

The Parish Council met on July 13th 5 Parish Councillors, 7 members of public and the KCC Ward Councillor. The Chairman and the Clerk had gone to a Development Control Committee meeting at Shepway. Councillor N Fursdon was acting Clerk for the meeting and Councillor J Bryant was elected as Chairman for the meeting. Two villagers had expressed an interest to become Parish Councillors by co-option, which the Parish Council agreed and J Tritton of Greenfields and T Osborne of Stone Hill were duly co-opted onto the Parish Council.

There were two planning applications considered, the application for Syukur, Barrow Hill, was supported by the Parish Council whereas the application for Dolly Plum Cottage, Southenay Lane was objected to.

The Parish Council agreed to move the bus stop from opposite the Chestnuts to opposite the Dukes Head.

The Parish Council have also agreed to pursue the purchase of the ground at Meadow Grove.

Operation Stack has been top of our list over the last few weeks with local residents rightly complaining about the time it takes for travelling to and from work. The problems we have with lorries parking on verges and in the laybys also increase during Operation Stack and damage done in seconds by heavy vehicles can do irreparable damage. Shepway has, and continues to make, representations to our MP and to the Government. Meetings have taken place at the House of Commons and with other agencies and the Leader has written to the Minister, yet again putting our concerns to him. Unfortunately, it seems that the French can hold us to ransom and to exacerbate the situation there is the migrant issue. However, it does appear that National Government is seriously considering these issues (at last). Jenny took photographs at J11 when it was gridlocked on so many occasions, and on one particular occasion when the Highways Agency closed the slip-road but were not directing traffic in any other direction, she contacted the Police and informed distraught lorry and car drivers what she had done!! The Police soon arrived!

The retrospective Planning Application for additional lorry parking and facilities at the Airport Café in Sellindge was deferred – Jenny voted against deferral as this has been hanging over the area for some time. Also KCC Highways have received funding from the Nickolls Quarry Development for the Newingreen Junction and confirmed at the meeting that this would be completed by the end of the calendar year. Jenny also asked for a re-appraisal in the light of traffic increase since the original application. This meeting was the same night (14 July) as Sellindge Parish Council which Susan attended and answered questions about Operation Stack and Broadband Access.

The Sellindge School Primary School Summer Fayre was well attended and Jenny (at the last minute) organised 'Cinderella' to officially open it. Congratulations to all involved for a lovely afternoon. She also attended the Governors' Meeting at the School and would like to thank all the staff for the hard work this year with our children. We are very fortunate to have such a caring and good School. Jenny was also delighted to be invited to St Marys Sellindge for the blessing of the Rainbow, Brownies & Guide Flags which were funded by both of us. The Service was run by the young people – well done.

Jenny spent three days at the Local Government Conference in Harrogate where the Keynote speakers were Jeremy Hunt and Greg Clark. Jeremy Hunt pointed out that large sums of money could be saved in the Health Service if people turned up for appointments, there was a reduction in wastage of medicines, avoiding A & E for minor injuries and taking more responsibility for our own health. Greg Clark's overall message was devolution and invited all corners of the Country to rise to the challenge.

June was not an ideal summer month. Although sunshine hours were up, normal temperatures were held down by North-easterly winds at times. Rainfall for the month was only 57.85% of average with 28.076mm (1.105in) being recorded. Both day and night temperatures were marginally down on average. Odd days before the last week had near normal readings and the final week had the highest readings when the temperature on Tuesday 30th reached 28.0°C (82.4°F).

July has been made a miserable month for many people by Operation Stack. As I write it is unclear just how much longer the disruption will last and there can be no doubt of the damage being done to our economy and people's lives. Kent Police decide when to implement Operation Stack and the costs of policing it are met by Kent taxpayers. Highways England (formerly the Highways Agency) are involved as are the Kent Fire and Rescue Service and Kent County Council. KCC distributed food and water to drivers who had been stranded for over eight hours in the queuing traffic and it was the first time ever that both the coast bound and London bound lanes of the M20 were used to park over 5,000 lorries. It is obvious that a large lorry park would not 'solve' Operation Stack or even a series of them as the volume of traffic is too large. And whilst we must deal with the problems caused by Operation Stack it is imperative that security and industrial relation problems in France be addressed so that Operation Stack is only seen in bad weather or other unavoidable emergencies. This is not a Kent problem but a national and international one and we need Highways England and the Government to recognise this.

A solution must surely involve a system where HGVs are only allowed to enter Kent when called forward for their crossing. Electronic ticketing, text messaging and apps could provide the means to deliver this. KCC are also calling for an early decision by government on the building of a new Lower Thames crossing. Combined with upgrading of the M2/A2 this would do much to relieve the M20 which presently takes around 80% of the cross Channel traffic. KCC is also facing the problem of sharply increased numbers of Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children. We had about 200 UASC in our care last year but in one week alone this month 64 arrived and the numbers show no sign of reducing. The problem of human trafficking also needs tackling by governments as Kent alone cannot be expected to care for such a large number of very needy children and we have called on the government to at least disperse them more evenly across the country to relieve the burden on Kent's schools, health service and social services. Against this background, the budget on 08 July seems almost a side show but it did confirm that local government will continue to bear the heaviest load in helping government reduce the deficit and we can expect our level of grant funding to continue to reduce. We are working on plans on how to bridge our budget gap for next year and it gets harder every year.

As I've previously reported, the superfast broadband extension project at a cost of £11.2m will be going ahead despite the financial challenges. It was expected that the areas covered would be on the KCC website by the end of June but the KCC officers have given BT's plans a very thorough review and asked for lots of changes to maximise the number of households that will be covered. BT have to run these changes through their systems and the final programme should be available to see on the KCC website at the end of September. This will not delay the work which is still planned to start when the present programme finishes at the end of December 2015.

COUNTRY EYE – Helping Keep the Rural Community in Kent Safe

Country Eye Ltd have built a free App for people living and working in the rural community. The app allows users to record and share information on crime, suspicious behaviour and damage in their home community or whilst out and about.

The Crime, Rural Advisory Group (CRAG) has commissioned the design and build of the Country Eye app. Mike Bax, Chairman, explained, "data suggests that the cost of rural crime in Kent stands

at 1.8 million, if you include the additional hidden costs to repair property, replace locks and the time taken out of a working day to address these issues, the cost is considerably higher. CRAG was formed to help combat rural crime and to work with farmers, businesses and residents to find solutions."

The app has been built to help residents and farmers in Kent report information quickly and efficiently. This information is securely stored in a central database and accessed by the voluntary Country Eye team who are fully trained by Kent Police. The team analyse and disseminate the information, then broadcast it to other local app users. Peter Rolington, Chairman of Kent Crimestoppers and member of CRAG will head the team of volunteers, Peter said "Country Eye will be an invaluable tool to inform people living and working in the countryside about incidents that are occurring in their area. Technology has advanced greatly in recent years and has enabled us to develop a digital version of the highly successful Neighbourhood Watch scheme. We will be able to broadcast information directly to users about potential incidents as they happen. The Country Eye app will allow a greater audience to receive information, particularly those living in the most remote parts of the county."

Country Eye has the full backing of Kent Police with information being sent securely to the relevant authorities. Kent Police is committed to responding to concerns in rural communities and to carrying out high visibility patrols. The information collated through the app will give officers a greater understanding of potential problem areas. The app is supported by Kent Police and Crime Commissioner, Safer Kent, National Farmers Union and BTF Partnership. The Country Eye app identifies four different Rural Categories which make up the majority of incidents that occur in the countryside.

Theft: Vehicle, Metal & Cable, Machinery & Plant, Livestock, Outbuilding, Fuel & Oil and Equine.

Farm Crime: Arson, Fly-Tipping, Trespass with and without Firearms, Criminal Damage and Suspicious behaviour with and without vehicles.

Animal/Wildlife Crime: Poaching, Animal Welfare, Endangered Species, Conservation, Hare Coursing, Horse Crime. **Heritage Crime**: Off-roading and Metal Detecting / Night Hawking.

The app has a knowledge section which highlights the key factors for each type of incident above to assist users. Sign up is simple; the system requires a contact number, email address and postcode. The app records and disseminates information using the phones camera and GPS location settings. Recording information is intuitive; users will click the camera icon, take an image, choose from a drop-down the type of crime, whether a crime reference number has been issued, and any other useful information. The location, time and date will be automatically recorded. The app can also use an existing image from the camera's photo library.

The application is not intended for emergency purposes; users should report to; 999 – (crime in progress) 101 – (crime committed) or report to Crimestoppers if they wish to remain anonymous – 0800 555 111 The app can be downloaded from the Apple App Store and Google Play by searching Country Eye.

Dear Friends The Rectory, Mersham.

I have a serious concern to bring up with you, my friends, using the authority of Jesus, our Master. I'll put it as urgently as I can: You must get along with each other. You must learn to be considerate of one another, cultivating a life in common. 1 Corinthians 1:10The Message (MSG)

I came across this reading shortly after a number of us from the Benefice met at Aylesford Priory to talk about the ways in which the six parishes of the Benefice could work together and support each other in the future. It was a good day and some interesting thoughts and ideas emerged.

We are all created as individuals with different personalities, values and hopes but in all aspect of our society and community we have to learn to trust each other, to live in harmony and support for each other. Clearly this is not always possible as recent worldwide events have shown. Locally, however, it must be possible to achieve harmony and mutual support. It is more important than ever that the six parishes of the A 20 Benefice (Brabourne, Mersham, Monks Horton, Sellindge, Smeeth and Stowting) continue to explore ways of working together and supporting each other. But Christian unity always seems to be a bit of a struggle. Maybe it would be easier if we remained in our own local churches where they do things just the way we like it (sometimes). That might please some but churches that are not looking forward and exploring 'new ways of being church' will soon die. That's not what we are called to do. In the Old Testament we hear how God chose the twelve sons of Jacob to head up the twelve tribes of Israel.

The Twelve tribes trudged around the wilderness for Forty Years giving Moses major grief.

After the forty years there was a new leader, Joshua, who made a few changes. All twelve tribes were going to make up the Israelite army and together march on the Promised Land. Each tribe was going to have to live with and help the others. Opposing armies were to see that Israel's strength lay in trusting and supporting each other.

In the New Testament Jesus chose twelve very different disciples, with different backgrounds and personalities, we know that there were tensions and arguments. Jesus at one point sent them out in pairs and he could have kept to that model, but no, Jesus wanted them to keep their individuality but to stay as a team. It would always be the twelve apostles, never 'the six pairs of apostles'. He even told them that they should respect each other, stay humble and wash each other's feet.

In 1 Corinthians we read the words of St Paul who reminds us that Christ's body is made up of many parts and if those parts are not connected the body will not function properly.

We live in a very disjointed, fragmented and apathetic society struggling hard to hold on to its identity in an ever changing world. Some radical groups appear to be more coordinated and supporting each other better than we are able to. Our traditional way of village life is also under threat unless our rural communities can learn to trust each other and work in unity to support each other.

So, now it's up to each and every one of us, to show how we can work together as a community.

Supporting the village, activities and events, but more importantly, support each other in trust and fellowship. It's now up to us!


