



Your Parish Council met at the beginning of April; at the meeting it was announced that only 5 people had stood for the coming Parish Council Elections. Given that there had been a number of people expressing an interest it seems strange that no other names were put forward.

Those elected unopposed are, Stan Bull, Nigel Fursdon, Chris Mason, Chris Brace and David Harris.

Therefore, we have 4 vacancies, so if anyone is interested in becoming a Parish Councillor do contact me at the Parish Council office or by email or phone. (Details elsewhere in the newsletter or on the website)

A number of issues were raised during the Open Session, and all were answered.

Susan Carey gave her usual informative updates on all things County, with, I expect the finer details to be included in the Newsletter, as did Jenny Hollingsbee.

Both Planning applications that had been received in time for the meeting were supported by Parish Councillors and the Clerk reminded everyone that comments for the Otterpool Park are required to be in by 27<sup>th</sup> May, to the District Council. Your Parish Council is still waiting for the paper plans and other documents to be received. Once they have arrived anyone interested will be to come and view.

While writing this, it has been reported that damage has been done to the phone box by Greenfields, this was paid for by money from the Parish Council and Kent County Councillor grant, so it is money that has now got to be found again! If you have any information, please let the Clerk know at the Office or contact the police on 101 who have been informed. The number if you have any information is 3ZWYG3H4ET, or you can phone Crimestoppers, you will not have to give your name or other personal details and is a free phone call.

The Parish Council have had conversations with our local PCSO, he is asking that if you see any anti-social behaviour do report, otherwise we will not be able to prevent or stop it.

The next meeting of the Parish Council is on Tuesday May 14<sup>th</sup> in the Durling hall and will start at 7.00pm. The Annual Parish Assembly will take place on Friday 31<sup>st</sup>. It will start at 7.00pm also in the Durling Hall and is an informal gathering, there will be some light refreshments and a chance to meet your Parish Councillors. # FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Elham Valley Ward. susan.carey@kent.gov.uk 01303 670 561

I attended the Parish Council meeting on 09 April where we discussed the road closures and diversions for the repair works and the proposed expansion of Sellindge School in two stages to ensure there are sufficient places for the future More generally on schools, last month I reported that 79% of pupils in Kent were allocated a place at their first choice secondary school. The figures are now out for primary school pupils and show that 89% of pupils were offered a place at their first choice of school and 97% offered a place at a school named by their parents on their application. There is a specialist team at KCC to help advise parents on the appeal system (I'm happy to help as well) and the second round of offers will be made on 12 June.

Most of us have had emails, phone calls or someone on the doorstep with a plausible but false tale and I know several residents who've been scammed out of money. Quite apart from the financial loss it can be devastating for someone to realise they've been conned and it's those living on their own who are the most vulnerable as these criminals are adept at making friends. People are often ashamed to admit they have been taken in and some even refuse to believe the scammers are not their friends.

What can be done? First of all, use your common sense. Does it sound too good to be true? Have you really won a contest you haven't entered? Would someone you know contact you for urgent assistance because they've been mugged on holiday abroad? (The British Consulate will always arrange repatriation of UK nationals in trouble overseas). Be wary if people want things from you urgently. Don't let yourself be rushed. Ask a trusted family member or friend for their view. (You can also ask me).

There's plenty of information about scams and how to deal with them on <u>www.kent.gov.uk</u> (search for scams). You can take a free 20-minute online learning course and become a Friend Against Scams. You can also become a Scam Marshal forwarding scam mail you receive to the National Trading Standard (NTS) Scams Team so it can be investigated. Anyone concerned that someone they know may be falling victim to scammers can report their concerns online via KCC Trading Standards or ring Citizens Advice consumer helpline: 03454 04 05 06

Let's remember that most people are honest, helpful and kind and that's particularly true in our area. Please look out for your neighbours and don't let people become vulnerable through loneliness.

# VEGETATION

Dear Resident

Every year throughout the spring and summer KCC Highways & Transportation receive numerous complaints regarding trees, hedges and other vegetation, which overhang the highway from private property. This matter can pose a number of problems for people trying to use the footways, especially if they are trying to pass with buggies, wheel chairs and scooters. It would be greatly appreciated if you could ensure that any trees and hedges that are bordering the Highway are maintained and cut back to your boundary



which would greatly benefit all Highway users. This will help us all keep the highway safe and prevent the need for KCC Highways & Transportation writing to you requesting that you cut back your vegetation.

So that you are aware of our requirements, please refer to the text below.

## If the boundary of your property borders the footway, then please be aware that:

- The full width of the footway/pavement must be available for use by pedestrians.
- As well, there must be a minimum height clearance over the footway/pavement of 2.1 metres / 7 feet for any vegetation.

## If the boundary of your property borders the carriageway, then please be aware that:

- If you have vegetation that overhangs into the road, there must be a minimum height clearance of 5 metres / 16 feet, to accommodate buses and HGV's that may use the road.
- If your property is rural, then vegetation should be 0.45 metres / 1'6" feet behind the edge of the road and all signs need to be kept clear of foliage for at least 20 metres.

Also, I would ask that you pay special attention to your trees, hedges and vegetation if your property is on or near a junction, and/or inside bend of the road, to maintain maximum visibility for road users. ### PARISH OF THE STOUR DOWNS - ST MARY'S CHURCH SELLINDGE

One of the many joys of coming to live in this beautiful Parish of Stour Downs are the abundance of places to find a quiet space, often on a countryside walk with my dog. Quiet places produce peace and contentment. Noise breeds confusion. Order is regained in silence.

Public places have become so congested with noise that it makes them uncomfortable. Our culture has become so noisy with technology, industry, entertainment and transportation that we seldom find time and place for quiet. We might yearn for times when we can be quiet or just still, or to think, or to find time to listen to God.

Quiet spaces play a very important role in stories in the Bible. Jesus sought space to be alone with God during much of His life on earth, often retreating from the multitudes for quiet reflection. Moses went alone to the mountain to speak with God, and whilst there he received the Ten Commandments. Daniel risked death to cease from his labours three times a day to withdraw and pray.

The gentle hymn 'Be still for the presence of Lord' affirms that 'the presence of the Lord is moving in this place'. We are blessed with six historic places of worship in our Parish which have been spaces that the Lord has been moving in for centuries, the ancient walls seeped in the prayers of generations. I aim to widen the opportunity for all our Churches to be open in the daytime for people to find a place of quiet and stillness.

In the coming month, can you take the challenge to make the time to just be still, or perhaps to sit and listen and wait for God: can you find the time to make the appointment that requires nothing of us really- just our presence and commitment to find the space and switch off the noise...
