

TAYLOR WIMPEY PHASE TWO

It was really good to see such a good turnout of people to view the plans phase 2 which will go to Planning in March. Work will soon start on phase 1, where 50 homes, Traffic Calming, new car park, and Village Green have been approved. Walkers Construction a local firm, are doing the road calming scheme which includes a new pavement between the motorway bridge and Moorstock Lane, 2 Zebra Crossings; 1 located near the Co – Op the other at the School and of course new roadway, this work will be starting towards the end of this month

and the whole works will last in the region of 32 weeks. This will mean traffic lights, but on the plus side, all the roadworks will be done in one go.

It is hoped that the extension to the Car Park will be commenced sooner than originally expected.

Taylor Wimpey aim to start building phase 1 in June, but this will need to be confirmed.

Your Parish Council met on February 13th, and with the evenings now getting lighter, it is good to enjoy the promise of better weather.

Members of the public present had the opportunity to comment and ask questions on various issues that are affecting the village at this time. Both Jenny and Susan were able to reply.

Two residents from Barrow Hill approached your Parish Council about setting up a 'Lorry Watch'

This is where volunteers note the lorries that are driving through the Village inappropriately.

Your Parish Council will be looking for volunteers but the residents who originally approached the office will be happy to manage the project. Please check the notice boards for more information as the project progresses.

The agenda headings do stay roughly the same, but with different items under each. There were no applications in Sellindge for your Council to consider; although we did have one decision which, tree works allowed to take place.

Under Planning, the Places and Policies consultation was noted; be aware that you have until **March 19th** to make comments direct to Shepway District Council. If you would rather look at a paper copy of the document, we do have one in the office and, although you are unable to take it away, you would be more than welcome to sit and read it here. Correspondence included:

An event being held on March 1st at Lenham Community Centre, about 'befriending' to reduce loneliness was noted. This event is open to the public and there are posters on the notice boards, but you can email admin@befriendingkent.org.uk to book your place.

South & South East in Bloom are running a pilot scheme to see if villages would like to be involved on a lower level than having flower beds etc. everywhere and being judged on that. It will be free of charge to enter and will not incur any further work – at this stage for your Council; members felt that this would be a good idea, as the judges give advice on how the area could be improved and can make suggestions on conservation, community involvement etc.

With regards to the co-option to fill the casual vacancy, Gill Montgomery was co-opted. However, it was further noted that some-one who had previously been a Parish Councillor, while not present, had attended a few meetings and showed an interest in being co-opted. He was unable to attend this meeting but it is hoped by the time the March meeting takes place (providing no –one calls for an election) – he can be co-opted in March.

By the time this is delivered, you will have seen that work has started on cutting down some trees/hedges. This is the beginning of the Taylor Wimpey (TW) works.

They (TW) expect to start work on the road alterations on April 3rd; this work will entail footway work each side of the road from the motorway bridge to the junction of Swan Lane, then the relaying of the road surface.

Afterwards, work will start from Swan Lane to Moorstock Lane Junction in much the same way.

Letters are being sent out to everyone that is affected by the road works.

The next meeting is on March 13th, at 7.30pm in the Durling Hall and, as is normal, you are welcome to attend.

The District Council has reached an important point in updating its plan (required by law) for new homes, jobs and community facilities. The Places and Policies Local Plan Submission Draft is open for public consultation until 19 March. Comments made in previous public consultations held in 2015 and 2016 have helped shape this latest draft and this is everyone's chance to comment on the plan before it goes to an independent Planning Inspector for Examination in Public. All comments will be collated, summarised and sent to the Inspector.

The plan, Sustainability Appraisal, Habitat Regulations Assessment, public notice, timeline of work and other evidence base documents are available to view on the District Council's web site at www.shepway.gov.uk/places-and-policies. You can also download the representation form on the Shepway website. Copies of the Plan (and representation form) are available to view at libraries across the District and the Civic Centre, Castle Hill Avenue, Folkestone. We are also happy to meet with any residents who want to go through the document with us.

There are four sites identified for new homes - The Piggeries, Main Road Sellindge - 5 dwellings; Land West of Jubilee Cottage, Swan Lane, Sellindge - 15 dwellings; Land at Barrow Hill, Sellindge - 15 dwellings; and Silver Spray, Sellindge - 5 dwellings.

Do look at what's proposed and comment. If you want to go straight to these sites then start at page 176.

Otterpool Park Garden Town and the proposal for an extra 350 homes in Sellindge will be consulted on separately. We were both able to attend Sellindge Parish Council meeting on 13 February. Susan went to Sellindge Pop In on 30 January for a first view of the smart new chairs in the Durling Hall. The cost of the chairs was £2,480 which was funded through a £980 grant from the Parish Council, £750 from the Village Hall Committee and £750 from a District Council Ward Grant from both of us. Jenny attended the monthly meeting of the Sports Club as well as a Governors' meeting at Sellindge Primary School.

Our reports to you focus on Sellindge issues but sometimes there's news about another part of the District that merits inclusion and we are delighted to report that your District Council has been allocated £2.5 million by the Government after a successful bid for European Funding. This funding will be matched by other public and private bodies giving £5m for projects in East Folkestone to get people into employment and help businesses to grow. The project starts this year, runs till 2022. Good news not just for Folkestone, the whole District will benefit from a thriving Folkestone. Finally you may have heard that Kent Police will be recruiting an additional 200 police officers and to make sure they are recruited from as wide a range as possible Kent Police would like to know of events where they could attend to promote their recruitment campaign. Sellindge was lucky and escaped the snow that had fallen in other parts of the country. On 8 days or nights winds of mid 30's or high 40's were recorded. Temperatures were slightly up on average and only 4 frosts were noted.

Earlier today (20 February) I took part in the all day budget debate at County Hall. This may seem a long time but the budget covers over 300 services and is £958m so there was plenty to discuss. The Council eventually agreed to raise Council Tax by just under 5% (3% for inflation and a special 2% charge towards the increased demand for social care). The debate was webcast live and is available for a further six months on www.kent.gov.uk

You may have seen on the news that Northamptonshire County Council has recently declared it cannot cover its costs and other Councils are also close to the edge. Kent County Council is not in this position and KCC's Finance Director confirmed that the budget we agreed for 2018/19 was sound. The biggest risk to the budget is the continued underfunding by the Home Office of the costs of care for Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children where the shortfall currently stands at £4.6m. Together with our Kent MPs we are pushing hard for the Government to fully reimburse these costs both now and in the future.

Social care now accounts for over half the spending by your County Council with the rest of the budget divided between services such as libraries, school transport, education support services, school buildings, streetlights, public rights of way, roads and more.

Roads. The state of the A20 through Sellindge was a major topic at the Parish Council meeting on 13 February. I am sorry that there seemed to be some talk at cross purposes on the issue and I will try to be as clear as I can.

I am truly dismayed at the state of the A20 through Sellindge. The reinstatement by Eleclink after their works seems poor to me. I have raised the matter with Kent Highways especially the bumpiness. It is their view that the reinstatement has been done properly and that the movement of traffic will smooth the road. The situation is not helped by the cold and wet weather which leads to potholes. Kent Highways are inspecting this road every day to make sure it is still safe to use and there will be patching work done in March. More fundamental repairs will be done as part of the traffic calming works associated with the new homes near the Doctors' Surgery. This work will be funded by Taylor Wimpey and the Parish Council has drawings of the works that will be done that can be viewed in the Parish Council Office.

Please keep reporting any potholes you see either via the KCC website or on 03000 41 81 81.

This is particularly helpful for rural roads which are not inspected as frequently as the main road network.


