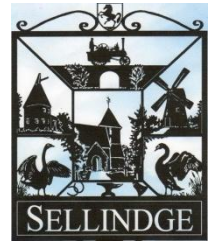

FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

In our report last month we promised more news on housing and by now you will know that on 06 May Shepway District Council announced it was looking at making a bid to the government for a garden town. The broad area identified is around Otterpool Manor Farm and you can see a map showing the area and more information on www.shepway.gov.uk/otterpool-park. Shepway's cabinet (of which we are both members) will be asked to approve the bid at our meeting in June and, if the government agrees, work will start on detailed plans which would see up to 12,000 homes built in stages over the next 20 – 30 years.

The proposal is for a completely new community with homes, jobs, schools, health facilities and all the infrastructure such as roads, sewage, broadband etc. in place from the start. As the Council own a large part of the land we are in a strong position to be able to ensure we get the high standard of design we want and homes for local people at prices or rent they can afford. At least 30% of the land will be parks or publically accessible green space along the lines of Letchworth and Welwyn Garden City.

The District Council bought the 357 acres of farmland at Otterpool Manor Farm last December through a competitive tender process. The land is currently being let as farm business tenancies to provide an income. It was in March that the Chancellor made his call for local authorities to apply for garden settlements and the council leader, David Monk, says this is an 'unmissable opportunity'.

Otterpool Park will not be an extension of either Sellindge or Lympe but a distinct place that provides the new homes and jobs we know we need whilst taking pressure off the surrounding area for development.

There will always be times when plans are being worked on or during commercial negotiations when matters must be in confidence but we will share information as soon as we can. The Shepway website will be updated regularly and briefings have been arranged for the local Parish Councils. We will, as always, raise issues or concerns from local residents with our Cabinet colleagues.

On 23 April, Jenny launched the new facilities at Sellindge Bowls Club and the Chairman commented "I have to say that for a new bowler your first bowl was excellent and would stand up in any match". She attended the Consultation for the expansion of the Primary School, the Parish Council Meeting and the Playing Fields Meeting. She would like to congratulate Jo Wren on being appointed new Headteacher of Sellindge Primary School as from 1 September 2016 and wish her every success.

On overnight lorry parking, Jenny regularly reports the illegal parking and passes on residents' photographs and comments to our Enforcement Department who are actively pursuing the issues. On the Taylor Wimpey site, an update is expected shortly but development is not likely to start until early next year.

I am returning to the theme of potholes as there is some good news to share. The particularly awful ones along the main road through Sellindge village were filled at the end of April though not without a hiccup as the crew working on the job on 27 April were diverted to an even more urgent job and had to return the next day to complete the work in Sellindge. This illustrates the problem Kent Highways face in having to prioritise work across a 5,000 mile network at a time when funding has been squeezed.

Last year 23,983 potholes were repaired in Kent at a cost of £1.3m and 5,281sqm of patching (which will often include pothole repair) was done at a cost of £6.8m. Since December Kent Highways has already filled over 11,000 potholes at a cost of more than £400,000 and done 8,000sqm of patching.

Potholes are a nationwide problem and the government has, in part, recognised this with an extra allocation of grant to local authorities to help deal with them. Our share of this 'pothole pot' is £1.4m and it will be added to the £1.5m already in our budget for 2016/17. The good news is that we ended the financial year with a slight underspend on our overall KCC budget (our 2015/16 net annual budget was £931m) and we are allocating an extra £1.1m to repairing potholes. Meaning £4m in total for a special blitz on potholes this summer in addition to the resurfacing programme. The main roads are inspected daily by Kent Highways but the country lanes are not so if you'd like to see the potholes filled, or crumbling edges repaired please report them to 03000 41 81 81 or use the website www.kent.gov.uk and search for 'highway faults'. The interactive map is particularly good at allowing you to pinpoint locations and upload photographs. You will be able to see what has already been reported and if work is programmed. If you report a problem you will be given a reference number which helps if the work needs chasing. The map also shows which trees belong to Kent Highways and which streetlights and saltbins.

Finally, it looks like we will have to wait until after the EU referendum on 23 June before we hear which site Highways England are recommending to the Secretary of State for the lorry holding area. There are strict rules about what can and can't be announced by all levels of government during an election campaign and civil servants often advise caution to their ministers/council leaders to avoid lengthy and expensive wrangles in court about whether an announcement influenced the election one way or another.

I do of course urge all of you to use your vote on 23 June. If you are already registered to vote you do not need to re-register. If you are not yet on the electoral register **you have until 7th June** to sign up. You can do this online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote and it should take just 5 minutes or contact the District Council on 01303 853497.

St MARYS CHURCH SELLINDGE

Smeeth Rectory June 2016

Dear Friends – I am writing this just after Alex and I returned from a few days break away. As I am sure you are aware, we both love travelling and the opportunities it provides to see different places and meet different people. This time we journeyed to Liverpool, a city we last visited 40 years go. We remembered the sights we saw all those years ago, some of them still there and others swallowed up in re-development. We also were very much aware of the people we stayed with last time and who proudly showed us around the city in which they had lived and worked throughout their lives. My God-mother had been with me at all the significant stages of my own Christian journey – at my Baptism, Confirmation and Ordinations. Her husband had been a pilot on the River Mersey and always had tales to tell of the many ships both small and large that he had safely steered into port.

The Bible is full of accounts of people's travels, from Moses and the ancient people of Israel who spent 40 years in the wilderness on their way to a promised land, through Jonah and his perilous voyage to escape God's call, to Jesus who walked through towns and villages with his disciples. Even after Jesus' death and Resurrection, travelling was still part of the Christian way of life as member of the early church such as Peter and Paul made their way over land and sea to spread their message and establish and encourage new centres of worship and mission.

The accounts, however, are not only about travellers themselves, but also about those who welcome them into their homes and offered them warmth and hospitality. For those who are able to travel, the journeys can be exciting. For those who are not able to do so, a welcome can be made to those travelling through.
