

#### **RED PHONE BOX REFURBUSHMENT**



The Parish Council have now completed the refurbishment of the red phone box at Greenfields. It has been refurbished with the correct paint colour, bringing it back to near new condition, even the crowns have been painted.

Only change is the glass at the top, which used to have Telephone in. The wording had faded some much, it was decided to paint them white, so that text for the new use of the phone box can be entered instead.

The Parish Council are now looking at the electrics, and are currently in contact with the electric company, as there is a need for a power source to have a Defibrillator installed, plus there will hopefully be a light switch as well.

Besides the defibrillator there will be shelving installed as well.

#### ← ANTI-SOCIAL PARKING AT BUS STOPS

Please note by parking alongside the 'raised curb' at the Bus Stop you have now potentially denied Wheelchair Users, Mobility Impaired People and People with Loaded Shopping Trollies, the ability to get on or off the buses. You may have parked your vehicle in a nice convenient place for you, but please spare a thought for others.

#### ANTI-SOCIAL GRAFFITI

Jenny has long wanted a way to help people find out about the activities and services across our district and has now been able to realise this ambition with the imminent launch of a new website called

<u>www.spotlight.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk</u> The site will list everything from play sessions for toddlers to tea parties for pensioners as well as sports clubs and arts groups. The site is free to use and there's a prize draw of  $\pounds 200$  for organisations that sign up. It's a way to bring people together and support the work of the great organisations we have across the district.

Jenny's role as Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Communities is one of the busiest jobs on the council with many meetings with community groups and partners. In the last month these meetings have included the Armed Forces Covenant, East Kent College, the New Local Government Network, the Health and Wellbeing Board and the Kent Downs AONB (Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty) which launched its Ash Project on 14 September at the White Horse Wood Country Park. (You can find out more about the Ash project at <u>www.theashproject.org.uk</u>) Locally Jenny has been at events at the Sports & Social Club and Sellindge church. Susan attended the Pop In at Sellindge Village Hall and spoke with the NHS 'Walking for Health' group. She also saw the District Council enforcement officers at work one night dealing with HGV parking in Sellindge.

We've reported before about plans to reorganise the council so that there are more staff in the community solving problems than logging reports about problems. The new system is about to start and we hope you will notice that graffiti and flyposting are removed and other local issues resolved more quickly. The pothole repair programme continues and the latest figures show 50,956 potholes filled across Kent and 201,790 sqm of resurfacing. Within that figure the Folkestone & Hythe district has seen 4,781 potholes filled and 25,083 sqm of resurfacing with more to come. Please keep reporting highway problems at <u>www.kent.gov.uk</u> or 03000 41 81 81. The reporting system is not just for potholes; blocked drains, faded road markings, overhanging vegetation, damaged highway signs and much more can also be reported this way.

KCC's consultation on whether to introduce charges for soil, rubble, hardcore and plasterboard at our 16 Household waste recycling centres continues until 01 November. The early responses have mostly come from people who don't use the HWRCs for this themselves but fear charges might lead to an increase in flytipping.

Experience elsewhere in the country is that charging for this type of waste does not lead to an increase in flytipping as most householders are law abiding and accept that a payment of £4 for a bag of rubble is a reasonable charge compared to the cost of an entire skip. Most flytipping is done by criminal gangs not individuals and Kent Police have had some major successes in catching those responsible. We can all help with this by reporting flytipping we see to the Police and the District Council or by using the country eye app which I am told is by far the simplest method. (An Elmsted resident has recently been able to provide evidence that will lead to a flytipping prosecution.)

Kent's Police and Crime Commissioner, Matthew Scott, is holding one of his regular surveys on what we as residents would like Kent Police to make their top priority. It takes just 2 minutes to complete and can be found at www.kent-pcc.gov.uk/listening-to-you/public-consultations

In October KCC will launch its annual consultation on budget choices for the next financial year. Once again our Government grant is decreasing despite demand for social care and inflation rising. We've been making major savings since 2010 which is why we are not on the list you may have seen of local authorities facing financial crisis. However, there's no doubt that every council with social care responsibilities will eventually go under as the present system of funding how we care for the elderly, disabled and vulnerable is unsustainable and a long term cross party agreement on a better system is needed.

Highways England are expected to be closing the M20 again on the night of Saturday 13 October to demolish Kingsford Bridge and install a footbridge across the motorway? This is not confirmed but from a reliable source.
