

Your Council met at their normal meeting on 12th, and Nigel kindly started taking the minutes as I was learning how to be a Presiding Officer for the Police and Crime Election in May.

The local resident who had come forward to be co-opted had been unable to attend, but it is hoped that he will be available to attend the Meeting in May.

I will not say anything about Jenny Hollingsbee report, I am sure she will be writing her own report for the News. As you will have seen there is work taking place on the Bridge over the stream at the Ashford end of the village. This is due to the ground having collapsed under the bridge and along the pavement. I had been informed that this would be completed in two weeks, but as you will have noticed this is taking longer due to unexpected problems.

Jenny mentioned in her verbal report that the street lights are to be upgraded. I had the opportunity to speak to the engineer when the inspection was carried out and he informed me that there is more testing to be done and it appears that most of the lights need to be replaced. He also explained that the replacement work could run in to difficulties as the lights are close to the electric cables, which under new regulations it may not be possible to replace them exactly in the same place.

Your Parish council is to send comments to Highways England regarding the proposed junction 10a. As Chris Mason and Nigel Fursdon, stated at the meeting he is unhappy at the traffic information and this will be looked at in detail at the next F&GP meeting.

Now on to things in the future – the Queen's birthday Party on 12TH June in the village hall and car park. As reported in the April Edition of the Newsletter there is to be a Tea Party to celebrate the Queens 90th Birthday. Please can you complete the information on the front page indicating whether or not you will be attending. The Next meeting of the Parish Council is on May 10th and this will be the Annual Council Meeting. (This is where the Chairman are other representatives are elected.)

On the May 24th the Annual Parish Assembly will take place. This will be in our normal leisurely format, where you can enjoy a glass of wine and a small buffet. It is hoped to have Jim Boot attend during the afternoon with his maps of the village and wanting input from residents. Do keep an eye on the notice boards for up to date information. Last month I reported on what was happening about the potholes in general and along the A20 through Sellindge in particular. Also, as reported last month my District Council colleague, Jenny Hollingsbee wrote to Matthew Balfour who is the cabinet member at KCC and responsible for Highways and to Highways England asking them to see the damage on the roads in Sellindge for themselves. Highways England pointed out that the A20 was KCC's responsibility and Matthew Balfour responded "I can assure you that the A20 is inspected on a monthly basis, which is carried out by our Highway Inspectors. Our Highway Stewards also travel along this stretch of the A20 regularly and where defects are identified, orders are raised and the works are completed. Potholes are currently being repaired within the 28 day target and we aim to permanently repair, but on occasions for safety reasons, it may require a temporary fill and we will return to complete a permanent repair as soon as possible. "Let me add to this that the target to deal with anything immediately dangerous is two hours, and in my experience there is a very quick response by to emergencies. I am sure we would all like to see more resurfacing and less potholes. KCC is in the difficult situation of making less money stretch ever further and social care has risen to be over half our spending leaving very little for everything else. The annual highways maintenance programme for 2016/17 includes major patching of Main Road in Sellindge from Moorstock Lane through to Swan Lane and it is hoped to extend this as far as Meadow Grove. One way we are making savings is by installing LED (light emitting diode) bulbs into all our streetlights. They use far less energy, last longer and are less likely to fail. They are also more 'directional' which means they throw more light on the ground and less to the skies which reduces light pollution. The new system will be able to control the lights remotely so we don't have to send an electrician to make adjustments and the system will also report remotely if the light is about to fail or has failed. The cost of the changeover is £40m for the whole of Kent but the expected savings will pay this back within 8 years. Switchover will be made on lights in our district between 29th June and 9th August. Just a reminder that the public consultation on the expansion of Sellindge Primary School runs until 16th May. At present the school takes 15 pupils into each year group which is half a standard class size and the expansion would take it to 30 pupils in each year group. As funding for schools is based on the number of pupils this will give the school a much more secure financial base with the fixed overheads shared across a greater number of pupils. More importantly it will provide the extra places we know we need and I hope the proposal will be widely supported.

FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

One of the most important duties we have as a District Council is deciding where houses can be built. It is hugely controversial as generally people don't welcome new development near them, yet we also know we need new homes. More of us are living longer and more people live on their own, so there are more houses needed even before you take into account new people moving here.

Shepway's Core Strategy Local Plan (Local Plan for short) was last revised in 2013 and sets out how many new homes we believe we will need and where the major new developments will be, as well as our planning policies. It's a great task to bring this all together, go through all the necessary consultations and almost as soon as it is agreed it's time to update it. Last year there was a 'call for sites' where landowners were asked to put forward sites they wanted to develop, so they could be assessed by our officers against national and local policies before we councillors, then you the public have the chance to comment on the proposals. It's a lengthy and meticulous process which has to be right or developers can challenge it and build on sites we think unsuitable.

In our District we have three major developments under way at Martello Lakes (the old Nickolls Quarry site to the West of Hythe), the Folkestone Seafront and the Shorncliffe Garrison site in Folkestone. One big advantage to major sites is that the developers are obliged to provide funding for social housing and infrastructure which the individual or smaller developments don't.

There should be more news on housing announced by the time you receive your newsletter and we will keep you updated on plans and how you can see what's proposed and have your say.

As reported last month Jenny requested Highways England and KCC to come and see for themselves the condition of the A20 through Sellindge. Highways England responded by saying that the A20 was the responsibility of KCC. The response from KCC was "Our Highways team will be carrying out major patching works in June from the junction with Stone Hill, to the junction with Swan Lane and will explore the possibility of extending these works from Swan Lane to Meadow Grove. Potholes are currently being repaired within the 28 day target and we aim to permanently repair, but on occasions for safety reasons, it may require a temporary fill and we will return to complete a permanent repair as soon as possible."

Since our last report Jenny has attended the AGM of the Playing Fields, the Parish Council Meeting, Stowting Arts Festival in Stowting Church and the Patients Participation Group at Sellindge Surgery. She would like to correct the statement from last month that the Doctors Surgery would receive funding from the Taylor Wimpy Development – in fact it is the NHS Estates who receive the monies and **not** the surgery. Apologies for the misunderstanding. She would like to hear from anyone with a youth football team, as youth workers from Boulogne are organising a football tournament to celebrate France's hosting of the European Cup 2016. It will take place in "Chemin Vert", a suburb of Boulogne-sur-Mer which is an area similar to Folkestone Central and East Folkestone. They are keen to invite youth teams from their twinned town Folkestone and the Shepway District to participate in the tournament which will take place on 19th and 20th June. If required, accommodation will be provided along with food.

East Kent College in Folkestone in conjunction with Shepway District Council have arranged **free** Healthy Eating Courses. The weather in March was both wet and windy. Rain was recorded on 13 days with a 10.36% above average total of 60.833mm (2.395in). Winds in excess of high 30s mph were noted on 11 days of the month with the strongest from storm force Katie on the Bank Holiday Sunday night with gusts of wind in excess of 70mph causing the recorder to malfunction. Frost was noted on 7 nights.


