Your Parish Council met on 14th of August, and while some Parish Councils don't meet during this particular month, Sellindge decided that meetings would take place even though some Councillors were on holiday; in fact the meeting was short of 5 councillors, due to holiday, health issues – not necessarily their own but members of the family and being called back to work. It made for a quicker meeting though!

Susan was in attendance and brought everyone present up to date with the latest consultation from Kent County Council. This one is about the house hold waste disposal sites or (tips) that we all use from time to time. The current problem is that adjacent counties are now charging for householders to take their building waste to the tips and so this means people are coming into Kent to dispose of this type of waste free of charge and subsequently costs to Kent County Council have gone up. The idea to prevent this from continuing is to place a charge of £4.00 per bag. All of the details will be on the website of the Kent County Council, I am sure Susan will be placing something about this in more detail in her report.

The Taylor Wimpey phase 2 development is continuing to work its way through the planning system, and the Parish Council have seen revised plans and made comments prior to the application being sent to the District Council. The Parish Council and individuals still has a chance to make further comments if needed when the District Council places the application on their website, which is now available. Y18/0402/SH.

Paper letters and other correspondence was scarce this month, the one exemptions being a letter regarding the Pat Testing equipment that requires calibration; so as the village hall has acquired a second hand dishwasher this will be tested before it can be used; anyone booking the village hall now does not have to wash up cups and saucers by hand. The opportunity to purchase a second hand Hayter mower was noted and an agreement to purchase took place. Since employing the Village caretaker any equipment that has been used actually belongs to the Chairman of the Parish Council; therefore it will be good for your Parish Council to have our own equipment.

Some of you who attend the Pop in may have known that the hot water boiler in the Durling Hall needed repair; this was not possible and a new one was purchased; it was agreed in principle that the Parish Council would pay for this; but the Village Hall Chairman was requested to complete an application form for the grant.

Talking of the Pop In, this will be closing for one week; the dates are 17th and 18th September, more details elsewhere in the magazine.

Sellindge Parish Councillors would like to remind everyone that dumping household items outside of your property makes the village look untidy and can encourage vermin. The District Council will arrange for collection for a fee, so do use this facility.

The next Parish Council meeting is on 11th of September in the Durling Hall, do come along if you want to find out what is going on in your village.

We are pleased to report that the result of the recent Peer Review of your District Council was very positive. Carried out by councillors and directors of other councils, the review involved interviews with 150 people, a tour of the district and a study of the council's strategies. The report concluded, *'The peer team was impressed by the range of key developments and the sheer scale of ambition, which is unusual for a district council.'* We are already implementing some of the suggestions made by the Peer Review to further improve delivery.

We are also pleased to report that the planning application for the new Leisure Centre and houses at Princes Parade (the site of the former municipal tip on the seafront in Hythe) has been approved. The leisure centre will replace the current costly and outdated pool in Hythe as well as providing gym facilities and a café. The walkway along the promenade will be widened and there will be extra parking for the new homes as well as publically accessible green space and play facilities for children. 45 of the 150 homes will be affordable (which includes council houses, housing association or help to buy starter homes). The golf course at the Hythe Imperial is unaffected.

We wrote recently about the introduction of Universal Credit in our area. This has a knock on effect to our Council Tax Reduction Scheme and we currently have a consultation about these changes. You can take part until 21 October on www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/consultations Please let us know your views whether you are directly affected or not (it does not affect those of pensionable age).

We are compiling a list of damaged/illegible street names in our ward and if you know of any, please let us know so we can get the District Council to replace them. (Damaged traffic signs are the responsibility of Kent County Council and can be reported via the www.kent.gov.uk website).

With the autumn rains approaching do please take care not to provide a breeding ground for mosquitoes. They like stagnant water so blocked guttering, wheelbarrows and saucers for plant pots should be emptied and water butts cleared out. If you think you've spotted any of the Asian Tiger mosquitoes then please report to the District Council. In July the District Council was informed of damage to trees and other vegetation at the Taylor Wimpey site next to the village hall. One of the District Council's Senior Planning Officers has investigated and measures to protect the trees have now been put in place by the developer to the satisfaction of the Council's Arboriculture Manager.

Jenny attended the celebration assembly at Sellindge School for the pupils who are leaving primary to go to secondary school and Susan was at Sellindge Parish Council meeting on 14 August.

KCC has recently been awarded the Ministry of Defence Employers Recognition Gold Award for its support for ex-service personnel and Reservists. We have an Armed Forces Covenant which commits KCC to ensure that serving personnel, veterans and Reservists will not be disadvantaged in accessing our services as a result of serving in the military. There's more information about what this means in practice on our website (search for Armed Forces) as well as a calendar of events across Kent which celebrate Kent's military heritage.

A group of KCC Councillors have been asked to look at the issue of loneliness and social isolation especially among Kent's older residents. They will be looking at whether KCC's current service provision and partnership working is effective and make recommendations on how they could be improved. Written submissions on this issue are invited from anyone interested and should be sent to select.committee@kent.gov.uk by midday on Monday September 10, 2018. Once all the information has been considered, the Councillors will produce a report for consideration at a full County Council meeting in early 2019.

Look out for a consultation on our Household Waste Recycling Centres. Kent has 16 of these and we are one of the last places in the country still accepting soil, rubble and plasterboard all of which are not classified as household waste. We are now getting significant inflows of such waste from across the County boundaries and the consultation is asking for views on whether we should introduce a charge for this type of non household waste in line with neighbouring Councils.

I've no further news on the broadband voucher scheme but a launch is imminent and I will give details as soon as they are known.

And finally, the pothole report. Between 01 March and 17 August 48,635 potholes had been filled and 165,429 sqm of patching has been done across Kent. For our District the equivalent figures are 4,642 potholes and 21,407 sqm of patching. Do please keep reporting potholes so that they are added to the work programme. You don't need to know the name of the road as the website www.kent.gov.uk has an interactive map where you can mark the spot or you can ring 03000 41 81 81 in office hours and 03000 41 91 91 for emergencies at other times. Make sure you keep a note of your reference number which will help in keeping track of progress.

July and suddenly it's summer! On Sunday 1st the temperature rose to 28.0°C. During the month there were days with near record temperatures and uncomfortable nights. The nearest to a record in Sellindge was on Thursday 26th with a reading of 33.0° (91°F). From my recordings back as far as 1991 this was on Wednesday July 19th 2006 with a reading of 35.25°C (95.45°F). There were only 5 days when rain was recorded, the first being the night of July 5th then nothing until the last week of the month including the evening of Friday 27th when a violent storm prevented any chance of observing the total eclipse of the moon. Total rainfall was 39.116mm (1.54in) only 62.6% of the July average



CARING FOR CATS

The Folkestone and Hythe Branch of Cats Protection is part of a national network and has been taking in unwanted and abandoned cats and kittens for over twenty years. And at this time of the year, its dedicated team of volunteers is busier than ever. The problem of unwanted cats and kittens is never-ending and the branch is continually urging cat owners to have their pets neutered; and to help cat owners on benefits or low

incomes, there's a subsidised neutering scheme available.

All cats coming into the care of the branch are lovingly cared for by volunteer fosterers and given full health checks. They are also microchipped, which is extremely important, as it enables a lost cat's owner to be easily identified.

The branch also operates a Lost and Found service, which is invaluable as people often feed a cat suspected of being a stray – but it's not reported as being 'found'! Anyone needing the service can contact: **0345 260 1253**

All of this work is carried out by a team of unpaid volunteers and costs a great deal of money. Most of the funds raised come from the shop in Hythe High Street, together with fund-raising activities and promotions. One of the most important roles is that of a fosterer, which involves taking in a cat before it is found a permanent home.

More volunteer fosterers are urgently needed; for every cat that is rehomed, another is waiting to come into care and be given some much-needed attention. If you would like to look after a cat and have a few hours to spare each day, this is an ideal way of enjoying a cat if you can't commit to actually owning one.

You'll need an appropriate room or house space, a practical personality, enjoys interacting with people and a willingness to follow the cat care standards of the charity.

In return for your time and commitment the Branch will provide everything you require, including;


Equipment to adapt the facilities made available


