The Parish Council met on Tuesday July 10th, where six Parish Councillors, the KCC Councillor and F&HDC Councillors and four members of the public, the Parish Clerk and the Admin assistant. There were apologies from the other three Parish Councillors. There were no interests declared and the Minutes of the June meeting were found correct and signed and dated. There were several matters brought up my members of the public –

- It was asked when the phone box at Greenfields would be painted. *The Chairman said he was researching the correct paint, and will order.*
- It was asked about the road names that have been put forward for the Taylor Wimpey phase 2. *The Parish Clerk said the road names have been forwarded to the District Council.*
- There were concerns raised that where the first section of the road calming scheme is being constructed, the centre line of the road is now no longer in the middle. There were concerns that a collision may occur. *The Parish Clerk said that Taylor Wimpey have been informed about this concern.*



There were two planning application decisions by F&HDC

Y18/0408/SH – The Laurels, Stone Hill. Change of use for barn to holiday let – approved with conditions.

Y18/0013/SH - 5 Leafield. Erection of single storey extension – approved with conditions.

There was one planning application for the Parish Council to consider.

Y17/1242/SH – The Elms, Gibbons Brook. Erection of agricultural barn. This was supported by the Parish Council.

The weather in Sellindge was bright and mainly sunny but was not up to that of other areas of the British Isles. A brisk north east wind blew across Kent keeping the temperature below past records while other parts of Britain roasted. Rainfall was recorded on only 2 days of the month, the main being a thunder storm on the night of Wed.6th-7th when 17.272mm (0.680in) was recorded. The only other rain was during the night of Sun.17th-18th with only 0.508mm (0.02n). The total in June 2018 was 17.7mm (0.7in) Not the driest June on record when in June 1961 I recorded only 5.842mm (0.23in).

Following the recent announcement that Michael Garrod is standing down from his work for Sellindge Village Hall we want to pay tribute to the contribution Michael has made both the community in general and to the Village Hall in particular. He has made Pop In at the Village Hall a success which we hope will long continue. His fund raising efforts for the hall over many years have led to many improvements to its comfort and accessibility. He has been one of the people who makes the village a community not just a collection of buildings and his generosity with his time and commitment to the Village Hall have made a real difference. Thank you Michael.

On 20 June a public exhibition on Otterpool Park Garden Town was held at Westenhanger Castle which will be a key focal point for the new settlement. The exhibition was open to anyone and nearly 200 people (including us) attended to make their views known and ask questions of the experts (ecological, transport, water, housing need etc.) who were on hand to provide answers. There's considerable information on <u>www.otterpoolpark.org</u> Comments and questions can still be sent via this website and both of us are happy to answer questions. The outline planning application for Otterpool Park is expected to be submitted by the end of the year.

Your District Council has just published its Annual Performance Report for 2017/18. You can see the full report on <u>www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk</u> but here are a few highlights. 74 long-term empty homes brought back into use, 99 new affordable homes for rent and shared ownership delivered with our partners across the district. 103 Antisocial Behaviour complaints investigated and resolved, 134 food businesses inspected (with 95% rated 3 star or above). 68 apprenticeship grants awarded to local businesses and 70 local people supported to set up and develop their small businesses. Not all targets were met. We aimed to recycle 47% of household waste but only reached 43.9% so we are looking at ways to encourage residents to recycle more.

We are sometimes asked if it really is worth recycling. It's a good question as there is cost and energy involved at all stages of the recycling process but it is worthwhile not least because the landfill sites where residual waste can be buried are filling up. Landfill tax (paid by KCC) is currently £88.95 a tonne and goes up every year. It's a significant cost to meet and the more landfill tax we pay the less there is for other council services. It's a subject we can return to if people are interested.

We both attended the Parish Council meeting on 10 July and the Annual Strawberry Tea at St Mary's church on 08 July. Jenny attended a hat trick of Sellindge Primary School events - the Sports Day, the Year 5/6 Performance and the Summer Fair. Many congratulations to the pupils, they were amazing, the performance called 'Let Loose' was based on a fictional residential. Jenny also attended the Patient Participation Group at Sellindge Surgery and was roped into helping at the Boot Fair to raise money for maintenance and improvement of facilities at the Sports & Social Club.

KCC expects to launch a Broadband voucher scheme in September which will offer up to $\pounds 1,700$ subsidy per household for those who cannot access superfast broadband. This is the maximum subsidy we can offer without falling foul of EU regulations and it is hoped that households will join together to fund connections for their properties. More details (I hope) next month.

Since my last report we have taken more funds from reserves for road repairs with a view to doing more resurfacing. Between 01 March and 13 July 44,985 potholes have been filled and 102,562 sqm of patching carried out. For our district the equivalent figures are 4,565 potholes and 14,221 sqm which is the second highest figure across Kent for patching (patching is preferable as it lasts longer). Whilst the roads are inspected by Kent Highways both visually and with equipment that can monitor underground conditions, the quieter rural roads are inspected less frequently than main routes so it is really helpful if people can report damage on www.kent.gov.uk or (in office hours) 03000 41 81 81 (for emergencies) 03000 41 91 91.

Hempton Hill on Stone Street (B2068) was recently resurfaced and I took advantage of the planned road closure to add to the works the installation of reflective road studs (cat's eyes) along this stretch. The extra £2,000 cost has been met from my KCC Member Fund. This stretch of road is often shrouded in fog and the studs will help drivers keep to their side of the road.

At our last full County Council meeting on 12 July we considered a paper about what preparations are needed for Kent for BREXIT. We are in the frontline for any problems caused by delays in Cross Channel traffic but the report also looks at other matters such as Trading Standards, Emergency Planning and Security. We can't resolve all these issues but we do have contingency plans and are making sure the Government is aware of the risks from a Kent perspective. The diversions of traffic at night whilst the M20 is shut for repairs have brought unwelcome traffic through the village. It is Highways England that makes the decision on whether to completely close the motorway or have traffic running alongside the works. Highways England insist that the size of the machinery in use and the very real risk of serious injury to workmen from moving traffic make closure a necessity. The signing to HGVs not to use the A20 through Sellindge was largely ignored so for future closures Kent Highways will look to have a Traffic Management crew or Traffic Officer on duty at the relevant entry points.
