CORE STRATEGY REVIEW EXHIBITION - DURLING HALL - THURSDAY MARCH 7th 4pm to 8pm

The Folkestone and Hythe District Council have produced a Core Strategy for the whole of the District. The strategy will cover the current ongoing planning applications, and future applications on land in other areas of the village.

There is a deadline of 11th March for your views to be received by the Folkestone and Hythe District Council.

The Core Strategy can be down loaded from the following link www.consult.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk if this link does not work, go to www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk and select the 'Your Council' option, then select the 'consultations' option.

They are also available in hard copy at the Parish Council Office during the normal opening hours.

The Parish Council have arranged an exhibition to give resident the chance to see the documents and how this will impact on different areas of the village in the coming years.

Once this Core Strategy is adopted it will be the blue print for the next generation of residents, so do make an effort to visit and put in any comments you may have.

The Parish Council as corporate body have already asked for a bypass from Otterpool Park, this may or may not be placed in the final outcome, but if residents feel this is a good idea, by supporting this statement, it will give weight to the Parish Council's suggestion.

The event has been arranged for March 7th in the Durling Hall starting at Thursday 4.00pm to 8.00pm.

Your Parish Council met for their February meeting on the 12th, and it was nice to see a few members of the public there, thank you for coming.

It was with a little sadness and surprise to hear that Parish Councillor Suzy Clark had resigned, but we all wish her well for the future. She has really made a difference in the short time she was a Parish Councillor especially in highlighting the problems at the Otterpool Layby.

Susan Carey sent a short report which was read out, I am sure this'll be in the newsletter elsewhere with more added. Highway issues.

Your Parish Council considered the parking of lorries in the new (for cars only) laybys through the village, and the layby at the bottom of Otterpool Lane.

With regards to the Otterpool layby it is considered that this layby does encourage drivers to come to the village, knowing that if there are no spaces at the Airport Café they can park there and then drive through the village.

The idea is to have it stopped up completely. It was part of the original roadway until the road was realigned when the junction was altered so, is relatively speaking new. As your Parish Clerk I have been asked to investigate this in more detail, although this will cost £500 to have the highways check it out and decide if they agree to our suggestion before we take any other action.

Your Parish Council has been informed that wooden posts will be placed on the verges by the new 'car' laybys to stop drivers parking in them; we have to wait and see if this is going to be done before the Parish Council takes any action. It is expected that some planting will take place as well.

Under the planning items the following were highlighted and noted:

- A full report of the stage 3 consultation for the Otterpool Park has been sent to the Parish Council and this is available for Councillors to read.
- The section 106 agreement for the development at the rear of Rhodes House being put in by Quinn Estates has also bee received, this was discussed at the F&GP Committee as Members were unhappy with the contents of some of it. If anyone from Sellindge would like to look at either of the documents, do come to the office during the normal open hours.

Your Parish Council was notified of two applications decided by the District Council; the one at Woodlands, Main Road has been refused, but the application at 4 Klondyke Villas was granted.

There were a few other documents that require the Councillors to read and then decide if they need to be discussed at a full Council meeting and these were, Minutes of the KALC AGM, Plastic Free Tool Kit – how to encourage a reduction in the use of plastic in the village, Kent Resilience Forum and a Copy of map relating to Meadow Grove. The land at Meadow Grove was due to be cleared, but this has been delayed due to some difficulties, it is hoped that this will done soon so that Parish Councillors can further consider how it can be improved.

The minutes for the January Meeting are now approved and should be on the website, the next meeting is on 12 March at 7.00pm in the Durling Hall. All Welcome.

Elections for the District Council election are taking place on Thursday 02 May which means that next month, instead of a District Council report in this newsletter, you will receive an election leaflet delivered to your home. We are both standing again for re-election and hope that over the last few years our regular reports here have kept you in touch with the work we have been doing for your village and the wider district.

If you are not already on the electoral register then you have until 12 April to apply. You can apply for a postal or proxy vote at any time but the deadline to be in time for the District Council elections is 15 April. Postal votes are sent out a few days before the election so, if you will be away longer, you can nominate someone to vote on your behalf as a proxy.

Polling cards are normally sent out a couple of weeks before the election and will tell you which polling station to go to (or if you have opted for a postal vote). Polling stations are open from 7am to 10pm. You do not need to have your polling card to vote but it does help the polling station staff if you take it with you.

Jenny attended Sellindge Parish Council on 12 February. You may also have seen us locally on the doorstep with Damian Collins MP. We do this year-round across our district council ward and, during the election campaign itself we aim to knock on every door. If you would like us to call on you to discuss a particular issue please remember that we continue to be your councillors during the campaign and, are able to help with any normal business or advice. One of the issues raised at our recent meeting with Matthew Scott our Police and Crime Commissioner was illegal encampments. Matthew said he wanted the law changed to make trespass a criminal offence so that Police could take action, (at present it's up to the landlord to go through the civil courts to get an injunction). Now the Home Secretary Sajid Javid has announced a review of the law to do just that. In the meantime there are limited options to deal with the nuisance caused by these incursions. You may have seen the caravans parked near Stop 24 service station off Junction 11. On 06 February officers from the District Council together with Kent Legal Services and Kent Police served a Community Protection Warning on the occupants of each vehicle. If they do not cease the antisocial behaviour listed on the warning they can be fined up to £2,500. Similar encampments across the district have cost landowners thousands of pounds to evict and they left considerable amounts of rubbish. Please take sensible precautions to protect your land.

On 13 February the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government announced the award of a further £1.25m to the District Council to help fund the planning for Otterpool Park Garden Town. This brings the total received from the Government to £2.8m to date with the prospect of further support towards the infrastructure costs. A number of people have raised concerns with me about the new traffic calming scheme on the A20. Such schemes receive a safety audit once they've been in place a few months and I am sure there will be changes to this one. The District Manager for Highways in our area has assured me that she has several matters she will be raising. The closure of the M20 in both directions by Highways England earlier this year was needed to put in place the bridges for the new Junction 10a. Highways England maintains that they directed the diverted traffic away from Sellindge but we all know that many HGVs chose to cut through the village. As well as the Junction 10a works, Highways England is working to a very tight deadline to complete works to the M20 before the end of March and Brexit. Highways England does not need permission from Kent Highways to close the motorway either completely or partially but they do need to co-ordinate what they do with Kent Highways. I have made sure that the Director of Highways at KCC is aware of the problems that the works on the M20 have been causing in Sellindge as well as the problems of the new traffic calming scheme. He and his team have been using all the influence they can to get Highways England to do more by way of mitigation.

Meanwhile works by Kent Highways contractors to repair the footpath along the A20 near Newingreen, strengthening works, patching and pothole repair have also been causing hold ups. These works are scheduled to be complete by the end of March, though the pothole repair programme will carry on as required throughout the year. The pothole repair programme re-started in December and by the end of January our district had 479 potholes filled and 1460 sqm of patching. Please keep reporting any potholes you see.

On 14 February we held our Budget Meeting at KCC and a budget of £988m was set; most of this will be spent on care for the elderly, those with Learning Disabilities and services to protect children. Unlike many other parts of the country we are keeping our network of 99 libraries and a number of discretionary services such as the £8m subsidy to the Young Persons Travelcard as well as introducing payment for this in instalments. It was also agreed to increase spending on Kent's roads. In 2017-18 our budget for roads was £75m, £88.1million in the current year, with £95.7 million earmarked for 2019-20. (This is in addition to the £28.8m that KCC has been allocated for strengthening key roads in advance of Brexit, such as the work currently under way on the A20.)

I am pleased to confirm that I have been able to allocate a £2,000 KCC Member grant to the Sports and Leisure Club in Sellindge towards the cost of repairing their car park. If you know of any local projects that deserve a grant then please let me know.

Finally, some news about Sellindge Primary school. The school is due to be expanded to 30 pupils per year group to provide enough places for growing demand. It's now proposed to provide a two storey building so that the school can take 60 pupils per year group and a report on this will be going to the Children, Young People and Education cabinet Committee at KCC on 29 March.

ST MARY'S CHURCH SELLINDGE

The arrival of March marks the beginning of Lent, a journey of discovery, an opportunity to journey to the foot of the cross, to be challenged by the sacrifice and reassured by the resurrection.

This year in the Stour Downs there is the opportunity to celebrate Shrove Tuesday with a **Pancake Party** at **3pm** on **3rd March** at **Mersham**, and to reflect and prepare for the start of Lent at an **Ash Wednesday s**ervice on **6th March** at **10am in Brabourne** and **7pm in Sellindge**.

There is a theme of joy and celebration contrasting with the challenge of self-examination and questioning: from pancakes to ashes; from the joy of Jesus' baptismal affirmation as the Son with whom God was "well pleased" to temptation in the wilderness; the resurrection and the cross.

In the Stour Downs we celebrate the 1st birthday of the new Parish on the 9th March with a **detective trail** and **coffee** & **cake/lunches/ afternoon teas** around the six churches, culminating with **Pimms & Hymns** at **Smeeth** at **5pm**. With this celebration comes the question of where are we going next- what is it to be this new single Parish with six churches? How might that lead to new things?

The transition to a larger single Parish under one PCC might have a bit of a wilderness feel to it – change is often unsettling and requires adjustment – and in this new Parish we approach things differently to reflect how we best use our resources. This is reflected in the Easter services offered this year, as we seek to come together to worship whilst offering a variety of ways to observe Easter across the six communities in the Parish.

It was the Spirit that led Jesus into the wilderness. We might ask where the Spirit is leading us? What is God doing in the Stour Downs – where are we being led to be church for the communities we serve? Lent has a theme of journeying. Where are you journeying to? That might be a question of journeying together as The Stour Downs Parish, or our individual journeys of life and faith. In this time of reflection in Lent, there are **Lent Lunches at Smeeth Oak Room on Fridays at 12-2pm from 15th March to 5th April,** in which there will be a chance to explore the ministry of Vincent Van Gogh and the film *Loving Vincent*. It might be a physical journey as a part of the Lent Challenge to "virtually" walk from Durham Cathedral to Smeeth (via cathedrals on the way) on a treadmill at the Oak Room!
