

Your Council met on Tuesday 8th for it March ordinary monthly meeting. The open session produced a variety of issues.

Unfortunately the planning applications were not able to be discussed or commented on as neither Nigel Fursdon, Chairman of the Planning Committee nor the Clerk could down load the plans. It is hoped that this would take place at the Finance & General Purposes Committee later in the month.

It was agreed that the Parish Council would assist with the purchase of birthday Medals for the Queens 90th Birthday. It was also agreed that if there is anyone in the village of Sellindge who is going to be 90 this year they should be presented with a medal as well.

So if you are going to be 90 years of age in 2016 please contact the Parish Council office and let me know. We need your name and address by 30th April.

Do read the article about the Tea Party to celebrate the Queen's Birthday. This will be a free event, but we will need to know how many people will be coming, so during the next edition of the Newsletter there will be a slip to send back with numbers.

Your Council have been notified that we came 2^{nd} in the Bags for Help from Tesco. This is good news as it will help with the programme of works at both burial grounds.

The count for the question 'do you agree with the Parish Council response to the Highways England questionnaire' took place on Monday 21st at 4.00pm, by an independent auditor in the presence of the Parish Clerk and Michael Garrod, the replies were as follows: 38 agreed with the Parish Council response and 36 did not agree with the Parish Council response. Fairly even. Thank you to all those that took the time to vote.

Councillors have been involved with work outside of meetings, these are the things they have carried out:

- Two and half hours each week reading papers
- Around 12 hours a month in the office during opening hours. This enables members of the parish the chance to come and speak/ask questions etc. to Councillors.
- Attending meetings other than the PC meeting;
- The Chairman has assisted the village caretaker with clearing the drains at the entrance to Harringe Lane. This has stopped the flooding.

And last but by no means least, it was with sadness that the Chairman and I attended the funeral of Mr Ken Baxter, who passed away last month. He had been a Parish Councillor and had worked hard for the village.

Councillors would like to send their condolences to the Mrs Baxter and family.

The next ordinary parish council meeting is on Tuesday 12th April, by then we will have put the clocks forward so will be able to enjoy the lighter evenings.

Each year every councillor at Shepway District Council is allocated $\pounds 1,500$ to spend on community projects and as the financial year comes to an end, we thought you would like to see the full list of the projects we've supported.

Susan - £167 for decoration work at Rhodes Minnis Village Hall, £279 for a projection system for Kent (Marine) Cadet Force, £300 towards works to the scout hut at Lyminge, £203 to Sellindge Parish Council for a talking litter bin outside Sellindge school.

Jenny - £417 towards the cost of disabled facility toilet at Evington Hall (Elmsted & Hastingleigh Village Hall), £250 to Age UK Lyminge, £283 to Sellindge Playing Fields for fencing.

Susan and Jenny jointly - £500 for Sellindge School Parents Association for School Benches, £400 for groundwork at Lyminge Bowls Club, £200 towards cost of music at Agincourt Remembered commemoration at Stelling Minnis. The funding round for 2016/17 opens at the end of April.

On quite a different scale, March saw plans for the world's first multi-storey indoor sports park approved by Shepway District Council. Jenny was a member of the Development Control Committee which gave the green light to plans for the park which will have three levels of space for skateboarding, freestyle scootering, a climbing wall, boxing, a shop, café and offices and function space. The park will also include a room for bouldering - a style of rock climbing that does not need ropes. The new centre has been designed on behalf of The Roger De Haan Charitable Trust which is funding the £10 million project. The park will be built on the site of the former bingo hall at the junction of Tontine Street and Dover Road in Folkestone and it is expected to be completed by the next Folkestone Triennial in 2017. We both attended the official opening of the Harbour Arm in Folkestone on 18 March. Some of you may have visited when it opened last summer for 12 weekends. Now it is open permanently (weather permitting) during the day with longer hours at weekends and holiday times (details on folkestoneharbourarm.co.uk). There are more bars, restaurants and cafes than last year, live music at the weekends and rickshaws for those who don't want to promenade. It's a foretaste of how attractive the seafront development will be. Do go and see for yourselves.

You will all be too well aware of the problems caused by overnight lorry parking in our district, particularly here in Sellindge. Shepway District Council introduced restrictions in known hotspots last November and has recently added more locations. Since the ban was introduced there have been 1,116 penalty charge notices issued and over £9,000 in fines collected. As the overwhelming majority of the offending vehicles are from Eastern Europe, foreign bailiffs have been engaged to pursue unpaid fines. The Penalty Charge Notices will keep being issued till the illegal parking stops. The Shepway officers have also asked Highways England if they can take any measures to stop lorries leaving the M20 and coming through the village at night and we await their response.

Jenny has requested that Matthew Balfour, KCC Cabinet Member for Environment and Transport and a Highways England Representative come and see for themselves the state of the A20 through the Village.

She would also like to explain that the Playing Fields was opened by Henry Cooper in 1972 and is run as a Benevolent Society by a Committee of Volunteers. A small membership fee is charged to help with running costs – from time to time grants are received, but there is no regular subsidy from public funds. Residents of Sellindge and surrounding villages are encouraged to become members and / or to get involved in the running of the facilities, so that they are retained as a Community Asset. After a very wet January, February followed with 14 days when rain was recorded, but the rainfall was only 67.82% of average, the total for the month being 44.45mm (1.75in). A prominent feature of the month was strong winds on 11 days or nights gusting to 48.25 mph. Temperatures were slightly above average in spite of sunshine hours being 5 hours below normal. There were 9 frosts recorded.

The formal decision to expand the number of school places at Sellindge Primary School is expected to be taken by Kent County Council in April. The costs of the expansion will be met by a £836,000 payment by the developers of the new housing in the village and the new places will be timed (as far as is possible) to coincide with the occupation of the new homes. My District Council colleague Jenny Hollingsbee tells me that the doctors' surgery in Sellindge will receive extra funding as a result of the increase in population. The new development will also fund a traffic scheme that should make it possible to have a 30mph speed limit along the A20 past the school and the village hall which I know many will welcome. Now all we need is for the development to start and when I have news on this I will let you all know.

I attended Sellindge Parish Council on March 8th and the main complaint was the state of the A20 and the way temporary repairs had failed. February / March is usually the worst time of year for potholes after several months of cold wet weather. Water gets into cracks, freezes and then expands creating potholes. Unfortunately it is also the worst time of year for repairs as tarmac will not cure properly when it is wet and cold. Kent Highways must always fill a dangerous pothole but over the winter period they know they will probably have to refill it. However the potholes along the A20 had reached crater proportions and I have both reported several myself and underlined the urgency with the district manager. Kent Highways have a reduced budget but potholes are their top priority so do please report any you see either on the website <u>www.kent.gov.uk</u> and search for 'highway faults' or by phone on 03000 41 81 81. Please keep a note of the reference number you are given which helps if you need to chase progress. With the weather improving in April (I hope) the repairs will stand a better chance of lasting.

In his budget speech last month the Chancellor announced a £50 million pothole fund for local authorities in England. Kent could use all of this fund and more on our 5,000 miles of road, whatever our share it will be a welcome addition.
