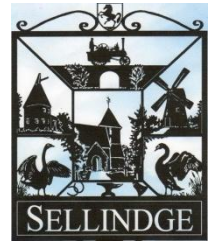

MARCH STORMS

March started quite breezy but on the weekend of the 9th and 10th the Village was affected quite badly by the March Storms, with Storm Gareth and Storm Hannah having an average wind speed of 40mph, with gusts of 50 to 60mph which brought down various trees throughout the Village with Southenay Lane being blocked for some time.



However the worse damage caused in the Village by the storms was that the complete roof section of the garages in Greenfields was ripped completely off. Substantial damage was done to the garages themselves and several vehicles that were parked within, there was also substantial damage was done to the house and vehicles next to them and several gardens. But March lived up to its name and ends like a Lamb.

MEADOW GROVE

The clearance of the Meadow Grove open space is progressing well, with all the brambles now cleared both in the main piece by the main road and at the further end of the road.

The next job will be to remove all the bramble roots, so the area can be sown with grass seed.



The ancient bridge has been uncovered and the plan is to get Heritage England to survey the bridge, and then look into getting it restored. The bridge most certainly pre dates the coming of the railway, but could even be much older.



Your Parish Council met for their monthly meeting on 12th March.

Prior to the commencement of the meeting, we were lucky to have Ian McClintock attend who gave a short presentation on his role for supporting the Parishes affected by the possible Otterpool Park Development. Yes he is employed by the Folkestone & Hythe District Council, but as some-one who has been in a similar situation in his own Parish of Great Chart with Singleton and the development of Chilmington Green has a vast amount of knowledge on how to approach the application when it goes 'public'.

During the open session of the meeting questions were asked about the traffic monitoring cameras that have been erected by the motorway / railway bridge and at the junction of Otterpool Lane. These are for monitoring the traffic should it become necessary once Brexit is upon us; although we do not know when this will happen.

Various questions were asked about the village green and how would people be able to use it. The reply was that the Parish Council have always said it would be a public open space. How this will be monitored and what rules and regulations –if any – are required will be considered nearer the time the Parish Council is offered the land. There are various legal hoops that have to be negotiated; therefore, nothing definitive can be stated here this evening.

Planning items

It was agreed that a representative should attend the Planning Committee meeting to object to the development on land adjacent to The Mount. As the Clerk was on holiday Cllr Harris volunteered and he and Cllr Fursdon attended. However, the vote went against the concerns of the Parish Council.

There was a discussion, which the Chairman allowed members of the public to become involved in, and this was the road names for the second phase of the Taylor Wimpey development. There is still some negotiation going on with this, so will be able to confirm all of the names in the next newsletter.

The agenda had been kept as concise as possible in case the presentation and question time over ran.

The next meeting of your Parish Council is on Tuesday 9th April at 7.00pm in the Durling hall.

A few residents have contacted me about my last KCC report to ask for more information and to clarify points about the various roadworks. There's always a lot to squeeze into the newsletter and hard to judge how much detail people need. I am also very happy to meet with individuals who want to know more.

For those wanting more information about the proposed expansion of Sellindge school there's a full report available in the papers for the meeting on 28 March of the Children. Young People and Education Cabinet Committee. You can access these on www.kent.gov.uk together with a webcast of the meeting.

01 March was Secondary School Offer Day. There were 17,595 applications from Kent pupils for places at Secondary School a rise of just under 3% compared with the year before. Despite this increase the number of Kent pupils getting a place at one of their four listed schools has increased and 79% got their first preference school.

Storm Gareth and industrial action by French Customs Officers led to Operation Stack being implemented on 13 and 14 March between junctions 8 and 9 of the M20. It was a reminder that whatever happens with Brexit we need plans in place to cope when cross Channel traffic is disrupted. Kent County Council is part of the *Kent Resilience Forum* which includes Kent Police, Highways England (responsible for the motorways) and many other public organisations. They have been planning for scenarios of varying degrees of seriousness. KCC has been updating its website with information as it is released and, by the time you read this, we shall have debated the latest update on Brexit at our Council Meeting on 21 March. As whatever I write will be instantly out of date, please look at the website for the latest information.

Another issue much in the news is knife crime. We are fortunate in Kent not to have the level of knife crime that happens in our big cities and we want to make sure we avoid the gang culture that seems to fuel this type of violence. I am therefore pleased to report that Kent has secured £1.3m from the Government's Supporting, Against Youth Crime Fund to help prevent young people becoming involved in gangs and youth violence. The money will be used to fund mentoring and community support workers in a joint project involving KCC, Medway Council, the Metropolitan Police and the Kent Police and Crime Commissioner. The grant will also be used to fund more intelligence operations provide training for staff, young people and parents about the dangers of 'County Lines' drug trafficking and gangs. Earlier this year I met (and presented a Tryangle award to) a Kent teenager who had been involved in 'County Lines'. He had turned his life around and was now working for KCC to stop young people like him getting sucked into criminal activity. It shows that young lives can be saved and the hope is this project will save more of them.

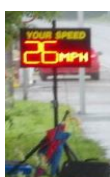

ST MARY'S CHURCH SELLINDGE

As we continue to journey through the period of Lent towards Easter, how are you doing with things you might have given up or taken up for Lent? If you look at our Facebook page, St Mary's in Sellindge has been encouraging us all to do one act of kindness every day, with a creative challenge for each of these 40 days. I know that many people are trying to use Lent as a time to say no to plastic, and really try to cut down or even eliminate the use of plastic packaging.

We are being reminded more and more of our unnecessary waste, with a growing current awareness of an overuse of plastic and the damage this is doing to our world, especially the effects on our seas. We seem to have a throw-away culture. With an increase in material wealth and aspirations, often we are too quick to just get rid of things. I am sure there are many who remember the days of 'make do and mend' – repairing and reusing items – and when things were made to last.

As we approach Easter the Cross and Resurrection remind us that there is nothing too broken for God. The Cross is a place of despair, loss and darkness, but this leads to the light and life of the Resurrection: darkness leads to light and new life. Through Jesus, what was broken is made whole.

The Bible has many stories of how God uses the seemingly broken or irreparable to work out his purpose. Our own lives are often made up of times of despair, as well as joy, that make us who we are. Yet, in our human vision the immediate shadows, the damage and hurt, the uphill struggle, can mask any vision of a brighter future or of wholeness. The brokenness is all we see; giving up or throwing away seems the only course of action. However, St Paul encourages us to "keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, on whom our faith depends from beginning to end. He did not give up because of the cross!" (Hebrews 12:1-2 *Good News Bible*).

Whatever challenges are ahead – or with you now – keep running, making running repairs – strengthened by a God who brings new life to the broken.

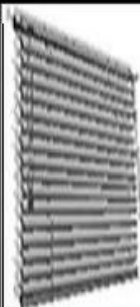

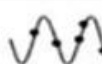
