Your Council met on 12th July for their usual monthly meeting. Items discussed had the normal headings:

Update on Action Sheet – There were more potholes listed on the highways action sheet, and one pothole which had been listed as being repaired and is still outstanding, so this will be highlighted again.

Open Session – There were various issues raised. It should be noted, that if you have the need to raise issues with the Parish Council the office is open on Tuesday mornings and Friday afternoons. Also if you are unable to attend at that those times, appointments to visit the office can be made.

District and KCC Councillors – Both Jenny and Susan attended the meeting and gave detailed reports, as is the normal practice these will be elsewhere in the Newsletter.

Planning – your Council supported two applications Y16/0677/SH and Y16/0679/SH both for tree works on trees with tree preservation orders outside Hillside Villas and The Cedars.

By now you some of you will have seen the proposed development plans, being put forward by Quinn Estates. Your Council had an open evening a week later and so far to date 29 of the information sheets have been returned.

Defibrillators – It is expected that by the time this Newsletter is circulated two defibrillators will have been delivered. It will then be for them to be fixed, one is going on the village hall wall and the other is being placed on the Sports and Social Club wall. Training will be taking place so please look on the notice boards for dates. A big thank you to our local Parish charity the E Sedgewick and Sarah Godfrey Trust for funding the cost of these.

Post Office closure – Your Council was made aware that the Post office is to be closed while refurbishment take place at the Co-op. Once the dates are confirmed your Council will be arranging for transport to other nearby Post Offices for those unable to get to them. Again this information will be made public.

The Next meeting will be on Tuesday 9th August, Durling Hall at 7.30pm. Please note the new website address for Sellindge Parish Council is <u>http://www.sellindge-pc.gov.uk</u> The old website will also be maintained.

FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Elham Valley Ward. <u>susan.carey@kent.gov.uk</u> 01303 670 561 Transport Secretary Patrick McLoughlin (now replaced by Chris Grayling) announced on 06 July that the proposed 3,600 place lorry holding area would be at the Stanford West site. Highways England require no permission from Kent County Council for the works but (as with Shepway) we are pressing them for more information, soft and hard landscaping to reduce the harm and a proper compensation package for those affected.

Turning to the BREXIT vote, the combined County Council area voted 58%-42% in favour of leaving. In Shepway the vote was 62%-38% in favour of leaving on a 75% turnout.

On 24 June, the day after the referendum, we had a prescheduled meeting of the Superannuation Fund Committee which oversees £4.6 billion of investments (valuation 31/03/16) that go towards paying the pensions of Council employees (NB Councillors do not get pensions). It was thought the fund had lost about £250m in value in the fall across the stockmarket that morning but such was the volatility that morning that it bounced back about £100m in a matter of hours. Schroders, one of our major fund managers, was with us for the meeting and reminded everyone that investments for pensions are for the long term and that whilst we might want to review our current strategy in a year's time we should not react to short term turmoil. The pension fund has now more than recovered and stood at £4.76bn at the end of June.

We have also reviewed our cash deposits but again have been advised that current arrangements are fine. Anyone who wants to see where we deposit reserves and other cash we hold can find the various treasury management reports that go to the Government and Audit Committee and to the County Council on the KCC website.

Then there are the grants that we have or hope to have from the EU. We have several projects already running which are EU funded or part funded (we usually have to match fund the amount we receive). At present the UK is still a member of the EU and still paying into the pot so we should still be able to bid for funding. Some EU funded programmes already include countries that are not part of the EU and it will still make sense in areas of training trade and jobs that we continue to work with our European neighbours.

At our most recent County Council meeting on 14 July the question of the border arrangements between the UK and France was raised in the light of the Mayor of Calais' request for the UK frontier controls to be removed from Calais (and presumably the French controls from Folkestone and Dover). These juxtaposed frontier controls were set up by Le Touquet agreement, between the national governments of the UK and France and is not dependent on membership of the EU. The current French Foreign minister has refused the request of Mayor but some of the candidates for the 2017 presidential elections in France have also raised the prospect of withdrawing from the agreement. There has to be a two year notice period and KCC is looking at contingency plans should this happen, we will be working with the Home Office on this.

On 01 July I took part in the Education and Young People's Services Cabinet Committee where we considered the results of the public consultation on the proposal to expand Sellindge Primary School. The school currently has a capacity of 105 places but it was reported it had 116 pupils on roll and even without the new housing the school was not big enough to cope with demand from the village. The plan to extend the school by 105 places funded in part by KCC and by a payment £836,000 and provision of additional land by the developer of the new houses planned for the site opposite the school. Just three written responses to the consultation were received and all were in favour and I too was happy to support the proposal.

FROM YOUR SHEPWAY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

Jenny Hollingsbee and Susan Carey, Ward Councillors for North Downs West, Shepway District Council susan.carey@shepway.gov.uk 01303 670 561 Jenny.hollingsbee@shepway.gov.uk 01303 812 066 Stanford West has been announced as the site chosen for the 3,600 place lorry holding area. Highways England require no planning permission from Shepway District Council to go ahead with the scheme. As we write this newsletter (21 July) no detailed plans have been made available although Highways England have contacted around 60 householders who are expected to be most affected. We believe the Stanford West site is the 'least bad' of the two options that Highways England put forward as it will provide direct access to and from the motorway for the lorries. However, Highways England need to do far more to share their plans and especially the arrangements for landscaping, noise control and above all a far better compensation scheme than the normal blight arrangements. We have made these views known to them both directly and through the Shepway officers.

Some people have asked if the lorry holding area will still go ahead. George Osborne did say that funding for the lorry holding area might be withdrawn if there was a BREXIT vote but he is no longer Chancellor and all indications are that Highways England will proceed with the scheme especially as the response to the public consultation showed a majority of people either strongly in support (44%) or (13%) in support. 29% were strongly opposed, 5% opposed, 3% were neither in support or opposed (the balance of 8% did not answer this question).

There were 1,279 responses to the questionnaire so not everyone in Sellindge and Stanford (around 1,600 residents) can have responded. (We each sent an individual response.) A full breakdown of the responses on gov.uk website. On Otterpool Park we can report that at our last full Council meeting on 20 July the leader of the opposition group, UKIP, welcomed the proposal for a garden town in principle and promised it would be subject to scrutiny. David Monk, Leader of the Council, confirmed that Otterpool Park would precede either as a Government approved Garden Town or through the normal Local Plan process. We too support Otterpool Park because we need homes and jobs and we believe it is better to provide them in a planned way rather than piecemeal a field here or open space there. With Shepway as a major landowner in Otterpool Park we will be able to ensure the infrastructure and design is the highest quality and meets local needs. We would also like to remind people that if Otterpool Park was not going ahead KCC would be building a lorry park on flat open space by Junction 11 near Westenhanger (was authorised autumn 2014). The Expression of Interest that Shepway sent to the Government for a Garden Town at Otterpool should now be available on the Council website. Comments and questions can be sent to otterpool@shepway.gov.uk We both attended the Sellindge Parish Council meeting on 12 July and we have asked the Parish Councillors to look at plans to improve the entrance to the village at Barrow Hill. This would be funded through our Shepway ward plan

which aims to improve the appearance of the district.

Jenny attended a ceremony at the Memorial Arch. Folkestone to mark the 100th anniversary of the Battle of the Somme on 01 July placing a small cross to mark the names of soldiers from our area who fought and died in this battle including Private George Dryland, Station Cottages, Westenhanger, Corporal Frank Rendall and Private William Andrews both of Monks Horton.

Jenny also attended the Celebration and Leavers Assembly at Sellindge Primary School and would like to wish the Headteacher, Helen Baxter a long and happy retirement and thank her for all she has done for the children and Community over the last 10 years.

Jenny is due to see Matthew Scott our new Police and Crime Commissioner on 24 August so if you have any issues you'd like her to raise then do contact her. Matthew is also very happy to hear from people directly (Susan has already spoken to him about speeding, the more of us that do this the further up the Kent Police priority list it will go).

WEATHER FACTS FOR JUNE 2016

The weather in June was not a very welcome start to the summer, both wet and windy and down on sunshine hours. The first 4 days were cloudy with wind from the North-east and rain on Wed.1st. After 2 days of sunshine, on the evening of Tues.7th the wind increased and a storm with strong winds and rain hit Kent. By the morning of the 8th over 50% of a June average rainfall had been recorded. A further 17 days had rain, the total being 104.648mm (4.12in) some 115.7% above a June average. Not a record for Sellindge which is 142.47mm (5.625in) recorded in 2007. Temperatures were 0.71°down on average although nights were 0.78°up.

Dear Friends

The Rectory, Smeeth

On the morning that the result of the Referendum was announced, Alex and I were on holiday in Sicily. Our own personal feelings were of surprise, shock and sadness. We certainly wondered what sort of reaction we would evoke when we went to get our breakfast in the hotel restaurant. We were, however, greeted with the usual 'bongiorno' and asked if we still wanted two Americano coffees. This was in spite of the fact that the previous morning I had caused a certain amount of chaos and confusion by forgetting that the mobile phone in my pocket was still turned to alarm mode and was transmitting loud piercing sounds through the TV system.

That morning now seems a long time ago and a lot has happened since, but it will certainly be one that we will always remember. A great deal of uncertainty may lie ahead as the implications and effects of that decision begin to emerge. Throughout life, we are often faced with situations that may not have been our ideal choice – passing or failing a driving test or exam; getting or not getting a new job; discovering that a close relationship seems to be coming to an end. In so many circumstances we may find ourselves asking where God is in all this and what his will is for us. More often than not we are unable to change the results and have to find our way through the unexpected. This may often be difficult and tiring, but at the same time it can be challenging and offer new opportunities. God is very much a God of surprises, so in a sense it should not come as much of a surprise when initially things do not seem to be going in quite the way we might have hoped.

The day after the Referendum vote, our own Bishop of Dover issued the following statement, to which I hope will can all say Amen :

"This decision has challenged much of our well established political rhetoric and practice. The closeness of the vote reveals strongly held views on the right way forward for our country but now we must begin the vital process of coming together. Whatever our views on Europe, we have a duty to continue to bear with one another in love, to seek to welcome the stranger and care for the refugee whatever our future immigration policies. Let us pray for grace and wisdom for the tasks that lie ahead."
