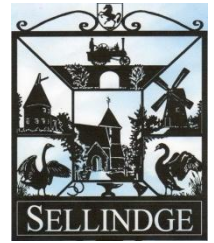

### WHAT A BUSY JUNE

#### OTTERPOOL PARK / STANFORD LORRY HOLDING AREA PROTEST MARCH

It all started on the afternoon of Saturday June 4<sup>th</sup> where villagers from Sellindge, Lympe, Monks Horton and Stanford, went on a Protest March, against the decision of Shepway District Council to express an interest for the Government's Garden Town initiative. If successful then Otterpool Park Garden Town with 12,000 homes could be built on land between Sellindge, Lympe and Stanford.

The Protesters left the Village Hall at around 2pm, and made their way up Barrow Hill towards the Airport Café. At the same time another group of protesters set off from Newingreen towards the Airport Café. Once both Protest Marches reached the Airport Café a rally was held with various speakers addressed the crowd of between 300 and 400 protesters.



#### CELEBRATION OF THE QUEENS 90<sup>th</sup> BIRTHDAY THE KINGS AND QUEENS CAR PARK PARTY

The following Saturday June 11<sup>th</sup>, there was a party atmosphere at the Village Hall, when more than 140 Sellindge residents attended the Kings and Queens Car Park party.

Starting off with a grand tea party on the car park, with live music by the group 'Southern Dawn'.

There was a good entry by the children for the Kings and Queens fancy dress. Three lady residents who all celebrate their 90<sup>th</sup> birthday this year were all given a special coin, celebrating the Queens 90<sup>th</sup> birthday.

All the ladies who helped behind the scenes were also given a coin. In the evening some of the residents returned to the village hall for an American Supper, and enjoyed live music from the group 'Broke by Friday'.



**BUCKNELL TRUST GROUND** - This is the land that borders to the East of the A20 by the motorway bridge and up behind some of Swan Lane. Quinn Estates has booked the Village Hall on Friday July 15<sup>th</sup> from 5pm to 7pm and Saturday July 16<sup>th</sup> from 9am to 11am to give a presentation / consultation on what they propose and to get your views. Given that the Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire showed that no further large development was wanted the Parish Council has decided that on Tuesday July 19<sup>th</sup> between 6pm and 9pm there will be an open evening in the Village Hall for you to give the Parish Council your views on this proposal.

Your Council met on June 14<sup>th</sup>, this was a normal monthly meeting. The 15 minutes of the open session dealt with comments from residents of Sellindge and further afield regarding the Shepway District Council decision to express an interest into the garden Town initiative. Your Councillors are always interested to hear from Sellindge Residents.

### **Planning**

The retrospective application Y16/0068/SH for a 24 hour 73 HGV's park on Otterpool Quarry was brought forward so that the public could make comments and hear from Councillors. The public asked for the comments from Sellindge PC to be read out and the Clerk did this, however it should be noted the report is a very visual report, that unless you could see the actual report some of the items read out would have not made much sense. This full report is now on the Sellindge Parish Council website to read. A hard copy will also be available to view at the Parish Council office.

Of the other three planning applications, two were referred to the planning committee –

- Y16/0572/SH 2 Harringe Court Cottage Harringe Lane Sellindge, erection of detached building
- Y16/0525/SH Land Rear Brooklands Cottage Stone Hill - Erection of barn for rural joinery/workshop, formation of improved vehicular access, creation of hard surface for driveway and yard, and landscaping.

The application Y16/0330/SH The Kestrels Main Road Sellindge– retrospective application for the erection of front and side extension to existing building was supported, with a caveat that no further building should take place as this would lead to over intensification of the site.

There has been concern that the Old Methodist Church is undergoing major work, with no permission and over the last few months the Clerk has been in communication with the Enforcement Officer at Shepway. As it appears that it is not seen as important to Shepway the Clerk was instructed to write formally. So your Council will keep you posted.

### **Finance**

The new computer programme that your Council is using for the accounts now makes the end of year figures fairly quick to finalise and copies of this will be placed on the noticeboards and on the website soon.

### **Other items**

Parish Councils can apply for one of three national awards, these are Foundation Level, Quality and Gold. The Foundation level ensures that the Council are working to the lawful requirements and your Council is applying to the County Association. Once this award has been achieved work can begin to enable your Council to apply for one of the higher awards. The costs to the Council and residents is minimal but shows that Councillors as individuals and the Council as a body are working to the best of their ability and within the lawful guidelines.

At the end of the meeting it was agreed that a date for the Garage Safari would be confirmed and this will be on Sunday September 11<sup>th</sup>. A slip to complete will be added to the August Newsletter if you want to join in.

Since the June Parish Council Meeting, Quinn Estates have been in contact with your Council asking if they could have a presentation in the Village Hall. This is for Quinn Estates to book with the Village Hall. Your Parish Council is aware that this is to take place on **Friday and Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> July.**

Given that the presentation is for development on Bucknell Trust land and the Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire showed that no further large development was wanted your Council has decided that on **Tuesday July 19<sup>th</sup> between 6.00pm and 9.00pm there will be an open evening. This will be held in the Durling Hall at the Village Hall.**

Since the full Council meeting your Council has held a Planning Committee meeting.

The Planning Committee considered the planning applications referred from the full council.

Members have objected to the use of Otterpool Quarry for a lorry park and as mentioned elsewhere.

Y16/0572/SH 2 Harringe Court Cottage Harringe Lane, erection of detached building . This was supported.

Y16/0525/SH Land Rear Brooklands Cottage Stone Hill - Erection of barn for rural joinery/workshop, formation of improved vehicular access, creation of hard surface for driveway and yard, and landscaping. After careful consideration this application was objected too on a number of issues and once this report is completed will be available on the website.

If you do not have access to any computers and would like copies of any document then do contact the Parish Council office where a copy can be provided or you will be given the opportunity to access the document.

Also Finance and General Purposes Committee has taken place. One of the items on the Agenda was to discuss defibrillators. It had been hoped that one or two defibrillators were to be donated to the Parish, but this has not happened so your Chairman has been investigating the purchase of one or two for the village.

Good progress has been made, but further work is needed however, it is expected that all the details can be reported at the next Parish Council meeting.

The next monthly meeting of your Parish Council is on Tuesday July 12<sup>th</sup> at 7.30pm in the Durling Hall.

So do please come along and see what your Council is doing for you.

Most of you will be aware that on 08 June the cabinet at Shepway District Council agreed to make an 'expression of interest' to the Government for a garden town at Otterpool Park which would be a new community sited between Sellindge and Lympe. By the time this newsletter is published we expect the proposal to have passed through the Council's scrutiny process and be with the Government for response.

Jenny was advised by the Council's monitoring officer not to take part in the debate or vote because she owns property in the affected area but Susan was able to speak and went through in some detail the concerns that had been raised with her. She also responded to these and made it clear that she saw the benefits Otterpool Park could bring in helping provide the homes and jobs we need over the long term (30 – 40 years) in a planned way so that infrastructure such as water, roads, schools and medical facilities are there from the start.

Those that oppose homes and jobs at Otterpool Park have expressed themselves very strongly but they are not the only people we have heard from and we are grateful to those who have quietly expressed their support or at least said they'd like to know more.

Jenny who was born and brought up in Sellindge / Stanford and lived all her life locally says:

"I can understand and have a great deal of sympathy with local residents who are totally against this 'expression of interest', however, I have spoken to many people throughout the North Downs West Ward since this announcement and there are a great number who see this as an opportunity to provide a lovely place for our children and grandchildren to choose to live and work, with views to an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, the Romney Marsh and the Coast nearby and upfront infrastructure to support this.

I would encourage people to get involved to influence the 20 / 30 year masterplan of "Otterpool Park". With Shepway District Council in control of a large part of the area, it will enable high quality, well designed and attractive development, and the local community will positively be encouraged to shape plans as they progress.

Susan has a long record of opposing development in the open countryside so would not give her support to this proposal if she didn't wholeheartedly believe in it.

Those of you who use the mobile library service will already be aware of the results of the public consultation about changes to the service (most respondents supported the proposals). Many other Councils have withdrawn this sort of service completely, but KCC has agreed to continue the mobile libraries where there is still demand (a minimum of three visitors per stop). There will now be an annual review of the service pattern and use. Despite keeping all 99 of Kent's libraries open the number of visitors continues its long, slow decline of about 2% fewer visitors each and every year which is in line with library use in the rest of the country. The number of visits per day to libraries in Kent (including mobile libraries) is currently 17,331 (18,488 last year) and daily book issues are 16,503 (16,753 last year). One area where use is rising is in e-books where there are 445 issues a day compared to 321 last year. Now a one-year trial is starting for electronic copies of magazines. Anyone with a Kent library card will be able to log in to the Zinio service and read online or download a selection of magazines to Android, Apple and Kindle Fire devices. Titles include Good Housekeeping, Auto Express, Woman & Home, and Match of the Day, BBC Good Food Magazine, New Scientist and Hello!

Although the Citizens Advice Consumer Service has been about for over ten years I have only recently found out about its work with Kent County Council's Trading Standards team. It provides free, impartial, practical advice to consumers and its advisors are fully trained to give advice on the law. Consumers can contact the Citizens Advice Consumer Service if they want to report rogue traders, scams and unsafe goods.

Each year CACS receives and forwards over 25,000 reports from consumers to KCC Trading Standards. This enables KCC Trading Standards to target their efforts to where they will have the most impact.

Citizens Advice Consumer Service also has an Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) helpdesk. Advisors can explain to consumers how the scheme works and transfer them to one of 25 ADR schemes. Judges generally expect consumers to exhaust all possible solutions to resolve their complaint which now includes using the ADR process before they take the matter to court. ADR will often be cheaper and quicker than court action.

Finally you may also be interested in a new website that Kent County Council has launched to promote public transport at [www.kentconnected.org](http://www.kentconnected.org). It's aimed at commuters but can be used for any journey in Kent. Bus journeys can often be quicker and cheaper than the same journey by car and the journey planner will both show the times and compare costs. The journey planner compares rail, bus, car, cycling and walking showing how much pollution each mode produces and how many calories you burn using the cycling or walking options. It also encourages car sharing (there are an estimated 38 million empty seats in cars on the UK's roads every day) and working from home.

North-east winds in the mid 30's and 40mph were recorded in the 3<sup>rd</sup> week and on the 30<sup>th</sup>, Bank Holiday Monday.

**The Rectory, Mersham**

Olympics and that's before we try and cope with all that's going on in our Churches and in our private lives.

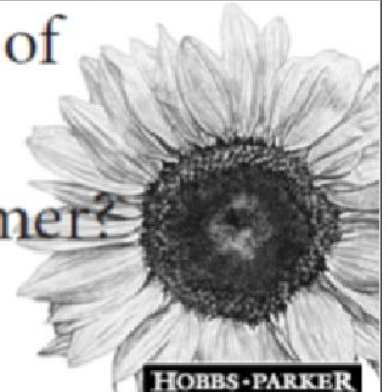
