The Annual Council Meeting of your 'New' Parish Council took place on 14th May. Only 5 people from around just over 1600 residents listed on the electoral role stood for election: these were elected un-opposed, and they are Stan Bull – who was elected Chairman for the coming year to May 2020

Nigel Fursdon – who continues to be Chairman of the Planning Committee

Chris Mason – who continues to be Chairman of the Finance and General Purposes Committee

Chris Brace and David Harris.

The Parish Council would like to welcome the re-election of Jenny Hollingsbee and Susan Carey and are confident that the great working relationship we have with them will continue.

It has been noted that some residents are placing their grass and hedge cuttings in Meadow Grove.

The reason this area is being cleared is so that the ground can be rotavated and then grass seed would be sown to enhance the area. It is worth noting that this is fly tipping and if the person who is responsible is found, then legal action can be taken.

One of the School Governors approached the Parish Council for a grant towards the 'Community Cohesion'.

After the last Ofsted Report this was something that could possibly be improved. There are two parts to the application. The first part is for £90 to obtain the required documentation that is required, and after some deliberation your Parish Council was happy to agree the 1st phase of the grant.

The second part will cost just over £700, and this will be considered at a later date.

While speaking of grants, if you are involved in a non-profit organisation in Sellindge, and have a specific project in mind, do let the Parish Clerk know. It may be that you could apply for some funding from either the Parish Council or from the Community Fund.

In the last Newsletter, it was reported that your Parish Council is short of four Parish Councillors. To continue to represent all areas and residents of Sellindge these need to be filled.

So if you know some-one, or you feel you could contribute do come forward, and if you are unsure what is expected or think you do not have any knowledge of Parish Councils, there is training available.

All that is really required is that you have the capacity to attend monthly meetings – at the very least – and make decisions on the various issues that are on the agenda. If you have some expertise in Finance, projects, or other specific areas then even better.

The next meeting of your Parish Council is on 11th June in the Durling Hall at 7pm.

We're back! The District Council Election on 02 May saw us top the poll on the second highest turnout (45%) in the District. Thank you to everyone who voted and a special thank you to those who supported us and those who helped our campaign.

We enjoyed seeing so many of you during the election and everyone should have received at least one leaflet from us. We met some of the new residents of the Lees and extend a warm welcome to all who have come to live in the village. It doesn't need to be an election campaign for you to contact us. We are happy to see individuals about any local issues and will do our best to help all our residents.

Following the election the District Council now has 13 Conservatives, 6 Labour, 6 Greens, 2 UKIP, 2 LibDems and 1 Independent. This means that no one group can command a majority on its own and the Council is described as in 'No Overall Control'. As the largest single group (and the one receiving the most votes across the District) it will be for the Conservatives to try to form an executive. With such a mix of parties we are making no predictions about what may happen.

Congratulations are due to the newly elected Sellindge Parish Councillors. We thank all those who have served over the last four years and those elected and re-elected for the next four years. We both attended Sellindge Parish Council on 14 May and, by the time you receive this newsletter, we will have attended the Annual Parish Meeting on 31 May. Several important planning matters are taking place as we write. The outline planning permission for Otterpool Park Garden Town was submitted at the end of February. There have been special briefings for the Parish Councils immediately affected and two public exhibitions, one at Westenhanger Castle which we both attended and one in Folkestone which Jenny also attended. The application is available to read at www.folkestone-

hythe.gov.uk/otterpoolpark/planningapplication Further general information can be found at www.otterpoolpark.org We both support the creation, over 30 to 40 years, of a Garden Town as the best way of delivering the homes and jobs we need for the District and the infrastructure necessary to support them. In April we were given a tour of Estuary View medical centre in Whitstable by its founder, Dr John Ribchester. Rated 'outstanding' by the Care Quality Commission, it serves nearly 30,000 residents and offers a very wide range of services (almost anything that doesn't require a general anaesthetic) including a minor injuries unit. To date, it has had no problems recruiting medical staff because of the variety of treatments it offers which makes the work interesting for the staff. It is our model for the medical centre we want at Otterpool Park and would benefit the whole area. See www.whitstablemedicalpractice.co.uk

Meanwhile the Places and Policies Local Plan which sets out where homes and jobs should be across the whole District was examined in public by a Planning Inspector in May. We will be writing more about this in future reports but want to take the opportunity to correct one particularly misleading item in the map about the Draft Core Strategy put out by the Sellindge and District Residents Association. The blue hatched areas shown as 'More to Come' should more properly be entitled 'Rejected Sites' as these are sites that were submitted to the Council for inclusion but which the Council has already rejected. Jenny is also waiting for a retraction and apology from this group for posting a claim that she has an offshore bank account. She has not and has never had one. It is sad to see such blatant lies peddled. We have both attended several village events over the last few weeks and Jenny has been asked to continue her role as a School Governor at Sellindge Primary School.

We had our May meeting on Friday May 17th, with an illustrated talk on 'Paddlers, Waders and Swimmers'. This was a most interesting and amusing presentation by Don Wilks with his own photographs of scores of different seabirds and wildfowl, all taken in east Kent at various wetlands.

The next meeting is for members only, with the next open meeting on 19th July with a talk by Sue Scrivens entitled Flora of Sri Lanka.

It's good to get a response to the newsletter items and a reader contacted me about my recent item on scams in which I said the British Consulate would always help British Citizens who needed repatriation from abroad. She pointed out that this is not a right but discretionary help and gave a link to this advice:

I'm happy to make this correction but I'd still urge you to treat with great suspicion any contact from someone asking for funds to be sent to help them get home from abroad in an emergency.

Ofsted and the CQC (Care Quality Commission) published a report in May critical of the care for children with special education needs and disabilities (SEND) in Kent. This is an area that KCC and the NHS are both responsible for separately and in partnership and, if you would like to know more, a report was made to KCC members at the 07 May meeting of the Children's, Young People and Education Cabinet Committee which you can see on the KCC website. This is an area where we must improve.

KCC holds more than 3,000 handwritten registers in our Kent History and Library Centre in Maidstone and they are of great interest to people researching their ancestry. These records have now been digitised and there are now 2.6 million fully indexed baptism, Wedding banns, marriage and burial records spanning more than 400 years of Kent history available online. The service is free to use at KCC libraries and you can find out more at www.kentarchives.org.uk

The mild winter weather has had a double benefit for our roads. Firstly the roads have come through the winter with less damage than usual and secondly we have been able to continue the pothole repair programme almost without interruption during the winter months. Repairs are ongoing so do please keep reporting the potholes and blocked drains either online at www.kent.gov.uk or by phone at 03000 41 81 81 in office hours and on 03000 41 91 91 for emergencies out of office hours.

I recently had a briefing from the KCC officers about their proposed response to the Otterpool Park Garden Town Masterplan. They have looked at the traffic modelling in detail and the impact of the extra homes and jobs over the lifetime of the project. They have also looked at the plans for education provision including nursery places, primary schools, secondary schools and SEN provision. They will be requesting funding from the developer for both road improvements, public transport and education as part of the planning process. It is normal for new developments to be required to fund infrastructure but rare to have such a long-term project. It's a chance to get both land and funding in place and in step (not lagging behind) with the growth of the new town.
