

Your Council met on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> August. Chris Mason reported on the one issue that was still outstanding with regards to pots holes and street lighting. If you report any items via the KCC portal, do let Chris know and he will monitor the work and ensure that it is completed, his contact details are on the Information page and the PC website. The Link Park at Plot 60 for a combined Heat & Power renewable energy electric power station with various buildings and a 70 metre chimney stack was debated with members of the public present being allowed to enter the conversation. One of the many issues raised was how difficult is it is to imagine a 70 metre high chimney.

Other issues mentioned was the amount of lorries that would be using the junction at Otterpool Lane, the extra chaos when Operation Stack is on.

After the debate, members agreed that the application should be objected too, that your Council would request that the application be 'called in' and decided at a meeting of the Development Committee and that a request for a dummy mast should be made to allow members of the Council and the public to see how high the chimney would be and how far it would be visible from within the village and surrounding areas.

The application Y15/0585/SH Dolly Plum Cottage Southenay Lane, Application to discharge the Planning Obligation restricting the Occupation of the Property as a Holiday Let only, as entered into on 27<sup>th</sup> September 1996 was refused

It was brought to the notice of everyone that the Policy Surgery that visits the village hall car park did not arrive as was expected. However since the PC meeting it was reported that they arrived on Monday 17<sup>th</sup>. Nigel checks the times on the police website, and it should have come on August 3<sup>rd</sup> but did not, however it did arrive on the next due date of August 17<sup>th</sup>, will check the times for future dates and days and will put the information in the Roundup of the village News in the Kentish Express.

On the agenda was an item called 'Ambition Planning' this was placed on the agenda by the Clerk to enable Councillors to think about projects that could be started and or completed during their 4 year term of office. This has produced some very good ideas and a full report will be presented at the next Parish Council meeting for discussion. Each year when your Councillors are looking at the budget, a request is always made to you, as residents, to put forward ideas for projects, therefore if you feel there is something that your Council is not addressing or that you feel should be looked at then do let me know so that I may mention it in the report.

The full report of the Neighbourhood Plan was considered and it was agreed that J Boot would be asked to follow up the questionnaire with families and younger people in the village.

It was noted that people at the higher end of the age bracket was the largest number or respondents, Councillors were disappointed with this, as it was hoped/expected that the younger people in the village would have ideas to put forward on how they would want to see their village in future years.

During the correspondence a letter was read out explaining that the National Express coach from Ramsgate to London is no longer coming through Sellindge to due Operation Stack, if you have been affected by this can you let me know, as the Clerk I have been asked to write a letter of objection and try to find out what is happening. If there are more people who respond it adds weight to the argument to ensure that it is reinstated.

Some of you may have seen the notice outside the Otterpool Quarry Site. Your Council is liaising with officers at Shepway District Council on this issue. At this time it has been noted that Planning Permission is required to use the site as a lorry park and at the time of writing this report there is no valid application in place.

The next Council meeting is on 8<sup>th</sup> September, and as usual you are always welcome to come along.

Dog Poo Bags – Your Council is still providing these for use free of charge, members consider that this has made a difference to the village.

#### **WEATHER FACTS FOR JULY 2015**

Minimum temp. 5.00°C Fri.31st Mean night temp. 12.81°C Mean day temp. 22.14°C Maximum temp. 34.50°C Wed.1st

July was another month this year with un-settled weather. The high temperature of the last days of June followed on into July with 34.50°C (94.1°F) recorded on Wed.1st. From Thur. 2nd temperatures slowly fell and the average by the end of July was 0.5°C down. Rainfall was very low and by Tues.21st there had only been 17.399mm (0.685in) recorded, 28.54% of average. On the evening of Fri.24<sup>th</sup> the weather from the West arrived with wind and rain and by 9.0 a.m. next morning 37.084mm (1.46in) had been added to the total for the month. This was followed by non-stop rain and wind on Sun.26<sup>th</sup>.with 12.192mm (0.48in).

The total rainfall from 11 days was 64.675mm (2.625in) 9.37% above average.

The ward profiles contain a wide variety of information on demographics, housing, health, the local economy; services and community amenities. Some of the data was specially commissioned by Shepway District Council so it may not be publicly available elsewhere in this format and, depending on how useful people find the information, it is planned to review and expand it. Do please have a look and send us any comments or updates you may have.

We hope to use this information to create a shared understanding across the council and community about each ward which will help us plan services and help other public and voluntary/community groups by for example providing data to support grant applications.

Using the ward profiles as a starting point we are also developing a ward plan and in July we met with representatives from the Parish Councils to see if we could find an overall theme. Those who attended thought it was useful to meet one another and found it interesting to have a conversation about common issues. "Improving the appearance of the ward" was the theme that emerged as the consensus. This would involve creating 'gateways' to the villages, dealing with overgrown public areas and village signs where none exist or require attention. It was agreed that each village would look at what needed to be done within the theme. Jenny and Susan would work this into a bid for funds from Shepway and other potential partners. We would aim to work round all the villages as and when funding was available. Other good ideas were raised at the meeting which could be themes for future projects.

Jenny attended the Celebration and Leavers Assembly at Sellindge Primary School and we both wish all Year 6 good wishes at their new schools.

Finally an update on Operation Stack. We often go years between episodes of Operation Stack and its remarkable how quickly things get back to normal afterwards. However, the disruption in July was so prolonged and had such serious impacts on people's lives and businesses that it is considered an issue of national importance. It has been discussed at COBRA (the name stands for Cabinet Office Briefing Room A) where senior members of the government discuss and decide actions to deal with major emergencies. The Prime Minister himself has been involved in the COBRA meetings on Operation Stack and, whilst this means we have attention on the problem and the prospect of funding, it also means that we are likely to have 'solution' imposed that may be unpalatable. Parking lorries on former airport in Manston is only a short term solution and understandably very unpopular locally. The extension of the existing Stop 24 lorry park at Junction 11 of the M20 (which Shepway has been working on for some time as a way of dealing with overnight lorry parking problems) seems certain to go ahead and could provide over 1,000 extra spaces within 18 months. The Prime Minister has demanded that everyone involved (local authorities, Highways England, Kent Police and the Department for Transport) work 'at pace' and announcements are likely soon.



Have you ever wondered to what sequence the traffic lights under the bridges on the A20 at Sellindge work? A Sellindge resident recently complained that the sensors on the traffic lights only operate at night and that this was causing unnecessary queues of traffic during the day. I asked Kent Highways if this was the case and one of the engineers checked the lights and confirmed that they were working correctly throughout the day and night. However, he added, "The lights are set so when there is no traffic they will rest on a red signal for both approaches. This means that they can react more quickly to a vehicle approaching from either direction. The lights also have sensors in the road to detect traffic. If there is a large enough break in the traffic flow the lights will 'gap out' and change to either the opposing demand or to the all red reversion stage if there are no other demands." My complainant wasn't convinced so if anyone else has any comments on this, let me know so that I can take them up with Kent Highways. I've little to add to the district council report on Operation Stack other than to say the Government has indicated it will meet the costs incurred by KCC such as the food and water handed to those stuck in the queues and the estimated £5.5m in extra costs dealing with the large rise in Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children (we had 605 in our care at the end of July compared to around 200 last year). The new security arrangements at Calais do thankfully seem to have stopped further incursions.

You may have heard of the Kent Invicta Award which recognises residents of Kent who have achieved excellence in their chosen field or who have provided an exceptional service to the county and a winner is chosen annually. Last year it went to 27 year old Lizzy Yarnold following her win of a Gold medal at the Winter Olympics. This year it went to 82 year old Sir Robert Worcester who was born in the USA but has lived in Kent for over forty years and done an amazing amount for our County. Sir Robert has been a leading figure in many good causes such as Protect Kent, the Wildfowl and Wetlands Trust, the Worldwide Fund for Nature and consumer protection. He has restored Allington Castle near Maidstone, served as Chancellor of the University of Kent, a non executive director of the Medway Maritime NHS Trust and actively supported numerous good causes here in Kent. He has been the driving force behind the commemoration of the 800<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Magna Carta which made this year appropriate to acknowledge his achievements. It was my privilege to nominate Sir Robert for the Kent Invicta Award and you can see the presentation and Sir Robert's witty acceptance speech of the KCC website (the webcast for 18 July). If you have a suggestion for who should receive the next Kent Invicta Award, let me know.

Dear Friends The Rectory, Smeeth.

As I write this letter, the crops in the field opposite the Rectory have just been harvested. We watched the ground being prepared and the seeds being sown earlier on this year and during a Family Service, we prayed as the first green shoots began to appear. In the next few days I expect the straw will be baled and the field prepared for whatever crop is coming next.

Over the next few months, the Harvest will be celebrated in all our churches and I expect in many of our schools as well. It is a tradition that is reflected all through the pages of the Bible from the earliest times. It is a reminder of the cycle of life and of the changes in the seasons. It also gives us the opportunity to reflect on the wonder and mystery of life and growth and the way that a pant or a tree can grow and develop from a single tiny seed. Harvest reminds of the abundance of food available in our modern world, but also brings home the sad fact that many people still go hungry. Growing up and living within an agricultural environment, Jesus had quite a lot to say about food and harvests. He urged his followers to prepare the ground carefully in order to generate firm and lasting faith. He warned against the dangers of greed and in storing up vast quantities of food that could be shared with others rather than go to waste. Although we can find all the variety of food we can ever want or need in our supermarkets all through the year, it is important to take time at this time of the year to give thanks for all that the harvest means to us where we are now. "All good gifts around us are sent from heaven above, so thank the Lord for all His love."

The Bishop has granted our priest, Richard, two months sabbatical leave, during which he hopes to undertake some research into the management of multi-parish benefices. He will be taking this during September and October and will not, in consequence be undertaking clerical duties during that time. Services will continue as usual. 
