

Food – Tinned / Packet. Anything that has a good date on them would be very welcome but not Fresh foods please.

We need warm clothing to help the homeless get through the winter.

Gloves, Hats, Coats, Scarves, Socks, Jumpers, Track suit bottoms and Sleeping bags, are all needed.

Most of the homeless you will be helping are Men however; there are at least 3 Women amongst them.

We have all felt cold at some stage in our life, but to feel cold continuously for months on end must be totally demoralising.

All the items given by you will be going straight to a lady in Folkestone who helps the local Homeless, her name is Pam Jones and she is well known for the good work she does with the Homeless and I think it would be lovely if Sellindge could help her to continue.

ST MARY'S CHRISTMAS FAIR - VILLAGE HALL - SATURDAY 17th from 10am



Your Parish Council met on 9th October, at the new time of 7pm. I was not present as on away at a Clerks Conference, which was very useful in ensuring that my Knowledge is updated.

It was announced that Aldington arranged some free Defib training so hopefully some of you would have been able to attend, although there was not much time to get the information out to the wider public. If any of you would like to have some training on the use of the two defibs we have in the village please do contact the Parish Council office, when we have 12 people training can then be arranged.

Susan could not be present so your Chairman read out her report; however I am sure she will update you all through the newsletter. Jenny was able to update on items including the Garden Town and other issues, again there will be her report elsewhere in the newsletter.

Improved Access Clinic – Sellindge Surgery is now able to office extra clinic appointments for certain things. This will be on a Monday from 6.30 to 8.00pm with the last appointment time being 7.45pm; there will be a Nurse and an Health Care Assistant on duty, with a GP on call for any query the staff may have.

In addition you can contact the Sellindge Surgery and request an appointment at any of the surgeries in Ashford if the Monday is not convenient, providing, of course, that there is availability.

HGV'S in the village – The Chairman continues to monitor and contact companies, when details are available, and request that these companies ask/instruct their drivers not to come through the village. (Your Parish Council continues to lobby anyone who they believe will be able to help with the reduction of lorries in Sellindge)

Graffiti under bridges – Your Parish Council would like to thank the member of the public for contacting and 'pestering' people about the graffiti under the two bridges, your Parish Council have supported them by sending our own comments on this, it is hoped that eventually this can be cleared completely.

Hedgehogs – One of your Parish Councillors highlighted the plight of the hedgehog population and that they are decreasing ever rapidly. If you are on good terms with neighbours a suggestion that perhaps hedgehog 'paths' between the gardens to ensure they have enough food. Never give a hedgehog milk though, if you want to feed any you have in your garden cat food is ideal, and water in a shallow bowl, for drinking is all that is required. Now that the cooler weather is here they will be hibernating soon, putting out food will help them gain the weight they need to put on before their hibernation.

If you put a small pallet the in a corner of your garden, covered with brushwood etc. They will nest and hibernate here. Make sure there is some waterproof cover before you put the brushwood on pallet.

Parking on pavements outside the School – Since the road works outside the school, it has been noted that cars and vans are being parked on the pavements, this will cause damage to the kerbs and the grass verge once planted; your Parish Council asks that if this is you please don't! It is not safe for pedestrians either.

However expensive your vehicle may have been, lives are worth a lot more.

Newsletter – It has come to your Parish Councils knowledge that some you throw your free copy of the Newsletter in the bin and don't bother reading it. This is such a shame, as a lot of people put together the information inside for your benefit; however it has been suggested that if you do NOT one delivered, contact the Parish Council office. Newsletters are available on the Sellindge Parish Council Website and in full colour, they are also posted on the various Village Facebook groups.

By reducing the number of printed copies we may be able to get them printed in colour for those who still want a newsletter put through their door and still save your Parish Council money.

We write in this newsletter every month, attend the Parish Council meetings and as many local events as we can but there's nothing beats calling door to door to get your views. Accompanied by our MP Damian Collins we've been out door knocking to meet people and listen. One of the things we heard was a request for an update on housing planned for our area.

The **Places and Policies Local Plan** sets out which land in our district can be used for new homes and jobs as well as policies for managing this development. It has been out for consultation at every stage of drafting and has now been submitted to the Government. The Government will now assign an Independent Planning Inspector to assess the plan, review all the representations made and evidence submitted.

The Inspector will also hold public hearings (probably in December) which could last two to three weeks. The Inspector may invite those who made representations at the last stage of consultation to put their views or submit further supporting evidence. Only those who made representations at the final stage of consultation may take part in this final stage although the meetings will be open to the public to watch.

When the Planning Inspector has all the information needed, s/he issues a final report. If the Plan is found 'sound' the District Council can then formally adopt it probably in June/July 2019. The Inspector may require changes in which case the process will take longer. Once in place the Plan officially lasts till 2031.

Alongside the **Places and Policies Local Plan**, the District Council is also working on a **Core Strategy Review** which extends the Plan to 2037 and includes Otterpool Park Garden Town (essentially the village of Westenhanger and land between Sellindge and Lympne but with 'buffer zones' so that Sellindge and Lympne remain distinct). This will have its own public examination later in 2019.

It has been a long and detailed process which needs to be robust to withstand potential legal challenge from landowners and developers and allow your District Council to fulfil its legal responsibility to allocate sufficient land to meet the need for new homes and jobs.

We believe we have a robust Local Plan which will protect our District from speculative development and now wait the Planning Inspector's verdict.

We are pleased to report that the Government has given the District Council a £2.9m grant to accelerate Housing developments at Princes Parade, Hythe and Biggins Wood in Folkestone. Together, these projects will provide more than 220 new homes, including 68 affordable homes.

Jenny attended Sellindge Primary School Governors' Meeting, the Harvest Assembly and the Sports & Social Club Meeting as well as Stowting Primary Harvest Assembly. Jenny also attended Sellindge Parish Council on 09 October whilst Susan went to a presentation in Lympne to a local history group by KCC's archaeologists about finds made near Sellindge including Bronze Age barrows, the remains of a Tudor deer park and, most exciting of all, the remains of a Roman Villa. Plenty more work to be done to excavate these finds which are likely to be of national significance.

I often write about KCC's budget and now it's your turn. You have until 21 November to make your views known about the budget for 2019/20. I've had a hand in putting together the information on the website for this consultation and I hope we've made the budget choices clear. Many people see their council tax bill as a payment for services received such as the road network and waste disposal. This is only a very small part of what your council tax covers. Over half of KCC's expenditure is on social care – this covers protection of children from harm and neglect, fostering and adoption, care of elderly who can't meet their own care costs (in their own home or a residential or nursing home), services for those with mental or physical disabilities and lifelong care for those with Learning Disabilities. So far we've made most of our savings where it doesn't show in efficiencies, streamlining services and making more use of technology. We have not closed a single one of our 99 libraries and still have a mobile library service, an archive centre and a growing e-book service. We offer subsidised bus travel for schoolchildren (this is over and above our legal responsibility), have a community warden scheme, country parks and support sport and the arts – all discretionary services. In all we have over 300 services both statutory and discretionary, many of which you won't notice until you need them.

We are in a better financial position than many other Councils with social care responsibilities but even with a council tax rise of 5% (that's 3% for inflation and an extra 2% to meet extra social care demand) we will need to make savings. The consultation asks you to say what your priorities are to help us shape a budget that has support from Kent residents. Go to www.kent.gov.uk and look for 'budget' or you can use one of our libraries or contact me. There's also a consultation under way from Highways England about the Government's plans for a Lower Thames Crossing. This is important for us as it should relieve pressure on the Dartford crossing, M25 and M20 and allow HGV traffic to have a much more direct route to the Midlands and the North from the Channel Ports. The preferred route was announced in April and this latest round of consultation takes on board some of the feedback received since then. Go to www.lowerthamescrossing.co.uk/haveyoursay for more information and the response form. You have until midnight on 20 December to respond.

Highways England's works on the M20 are expected to continue until March 2019 and we can expect some more overnight closures. Keep an eye on Highways England's website for news.

September was a very mixed month of weather. On seven days there were winds of 20mph and the low 30s mph. Rain was recorded on 7 days giving a total of 13.716mm (1.91in) 109.14% of the September average. Total sunshine hours were down on the monthly average and during the last days of the month 5 frosts were recorded. Sellindge was fortunate to miss he extreme rainfall and wind in many other counties.
