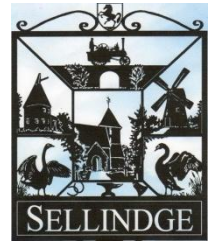

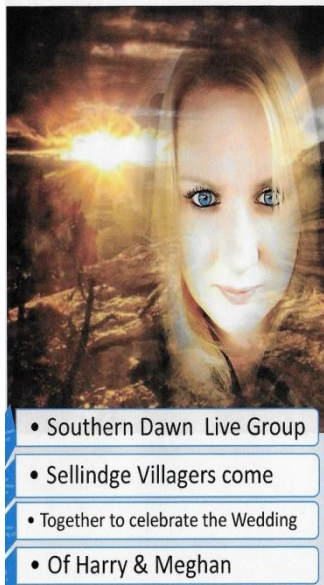

Your Parish Council met on 10th April as planned, with no interruptions or changes, that was a relief for me. An Important issue is that the Core Plan is out for consultation and if you feel strongly about issues affecting Sellindge please make the effort and send in your comments. Sometimes we feel that we are not being listened to, but unfortunately there are rules on how to send in your comments, so do read these and answer the question asked. If you need any help either contact on your Parish Councillors or come to the office during opening times. The open session highlighted some issues with damaged street furniture, and the ongoing saga of potholes and street lights not working; between Jason – our village caretaker – and myself, we normally get these reported fairly quickly, but if the office is closed or at weekends members of the public can report these items themselves. Your Parish Council is aware of the unevenness of the main road, as is Jenny and Susan; all three have been commenting on this to the relevant people and it is expected that there will be some correction of this in the future. We continue to monitor and lobby KCC.

To those who attended the Folkestone & Hythe DC planning committee, thank you for your support; although your Parish Council, other speakers and the KCC Councillor were unable to stop the development, your Parish Council will obtain the best possible outcome it can for the village. It is hoped that we can have the detailed plans at the Annual Assembly which is taking place on 22nd May in the Durling Hall at 7pm.

The other important development is the second phase of the Taylor Wimpey development, detailed plans have been supplied and these will also be available at the Annual Assembly. Any comments made will be taken forward by your Parish Council.

With all the development taking place in and around Sellindge two of your councillors felt that perhaps the neighbourhood Plan should be re-started. After having advice from Jim Boot, who helped with the Parish Plan and a discussion at the meeting, it was thought this would help obtain some control over at least design, open spaces and other issues associated with the developments coming forward. If you think you would be interested come to the Annual Assembly and chat with Councillors.

For those living on Barrow Hill, your Parish Council has a great deal of sympathy for you; sorry that's all we can give you, we have contacted everyone we can think of to help with the problems you are facing, but the replies coming back are 'we will monitor the situation'. Your Clerk has spent a considerable amount of time and effort on this and feels as frustrated about the situation as you must be angry.

The next meeting of your Parish Council is on Tuesday 8th May at 7.30pm in the Durling Hall, and as already mentioned the Annual Assembly will take place on Tuesday 22nd. It will start at 7.00pm also in the Durling Hall and is an informal gathering, there will be some light refreshments and a chance to meet your Councillors.

On a sadder note: It was noted that some-one from the village has set light to bee hives that are in the woods in the Barrow Hill area. Your Council were rather disappointed that a person should do such a thing; it is bees that help produce the food we eat and give us the beauty of flowers and trees; and without trees we would have no oxygen on the planet. Lets hope the police find out who did this!

With Sellindge featuring so prominently in the Core Strategy Local Plan Review we were pleased that as well as all the normal consultation opportunities there was an exhibition of the plans at Sellindge Village Hall on 19 April which we both visited. You still have until Friday 18 May to submit comments on the Core Strategy Local Plan Review which looks at where the homes and jobs in our district should be over the next 19 years.

The Review updates the 2013 plan and includes Otterpool Park Garden Town and additional housing sites in Sellindge. There’s also a fresh ‘call for sites’ provided they are alternative sites not ones already evaluated and rejected for the reviewed plan. There’s more information and a link to the consultation on the District Council website. There’s a search option so that you can find all references to Sellindge.

On 03 April the Planning & Licensing Committee of the District Council approved application Y16/1122/SH which is outline permission for up to 162 houses and up to 929 sqm of employment land. The meeting was webcast so you can see what the arguments for and against were (both of us spoke) and read the officer’s report which recommended approval. One result of this approval that we both welcome is the commitment to provide 30% of the homes built as ‘affordable’ which means a mixture of council houses, shared ownership and self-build. People with a local connection will be given priority for these last two options.

10 families and individuals on the council’s housing waiting list were handed the keys to the new homes built for the District Council at Gurkha Way, Military Road in Folkestone. They included two ground floor flats specially adapted for disabled tenants. There are also ‘shared ownership’ properties for sale at this development from £63,750 for a 2 bedroom home. Demonstrates our continuing commitment to provide affordable homes for local people, rent or buy.

As this year is the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War, the District Council has set up a WW1 Centenary Memorial Fund to support commemorative events across the district. Applications can be for grants of between £500 to £10,000 (there’s £50,000 of funding available in all) and applications must be received by 12 noon on 7 May. We both attended tea at St Mary’s Church in Sellindge on 18 March where we were pleased to meet some new residents and hear how much they like Sellindge. Jenny attended Sellindge Parish Council on 10 April, the School Governors’ and Sports Club Meetings. She also attended the recent funeral of Rev Patrick Goodsell at Hastingleigh. Patrick was Priest-in-charge of Sellindge with Monks Horton and Stowting (1978-84), Vicar of Sellindge with Monks Horton, Stowting and Lymington with West Hythe (1984-92) and then moved to Nonington. On his retirement he moved to Lymington and assisted in many services in Lymington, Hastingleigh and other Churches in the area right up to his death on 1 March 2018. He was a Trustee of the Sellindge & District Playing Fields Benevolent Society. Our thoughts are with his wife, Dorothy, and the family at this time.

On Thursday 1st March the weather blew in with strong wind and snow bringing with it low temperatures reminding us of winters past. A total of 5 days snow and 19 days rain was recorded for the month. The total rainfall was 90.46% of the March average. The total for March 2018 was 76.581mm 3.015in. Sunshine was very limited and was only half of a March average. The Easter Holiday was a wash-out but even so Kent and Sellindge did not suffer the extremes that other counties in the British Isles experienced.

Last year I reported that KCC had made a bid to the Government's Housing Infrastructure Fund for a £281m grant for the infrastructure funding for Otterpool Park Garden Town. We were unsuccessful with the Otterpool bid although a separate £40m bid by KCC for Swale has made it through to the second round. The Government is instead choosing to support Otterpool Park through its Housing Agency, Homes England which has recently bought land within the designated development area. Homes England has become a partner with Folkestone & Hythe District Council and Cozumel (the owners of Folkestone Race course). The work done by KCC for the bid will be put to good use in the delivery of the Garden Town at Otterpool Park as it will still need the infrastructure in place – roads, schools, medical facilities, upgrades to Westenhanger station etc. but this will now happen on a longer timescale.

I wrote about potholes last month and am returning to the subject as there are still many to fill. We are using some of our reserves to help fund a £8.2m programme to fix the potholes and some pressing drainage problems on our 5,000 mile network. Do please make sure our area benefits from this funding by reporting all the potholes you see.

I use the www.kent.gov.uk website to report potholes. There's a map where you can pinpoint problems. It will show if someone has already reported the problem and if not you can make a report and be given a reference number. The reference number is helpful if the work needs chasing. Alternatively you can ring 03000 41 81 81 in office hours and the call centre will use the website to report the problem. In an emergency or outside office hours you can ring 03000 41 91 91. If there's immediate danger to life then ring 999. Emergency repairs are done within 2 hours, other repairs should be done within 28 days.

Jenny and I have both protested about another overnight diversion of traffic from the M20 through the village. This time it was for emergency repairs and anyone who has travelled on the M20 between junctions 11 and 10 will know how poor the road surface is for traffic at motorway speeds. Highways England say the lack of a suitable crossover point means they have to use the A20 through Sellindge as the diversionary route. I have therefore asked Kent Highways to insist that Highway England construct such a crossover as part of the planned works to deal with Operation Stack and will let you know the response.

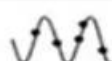
