DEFIBRILLATORS (AED) AT THE SPORTS & SOCIAL CLUB AND THE VILLAGE HALL

Defibrillators, situated at the Sports and Social Club and Village Hall. In the event of cardiac arrest, where a casualty is unresponsive and not breathing, these life saving devices can be accessed by calling 999 or 112 and the ambulance call taker may give you the location and access code to the cabinet. Eight members of the club had training in Basic Life Support on the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED), it was an excellent course and very informative. The defibrillator at the club is on the wall of the new building on the left of the club as approached from the car park and is available for anyone in the village community, but there are a few basic rules that everyone needs to be aware of. If you are alone with the casualty who is unresponsive and not breathing call 999 or 112 for help and give CPR (Short for cardiopulmonary resuscitation). CPR increases

the chances of surviving because it keeps some blood circulating to vital organs such as the brain and the heart itself. It also increases the likelihood of the heart remaining in a 'shockable' rhythm rather than deteriorating to a 'non-shockable' rhythm (referred to in lay terms as a "flat line"). This matters because a cardiac arrest victim is more likely to survive if their heart is in a 'shockable' rhythm from which it may be possible to shock them out of cardiac arrest with a defibrillator. Do not try to reach the defibrillator if you are alone with the casualty, it is more important to carry on with the CPR, only go to get the defibrillator if there are at least three people present, two to carry on with the CPR and one to get the defibrillator. Always call for an ambulance before attempting to use the defibrillator. If appropriate the ambulance service will call the club during opening

hours and if anyone is available they may be able to bring the defibrillator

(The AED at the Village Hall) to you. Defibrillators are very easy to use, there are clear instructions which are repeated, you just have to listen. Along with the defibrillator there is a responder kit containing gloves, scissors (for cutting off clothing from the neck down) a razor to remove any excess hair as the sticky pads must be in contact with the bare skin. Also, there is an additional kit for use with children below the age of 8, this kit contains smaller pads specifically designed to reduce the energy delivered, it is important to use these as they are more appropriate in their therapy delivery than the larger adult pads. We hope that the defibrillator is never needed but we may feel a little safer knowing it is available. Since this article was written a further eight villagers have received training at the Village Hall. The defibrillator at the Village Hall is situated at the Main Entrance to the Main Hall.

Special thanks go to the E.Sedgewick & Sarah Godfrey Trust for funding the AEDs and the Parish Council who funded the training and installation, and will be responsible for the insurance and maintaining of them.

Here is the report from your Council's August Meeting. But a question first, why do the evenings seem to draw in quicker than they draw out, or is this just me?

So another busy meeting and since the Chairman's report stating the defibrillators had arrived, one has already been fitted in the Sports and Social Club. The training of 6 people for each of the two defibrillators has been arranged and it is hoped that at least one other day can be arranged, although, there may be small charge, this has yet to be confirmed one way or another. If you are interested in learning how to use these simple machines with complete peace of mind do contact the Clerk in the Council Office, your name will be added to a list and you will be contacted when further details are available. Do bear in mind though that the training is around three and half hours in length. Both Mrs Carey and Mrs Hollingsbee gave their normal detailed reports and answered resident's questions. Don't forget the Garage safari is on Sunday 11th September so you still have a short while to get your applications to the Parish Council Office. Also for those living on the outer edges of the village you are invited to come to the village hall car park and have a table there for the same cost of £5.00 and all the money raised goes to the Community Fund. Since I have mentioned the Community Fund, remember if you are a small non-profit group and would like to apply for a grant then contact the Clerk at the Council offices for more details.

As always – contrary to popular belief – your Council does listen to and read any comments sent in on any issue within the village, however it must be noted that in a democracy not everyone will agree on the same things. Your Council has to make comments that are lawful and relevant to planning issues, be in a position to have a 'plan B, if required and maintain dialog with other levels of government and a myriad of other organisations, this is the function of Parish Councils in England and Wales.

Your Council had no planning applications to consider, but for those of you present you would have heard mention of the Junction 10a consultation. If you get the chance to have a look at the Highways England website you will see why your Council has concerns over the changes being proposed. It would appear that traffic through Sellindge will increase. If you do visit the site (and yes there are quite a lot of documents to look at) and have any comments that you send to Highways England please can a copy be sent to your Parish Council, your planning committee will be looking at the consultation in more detail.

Sellindge was invited to be a member of the group that meet at Ashford Borough Council on a regular basis, having comments from residents will add weight to your Councils concerns at these meetings.

FROM YOUR SHEPWAY DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

Last month we reported that the Government had given the go ahead for a 3,600 lorry holding area near Stanford but that no details had yet been released. A month later and we now have a 369 page Interim Environmental Impact Assessment, a 15 page consultation document with a map of the site and a programme of public information exhibitions. (Venues and times are given in Susan's KCC report).

We have both held meetings with several residents who have contacted us for help and advice on dealing with Highways England and we are pressing for a better compensation package than the present blight regulations allow. We have also been looking at the air quality issue that many people have raised. Shepway District Council currently has twelve sites across the district where air quality is monitored on a monthly basis for nitrogen dioxide (NO2). An additional site is being installed close to the proposed lorry holding area site. There are no sites in our district where the air quality currently falls below the required national standard but if it did then the district council is both obliged and empowered to take action which could include restricting vehicles that use diesel. We shall be asking Highways England to provide an additional site using equipment that samples the air on an hourly basis.

Briefings on Otterpool Park are continuing and site visits to other garden towns such as Letchworth, Poundbury, Bicester and smaller schemes are being arranged. We are both very willing to meet people individually to discuss the

project and if you'd like to be involved then please contact us. Jenny attended the Sports & Social Club Monthly Meeting and where she was very impressed with a beautiful wall mural of Swans on a lake displayed in the Function Room where the Craft Group meets on a Monday from 1-3pm Janet Gillard, who runs the group, painted the picture in emulsion paint with a little help from Janet Aslett and Pamela Dean and Peter Masters who framed it. It is well worth a visit. Janet now has plans to produce a banner of the other activities at the club. We would like to hear from any village organisations looking for grant support as each Councillor is able to award small grants to help community projects and have in the past supported,



amongst others, the Sports & Social Club, Sellindge School and Sellindge Village Hall.

Last month I reported on some on the BREXIT vote and sought to give some reassurance about its effects on KCC and Kent as a whole. Since then we have had a commitment from Philip Hammond, the Chancellor, that any EU grant funding for schemes that last beyond our date of leaving the EU will be honoured by the Treasury. After this the Government has said it wants to take the opportunity to review priorities and those at KCC who have dealt with the complicated bidding process for EU grants are hoping for a much simpler system.

On the negative side, I have had one long time Sellindge resident of Eastern European background report to me that they had someone tell them that all Polish and Rumanians should be sent home. This was obviously upsetting for the person concerned and our KCC Community wardens have been asked to watch out for such abuse and encourage people to report it to Kent Police.

Jenny Hollingsbee and I attended the Highways England presentation at their Stanford depot on 19 August. Whilst we now have more information about Highways England's plans for the lorry holding area at Stanford West there are still many questions that remain unanswered and the information that is available is concerned with footpaths and landscape and 'driver stress' but there seems little information about the impact on the surrounding households. By the time this newsletter is published, three Highways England exhibitions will have taken place in Sellindge, Folkestone and Postling in August but there are further opportunities to attend exhibitions in September.

Some people were surprised to learn the high level of support for the scheme when Highways England had their first consultation earlier this year with 55% of responses in favour or strongly in favour. If you want to make your views known then please complete the response form (it's only eight pages long) and you have until Friday 23rd September to get this done. Do please report potholes and other problems to Kent Highways either on 03000 41 81 81 or on line at www.kent.gov.uk and search for 'highway faults'. Once the wet and cold weather sets in it is difficult to make a repair that will last and there has been extra money set aside to tackle the roads this summer and I'd like to see our area get the full benefit of this.

After an unsettled period in the first 2 weeks of July the weather became more like summer. Apart from temperatures being in the low twenties, by the 14th there had been 6 days with rain (although minimal). There was no more rain until Thurs.28th and Sat.30th. Total rainfall was only 18.288mm (0.72in. being no more than 30% of a July average and the lowest July since 1999. Sunshine figures were down on average with temperatures near normal. The exception was in the 3rd week with high 20s °C and on Tues.19th a high of 31.75°C (89.15°F).


SELLINDGE GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION
