

The Parish Council met on Tuesday June 12th, with all 9 Parish Councillors, F&HDC Councillor J Hollingsbee, 3 members of the public, Parish Clerk and the Parish Admin asst. F&HDC / KCC Councillor S Carey gave apologies. Highlights on the Parish Council meeting –

- People having trouble using the pavement at Guinea Hall due to low foliage from the trees. The Chairman said it was an annual problem and he will inspect.
- There was a request that hedges that are obscuring the 40mph signs be cut back.
- Rumours that the Surgery is up for sale. The Chairman said that it's the lease that is up for sale and not the Surgery itself, this has happened a couple of times before.
- Comments that the reversing bleepers from machinery at the Walker and Taylor Wimpey site are annoying people. The problem is these reversing bleepers cannot be turned off.
- The Parish Council adopted new Standing Orders.
- The date for this year's Garage Safari will be Sunday September 9th the application slip will be on the August issue of the Sellindge Village News.

ROAD CLOSED

ROAD CLOSURES DURING JULY

M20 London bound Tuesday July 3rd to Saturday July 7th, between Junction 11 and 10 this is overnight closure between 8pm and 6am.

Lorries should take the A2 and measures should be in place to try to deter them using the A20.

A20 Sandling Road, Postling Monday July 9th for approx. 6 weeks – This is between the

Saltwood turning (Brockhill Park) and the Lyminge turning to allow major cable installation. Full road closure.

B2068 Stanford Bypass (road to Canterbury) Thursday July 19th for up to 5 nights this is overnight closure between 7.30pm and 5am to allow carriageway resurfacing.

The full closure of A20 Sandling Road will be lifted overnight during this period.

Church Lane, Aldington (Lane that goes past converter station) Thursday July 19th for approx. 6 weeks – This is to allow major cable installation and is a full road closure.

After a very wet and mixed month of weather in April, Tuesday May 1st dawned with sunshine and very little cloud. The following day after a wet afternoon the sun shone in the evening and there was no further rain for 10 days. One wet day was followed by another nine dry days. There were odd small amounts of rain recorded until the end of the month. Total rainfall for May was 51.689mm (2.035in) from only 7days, this being 99.51% of the monthly average On 5 days high temperatures were recorded the highest being 26.50°C on Mon. 7th.

Universal Credit reached our district on 30 May and District Councillors were recently given a presentation about the change by the officer in charge of administering benefit payments. Most new claimants will claim Universal Credit but there are some important exceptions; those of pensionable age, those in temporary accommodation, those in specified (supported) accommodation and those with more than three children in the household will still need to claim the separate benefits. Universal Credit replaces six separate benefits – Housing Benefit, Income Based Employment and Support Allowance, Working Tax Credits, Income Support, Child Tax Credit and Income based Jobseekers Allowance. The other big change is that the claims are all made online. District Council staff will show people how to claim online and give advice on how to budget. Please note, those who claim Council Tax Reduction still need to apply separately, directly to the District Council. The District Council has awarded around £46,000 to 17 projects across the district that will mark the centenary of the end of the First World War. One of these was £10,000 to Step Short which is the Folkestone based charity behind the new memorial arch inaugurated by Prince Harry on the centenary of the start of the First World War. Step Short are arranging an Armistice Centenary March on 22 July and other events. You can find out more on www.stepshort.co.uk We don't just remember our Armed Forces from the past, the District Council has also signed up to the Armed Forces Covenant and Jenny has responsibility for this at the District Council. She attended a conference about it on 13 June at Chatham. Have a look at our website www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk to read about the commitments to those who serve or have served in the Armed Forces and their families.

The Local Government Association has just completed a three day 'peer review' of Folkestone & Hythe District Council. It's undertaken by staff and Councillors from other Councils (our peers) to look at how we are doing and give constructive advice. Although it's supposed to be a 'friendly' review the preparation for the visit and the interviews have been demanding. We hope to let you know the result of the review in our next report. Jenny attended Sellindge Parish Council on 12 June, the Sports & Social Club Meeting (and stewarded at the boot fair), the Otterpool Park Collaboration Board and a workshop on Otterpool Park. We are both attending the public exhibition about Otterpool Park Garden Town at Westenhanger Castle on 20 June.

Our part of Kent suffers whenever Operation Stack fills the M20 with lorries and I haven't yet met a resident who didn't hold strong views on the matter. Now is your chance to have your say. Highways England, which is the Government Agency responsible for motorways, is holding a public consultation on how best to deal with the problem and you can send in a response up to 11.59pm on Sunday 22 July. The link is

As part of the consultation, Highways England will be holding an information exhibition at the Quarterhouse in Folkestone on Thursday 05 July between 2pm and 8pm.

Among the 300 plus services for which Kent County Council is responsible are the ceremonies to confer British Citizenship. They are held at the Archbishop's Palace in Maidstone by the Chairman of KCC and a representative of the Lord Lieutenant. County Councillors are invited to attend the ceremony to watch any new citizen who lives in their division take their oath of allegiance to the Queen (or make an affirmation) and it was my honour on 11 June to watch as a Sellindge resident became a British citizen. Our new citizen has lived in the village since 2005 and is a frontline worker with the NHS. The Deputy Lieutenant in attendance was Jonathan Evans (Baron Evans of Weardale) who used to be head of MI5 and he gave a speech encouraging the new citizens to volunteer with charities such as the missing persons one with which he was involved.

Now all the accounts have been finalised I can confirm that KCC had a small underspend of £0.5m on its £939m budget for the financial year 2017/18. We will be using the underspend and more funding from our reserves to extend the programme to fix the potholes left by the winter snows. Between March and 15 June nearly 26,000 potholes had been filled in Kent and nearly 70,000sqm of patching done (figures for the same period in our district were 1,741 potholes filled and 8,790 sqm of patching). Do please keep reporting potholes so that they are added to the work programme. You don't need to know the name of the road as the website <u>www.kent.gov.uk</u> has an interactive map where you can mark the spot or you can ring 03000 41 81 81 in office hours and 03000 41 91 91 for emergencies at other times.

Although today's children are arguably better fed, better educated and safer than previous generations they face pressures that were unimaginable only a few short years ago particularly from social media. **Headstart** is a project that offers help for both children and their parents to cope with common mental health problems. Headstart is doing work in schools and also offers advice on the website <u>www.headstartkent.org.uk</u> and access to online counselling. KCC won funding for this scheme from the National Lottery.

Another National Lottery funded project is Aspirations run by the charity Porchlight. It's a free mental health and wellbeing service for anyone over 18 and not in employment.
