TAYLOR WIMPEY DEVELOPMENT

As the Taylor Wimpey phase one begins to take shape, with foundations to houses being laid, and the first layers of bricks being laid, soon the roads will be constructed, which will help reduce the dust problem.

Meanwhile Walker Construction have finished the first stretch of the new footpath from the bridges to Swan Lane, this is not the final finish which will be done when the road is done.

Now they will go back to the bridges and do the other footpath, which will include the access to phase one and also a access to two private drives.one serving four houses the other serving three houses.

Now the temporary traffic lights. It's almost a daily occurrence that there is a comment in the local Facebook groups that the lights are all stuck on red. This is a built in safety measure. If someone goes through a red light, then all the lights will go to red, this is to prevent an accident. The traffic lights then reset in two to three minutes.



It has been noted that while the Post Office / Co-Op was in the centre of the traffic lights, people were jumping the red lights to get to the Post Office / Co-Op, in the belief that they were not actually jumping the red light. This is not the case, it still triggers the safety system and all lights go red.

Your Parish Council met at the beginning of May for the Annual Council Meeting, this is where all the Committee Members volunteer / agreed; these will be listed in the minutes.

Stan Bull was re-elected as Chairman, after a short debate it was felt that having a Vice-Chairman was not really required, if Stan was not around to Chair a meeting, vote could be taken to elect a Chairman for the meeting. Susan Carey has written a very comprehensive report and copies of this were available at the Annual Assembly. By now you should have put your comments in to Folkestone & Hythe District Council (FHDC) on the Core Strategy. Members of the public present raised some questions on the Phase 2 Taylor Wimpey Development (TW); new-comers may not realise that the outline permission was granted for both phases in January 2016; so while actually objecting to the development is now not possible, any comments on layout etc. are.

The Parish Council had the opportunity to speak with TW and put forward various concerns, one of them was the height of the three floor properties. These will be sent to TW and the FHDC so that they can be further considered by

the Planning Officers, these will also be placed on the website in due course.

With regards to the traffic lights; may I ask that if you are a regular car driver PLEASE DO NOT GO THROUGH THE RED LIGHTS. If this occurs a safety system kicks in and turns all the lights to red to prevent accidents.

This has been causing difficulties and delays, but Walkers – who are doing the works on the road on behalf of TW – have installed more up to date lights and hope this will not be a problem in the future; however should you know of family and friends who drive through Sellindge do pass this information on.

A local resident is now taking notes to put on Facebook, so some of the information here you may have already noted; it should be noted however that this report and the Minutes are

agreed by Councillors before being published. One of the last items was reminder of the Village Clean up! We had 8 people turn out, four of those were Councillors who collected around 8 bags of rubbish. The editor has taken some pictures of bags collected. There were hot drinks and doughnuts after, which everyone enjoyed.

Two weeks later was the Annual Assembly; a number of reports from various groups and organisations sent your Parish Council their own report, and this assisted in the production of a short leaflet where they have all be collated. There are still a few left so, if you were unable to attend and would like one to read you can pick one up in the Parish Council Office.

The detailed plans for the Phase 2 TW was laid out





and those who did attend had a great opportunity to see what is being proposed. There was also a list of suggested road names for Phase 2, that was collated from Facebook survey and with some added will be sent to TW and FHDC. The outline plans of the Quinn Estate development was also layout for people to see and any comments you have on the details should be sent to FHDC as soon as possible so that they can be taken in to account.

Moving on from development, there was also some pictures of various seats to commemorate 100 years ending the 1st WW and a short question on what would be appropriate to have on the new village green – if anything – to remember those who have fallen in both WW's and subsequent wars. The current situation was explained as follows: There's a plaque in the Church – would you like to see this updated /improved. The Village Hall is a War Memorial Hall – should there be a plaque or board placed some-where in the hall. Both the above suggestions will be need to be considered with the Village Hall Committee and the Church Wardens, contemporary; if you have any ideas on the subject do let you Parish Council Clerk know. Next meeting will be on 12th June at 7.30 in the Durling Hall.

You may already have heard the news that Roman remains have been found as part of archaeological survey work undertaken as part of the Otterpool Park Garden Town project. They are thought to be part of a Roman Villa and may be quite extensive. The plans for the town will be adjusted to accommodate these finds and they are likely to be an important future attraction in our area. Susan has seen some photographs taken by the archaeologists of pillars with elaborate decorations and it may be the find is more a palace than villa.

There will be a Public Exhibition on Otterpool Park Garden Town on 20 June at Westenhanger Castle between 2 - 8 pm where an up-to-date Master Framework plan can be seen. The original Garden Town plan was for 12,000 homes, but closer examination of the site reduced this to between 8,000 and 10,000 homes, to make the best use of the land and have 40% publically accessible green space. We have always said this is a 30/40 year scheme and the Core Strategy Review proposes 5,500 homes over the first 19 years. The plan is still evolving to take on board feedback and the recent archaeological finds. Planning professionals will be in attendance to answer questions and both of us are happy to meet with individual residents, to go through the plans.

We have recently undertaken training on GDPR (General Protection of Data Regulation) which comes into force on 25 May. It is European Union law on data protection and privacy for individuals. It places some very strong obligations on organisations handling personal information. Test cases are likely to clarify obligations but essentially it means that data controllers, (and that includes us) must have explicit consent from individuals about using their data. We have been told that we can still forward emails you send us within the Council but we must only use the information for the purposes you send it. This is what we do already so we do not expect it will affect your communication with us.

Susan attended Sellindge Parish Council on 08 May. Jenny went to the Stanford Annual Meeting on 16 May as well as the Governors' meeting of Sellindge Primary School.

The weather in April was very wet. Rain was recorded on 14 days with a total of 34.29mm (4.4in), some 309.85% of the April average, the wettest April since 2012. On 5 days strong winds were recorded. There was only 1 frost in the month. On Friday 20th the temperature rose to 27°C. Although there were several bright days, total sunshine was well down on the month's average.

The Government has announced plans to allow traffic to travel in both directions between junctions 8 and 9 of the M20 while lorries are being queued for the Port of Dover and Eurotunnel. A contraflow on the northbound carriageway is expected to be available for use by early 2019 which means traffic should not need to be diverted onto smaller local roads. More lorry parks across the UK are also being planned and a public consultation on a permanent solution to Operation Stack, led by Highways England, is expected to be launched 'shortly'. This will include asking residents, businesses and the freight industry whether they would rather see an on-road solution or an off-road lorry park. Government also said that Highways England will start work 'soon' on improving the northbound hard shoulder of the M20, to allow for two-way traffic to be contained within one carriageway, enabling the road to remain open. It is important that as many people as possible give their views in this consultation, and it provides an opportunity to object to the now regular use of the A20 through Sellindge whilst overnight works are under way on the M20. If a contraflow is being put in place between junctions 8 and 9 it would also make sense to do the same between junctions 10 and 11 and spare our local roads as well.

At the County Council meeting on 17 May I was pleased to second the motion that allows us to draw down £2m from our reserves to help fund the pothole repair programme. KCC has engaged Steadline Ltd to do extra work in the Folkestone & Hythe and Ashford areas on filling potholes and patching wider areas of damage. From 01 March to 11 May in our District there have been 1,025 potholes filled and 2,127 square metres of patching and we expect this work to carry on until at least August. Website <u>www.kent.gov.uk</u> has interactive map where you can report potholes (and other Highways faults), or ring 03000 41 81 81 in office hours and 03000 41 91 91 for emergencies at other times. Almost as important to us as our road network is the broadband network. I've written before about the investment KCC has made (with match funding from the Government) to improve access in Kent to superfast broadband. 95% of properties in Kent now have access to a superfast broadband. Of these an estimated 1,550 have broadband speeds of below 2mpbs. KCC is continuing work with BT Openreach to increase the number of properties with access to superfast broadband to 95.7% by the end of 2018. Thereafter we intend to help those who are still without access through a Kent Voucher Scheme offering a subsidy to householders so that they can arrange their own connection either individually or in community groups. More news on this when the scheme launches later this year.
