

Your Parish Council met on 11th June in the Durling Hall, there was no Jenny or Susan as both were attending meetings elsewhere, but, I did read out their reports and these will probably be included in the newsletter elsewhere as is the normal procedure.

Mentioning Newsletters, there was some concern raised by a Councillor that having reports from our Ward and Kent County Councillors could make it look like the Parish Council was allowing party politics in to the newsletter. The Parish Council did have a detailed debate on this, but due to the item not being on the agenda, no lawful decision could take place; therefore, the subject of the Newsletter will be on the agenda for the July meeting. So if you have any suggestions, ideas, or any other comments on the Newsletter, then either come to the Parish Council meeting in July or send the comments to me at the Parish Council email address.

Your Parish Council have co-opted two new councillors; their names are Stephen Parish from Grove Bridge and Robert Bristow from Swan Lane. Janet Tritton of Greenfields, who was a previous Councillor, also put her name forward and so she was co-opted as well. This means there is still one vacancy to fill.

Now onto the normal and sometimes boring part of the meeting!

Under planning, Nigel presented his detailed report on Otterpool Garden Town, he had produced this from comments made by Parish Councillors and residents. This report was adopted and it was agreed it should be placed on the Parish Council website. It was also noted that the tree preservation order for the land adjoining Grove House has been signed off and is now in place; any work that is now required will have to be applied for before it is carried out.

There have been some concerns reported back to me about the number of temporary sets of traffic lights through the village. While it is an inconvenience there is nothing the Parish Council can do.

Work has to be carried out safely for the people working on the projects they are dealing with.

It is now customary to have traffic lights while work is carried out and these companies will have applied and been given permission by the relevant department of Kent Highways.

For those of you living at the top of Swan Lane, you will be pleased to note that along with the various books, puzzles etc, that you can swap, the defibrillator or AED as they are sometimes called is now fixed in.

As a reminder Tom from Hopkins Ltd is looking at arranging some training on how to use this, so if you did not come to the annual assembly and would like some training please contact me and I can pass your name on to Tom.

Dog Poo Bags – The Parish Council is still providing these for use free of charge, members consider that this has made a difference to the village. Simply come to the Parish Council office Tues 9am - Noon & Fri 3pm - 5.30pm

Since our last report we have had a particularly busy time in attending the Annual Parish Meetings (including the Sellindge Annual Meeting on 31 May) which nearly every Parish in our area holds in May. We have also had our own Annual Meeting of Folkestone & Hythe District Council at which the Conservative Group formed an administration with support from the two UKIP and one Independent Councillors. Jenny will continue to be Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Communities with additional responsibility for Lifeline, Area Officers and Street homeless. Jenny also continues to serve on the Planning & Licensing Committee and Susan on the Scrutiny Committee. The Scrutiny Committee held its first meeting on 18 June and received an interesting presentation from the Community Safety Partnership which includes KCC's Social Services, Kent Fire & Rescue Service, Kent Police and Folkestone & Hythe District Council and more. They spoke about their work to tackle violent crime, unlawful encampments, human trafficking and more. They also answered questions about the Public Space Protection Order which gives both the council officers and Kent Police powers to act against a range of anti-social behaviour across the district. Susan took the opportunity to ask Kent Police to do more to support our local Speedwatch volunteers with some Police action against speeding drivers.

The consultation period for the Otterpool Park Garden Town Masterplan has now closed. The next stage is for the council to evaluate the responses and where necessary adjust the plans and/or provide more information before the plan goes before the Planning Committee (the whole Council is likely to act as the Planning Committee as we did for the Folkestone seafront development). If and when the Masterplan is agreed, each phase of the development will also need detailed planning permission showing what the buildings would look like and this would also go out for consultation. It's a very thorough and time-consuming process. See www.otterpoolpark.org for more information. The District Council recently hosted a visit from KCC Councillors who serve on the Growth, Economic Development & Communities Cabinet Committee. They were shown the Otterpool Park site as well as the regeneration projects in Folkestone which KCC has helped fund such as the Quarterhouse in Tontine Street. They were particularly impressed by the work of Creative Folkestone and if you have not seen Folkestone recently you will notice a big improvement especially in the area near the harbour. See www.creativefolkestone.org.uk for more information.

Over the years we have been able to give District Council grants to a variety of projects across our ward ranging from defibrillators to village halls and youth groups. We already have a queue of projects asking for support but if you have a good community project you'd like us to consider then do please get in touch.

In the last month we have between us been to many local events and those in Sellindge include the Tabletop Fair and the Coffee 'N' Chat sessions in the Durling Hall. We hope to see many of you at forthcoming village events and we are always happy to meet individually with residents who would like to see us.

FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Elham Valley Ward, Susan, carey@kent.gov.uk 01303 670 561 Charges for soil, rubble and plasterboard were introduced at Kent's Household Waste Recycling Centres from 03 June. The charge is £4 per bag of soil or rubble and £6 per sheet of plasterboard with a limit (as before) of no more than 5 bags/items a day. Experience in other areas is that charges do not lead to increased flytipping as most flytipping is done by criminal gangs and consists of items that have been and continue to be free of charge to dispose of in HWRCs. KCC has also announced that we will open an extra HWRC to serve the Tonbridge and Malling area and will commit £250,000 to fund more work by Kent Police to catch flytippers. Please take extra care if you employ someone to remove your waste as a recent change in the law means that if your waste is flytipped you can be prosecuted as well as the person who did the flytipping. Anyone moving waste for payment needs a licence and you should ask to see it (and ideally take a copy/photo). The reason for introducing the charges is partly to save money (disposal of such waste costs KCC over £1m a year) and the introduction of charges by neighbouring councils which has led to more people from outside Kent using our HWRCs which increases KCC's costs and overcrowds the HWRCs for our residents. As soil, rubble and plasterboard are not household waste we could simply refuse to accept them but a small charge seems a good compromise for those with amounts of soil, rubble and plasterboard that don't justify the hire of a skip. Household waste is still to be free of charge for householders to dispose of at the HWRCs. I was part of the generation that had Measles, German Measles (Rubella) and Mumps as a child but the MMR vaccine has spared many children these illnesses and the risk of complications. Unfortunately the level of MMR cover has dropped and in May five cases of Measles were confirmed in the Canterbury area. KCC's Public Health staff advise that if you're unsure whether you or your children have had two MMRs, first check your child's Red Book or contact your GP surgery. You do not need additional MMR vaccines if you and your children have all had two MMR vaccines. Measles is a highly infectious viral illness and symptoms typically include high fever, sore, red, watery eyes, coughing, aching and feeling generally unwell, a blotchy red brown rash, which usually appears 2-4 days after the initial symptoms. If you think you could have measles contact your GP and stay away from places where you could be in contact with lots of people until at least four days after the rash appears.

You may have seen reports about the Kent Superannuation Fund's decision to withdraw a £263m investment in the Woodford Equity Fund. The Woodford Equity Fund has frozen withdrawals. Whilst this is a large amount of money, the Kent Superannuation Fund was valued as £6.4bn in April 2019 and it grew by £420m between January – March this year. It is one of the best performing local government pension funds and neither the payment of pensions nor services to our residents are impacted by the Woodford freeze. (If you'd like to know more then please contact me direct). This story has prompted people to ask about the £50m deposit made by KCC some years ago in Icelandic banks. The £50m was fully recovered with £2m in interest making a total of £52m. Inevitably the good news about the recovery (plus interest) did not receive much attention, I'm pleased to have the excuse to report it again. If you are coming to the Kent Show (5, 6 and & July at the Detling Showground) do look out for the KCC stand (number 348) our theme is the Year of Green Action and there will be information on what people can do to improve the environment and KCC's work to reduce its carbon emissions.


