last ± 300 of my Ward Budget to the Sellindge Sports & Social club towards the cutting of the hedge on the driveway. I am also hoping that there will be some funding available to tidy-up the entrance and erect new illuminated signs. I have also requested that SDC replace some of the street name signs that have been vandalised and this is likely to be done shortly.

As part of my Health & Wellbeing responsibility, I have been involved in workshops for Children's Services, attended a Shepway Dementia Action Alliance Meeting, a briefing on the new Care Act and Chaired the Shepway District & Parish Council Joint Meeting. My involvement with health has helped me navigate the services available for my mother, aged 95, to try and keep her at home – it has not been easy but I now believe I am becoming a bit of an expert so if anyone needs help in this way, please let me know!

In my Cabinet Community Role, I attended an Awards Evening where the Shepway Community Engagement Team was included on a shortlist of six from over 86 Councils. Although, not winning, this was quite an outstanding achievement and acknowledges our commitment to work with the Community. Shepway, did however, jointly with Dover, win an Award for innovative waste management. Last month I had the opportunity to visit the Folkestone Harbour Arm to see the huge amount of restoration work being carried out. There is still much to do but it should be open to the Public later this year and this will, I am sure, be a major attraction for both local residents and visitors. Finally, just a reminder that the General, District and Parish Elections take place on 7 May and the new North Downs West Ward, covering Sellindge, Stowting, Monks Horton, Elmsted, Bodsham, Stelling Minnis, parts of Rhodes Minnis, Lyminge, Etchinghill, Postling, Stanford and Westenhanger comes into effect. Shepway are running a campaign - Say 'I can' by registering to vote. If you are not registered you cannot vote. If you cannot vote you have no say. February was a month of very mixed weather. For the first week there were strong gusty winds from the North East. On the 3rd and 5th there were light snow showers which soon melted, and 10 other days with rain. The total rainfall of 67.056mm (2-64in) was only 2.32% above average for February. Throughout the month many nights were clear and moonlit. There were 9 frosts recorded and average temps were down but the sunshine hours were above normal.

Every year each Kent County Councillor is able to allocate a number of grants towards projects to support the community and my final grant of this financial year was to 1st Sellindge Guides who wanted a new flag for their troop. I'm always pleased to see the young people from our district involved in the Scouts, Guides and Cadet Groups and we should all be grateful to the volunteers who make these activities possible.

Other volunteers who deserve thanking are the Speedwatch volunteers who will be out again as the days gets longer and showing motorists that we care about the speeding. The regular litterpicks of the village also make a difference and those who run the Sports Club and the Village Hall and the many clubs that meet there make Sellindge a community worth living in. But there's one set of volunteers I want to particularly thank as their four year term of office is coming to an end – your Parish Councillors. Many of them do far, far more than just turn up to a monthly meeting and their work on your behalf deserves acknowledgement and thanks. It's both thank you and farewell to Councillor Colin Minister as he is moving to live nearer his family. He has done sterling service in both reporting potholes and other problems with the roads and footpaths and making sure the repairs are done as promised. Since I last wrote, Stop 24, the service station and lorry park at Junction 11 has received permission from the District Council to expand the lorry park by 60 places. Plans for larger lorry parks are being worked on but the County Council and District Council are in disagreement about the best way forward. I shall report on this as matters develop. Finally I wanted to alert you to changes coming with the Care Act. At present care costs are uncapped for those with assets of more than £23,250 (and that includes the value of your home) but from April 2016 the care element of costs will be capped at £72,000. Assessments of need can be made from April this year i.e. now, and you can find out more on www.kent.gov.uk (search for 'Care Act') or ring 03000 41 61 61. Other changes under the Care Act will be less noticeable in Kent as the standards being set for the whole of England are broadly in line with those already offered. KCC is one of a small minority of councils which offer help when needs are assessed as 'moderate' whereas most other councils only do so for 'critical' or 'substantial'. Another part of the Care Act allows people to have their care cost payment deferred until after death; this has long been an option in Kent but again the Care Act makes this a right rather than at the discretion of your council.

As well as setting national standards, the Care Act introduces more support for carers and independent advocacy for the most vulnerable. KCC expects many more people will be eligible for help with care costs once the Care Act comes fully into effect. The details of the changes are still being worked out as it is a very major change intended to benefit many people. I'll be reporting on the changes as they are finalised but the first change starts now with the right to an assessment.

Ever since it started in 1963, with William Hartnell, I have been a fan of the television programme Doctor Who. I often thought how exciting it would be to have my own Tardis, a time machine that could travel through time and space. Where would we go? What significant event in world history would you like to have witnessed? Perhaps a famous battle or some other historical event?

Then I had a thought; suppose that we could go back in the Tardis to a certain garden on that first Easter morning. We could be there when Mary and the two disciples arrived at the tomb to find that the stone at the entrance had been moved and that the tomb was empty. To see the look on their faces when they thought that the body of Christ had been stolen and to feel the excitement and anticipation with the realisation that Christ had risen. Well it's easy for us because we know the story but how do you think that Mary and the Disciples felt when they arrive at the tomb. Finally the other disciple who reached the tomb first also went inside. He saw and believed. (John Chapter 20 verse 8) In the next 40 days the risen Christ made a number of appearances to His disciples and followers; in the upper room, on the road to Emmaus, by the sea of Tiberias etc. To be present at that first Easter would be life changing experience for many but as Christ said to Thomas after he had seen Christ and felt the wounds in His side:
