


The Parish Council met on Tuesday October 13th. As the Parish Clerk was unable to be present, Councillor Fursdon was acting Clerk.

Councillor Mason updated the Council on Highways issue – Blocked drains and gully's in Moorstock have now been cleared, but there is still a root problem, so more work will be done – Street light and pothole in Swan Lane fixed, but still waiting for the light in coopers Lane and the gully in Swan Lane. Anyone wishing Councillor Mason to log any Highways issues, his contact details are in the information page, and the Parish Council website.

District Councillor Hollingsbee arrived from a prior to meeting, see the District Councillor report for details.

The Bucknell Trust Land – The Parish Council had received a speculative plan for housing, the Bucknell Trust land is behind the Co - Op. The developer is Quinn Estates. It must be stressed that this is not an application, but speculative and they were informed that there is an Neighbourhood on – going. The plan can be seen in the Parish Council Office. Jenny Hollingsbee @shepway.gov.uk 01303 812 066 <u>susan.carey@shepway.gov.uk</u> 01303 670 561 Most of our work as district councillors goes unnoticed (this not a complaint!) but on 14 October Jenny Hollingsbee was very much the focus of attention when she appeared before the Select Committee of the House of Commons on Transport to talk about the impact of Operation Stack on local residents. The committee also heard from Paul Carter, Leader of KCC, Kent Police, Highways England and Dover District Council. Jenny made the point that residents in Sellindge suffer from HGV traffic and parking all the time not just during Operation Stack. You can watch her on Parliament TV and her evidence is about ten minutes from the start.

On 15 October, Jenny met Andrew Jones MP the Parliamentary Under Secretary of State in the Department for Transport to talk with him in more detail about the plans the Government has for dealing with Stack and related problems. Then on 16 October both Susan and Jenny were with Greg Clark MP, the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government and asked for his support in dealing with lorry parking, creating jobs and building homes in our area.

We are pleased to report that Shepway's planners have served a Planning Contravention Notice to the person who appears to be developing Otterpool Quarry as a lorry park. To quote from the accompanying letter 'If it is concluded that there has been a breach of planning control and that the change of use would not be likely to be granted planning permission the Council may issue an Enforcement Notice to require a cessation of the unauthorised use of the land.' Jenny attended the Sellindge Primary School Harvest Festival and a full Governors' Meeting. She had a Harvest Festival lunch and attended the Harvest Festival Service at Sellindge Church. Well done to all those involved for the lovely lunch and wonderful display. She also attended the October Parish Council and the monthly Sports & Social Club Meetings. She accompanied East Kent Housing on an inspection of their properties in the Village and was informed by a number of residents that some people are still not picking up behind their dogs and she will be asking the Dog Warden to pay a visit.

FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Member for Elham Valley, KCC -

Someone recently asked why I wrote about Kent County Council rather than Sellindge in the newsletter. I try to do both but often the issues I am dealing with in Sellindge are confidential with an individual and most of my work for you is on Kent wide issues which affect you all as council tax payers. I share a particular responsibility for finance at Kent County Council and for the last few years that's meant finding the savings we need to cope with reduced funding, rising costs and increased demand. Since 2010 we've made £433m of savings and next financial year we need to find another £80m. Every year I tell you how difficult it is to find these savings whilst keeping services going. We invest in new technology, we do more online, we simplify how we do things and we use procurement experts to get us the best deal for what we buy. However, the 'easier' savings have been made and we now face some very difficult choices.

This year our biggest problem is not the reduction of ± 33 m, we expect in our government grant but the increase we know we face in demand for social care from the elderly and other vulnerable people. There's already been a big increase in care costs from people needing double or triple handed care in their homes on discharge from hospital. We've made the case to the government that social care needs to be properly funded so that we can both help keep people out of hospital in the first place and help return them to their homes quickly when they are discharged. Social care already accounts for over 50% of KCC's expenditure and as it grows there's less money for everything else – buses, roads, libraries, recycling centres etc.

Would you support a Council Tax increase to help bridge the budget gap? If you go to <u>www.kent.gov.uk/budget</u> you can make your views known. There's also much more information about what services cost and how they are funded and the opportunity to say which services you want prioritised. Please respond by 24 November.

Thank you to those of you who contacted me about the traffic lights under the bridges on the A20 through Sellindge. I've now had a handful of thoughtful responses which I am taking up with Kent Highways and I will let you all know the outcome.

There's news on the KCC website about the superfast broadband extension project – the name is a bit of a mouthful but what it means is that KCC and the Government are spending $\pounds 10m$ to bring access to superfast broadband to more rural homes. The two-year programme will start in January 2016 and nearly 96% of homes in Kent will have access to superfast broadband when it completes.
