ROAD CLOSURES

Plain Road Smeeth / Stonehill Sellindge

Road closed from Monday July 29th for up to 14 weeks. As we go to print we hear this may be postponed but not confirmed.

A261 Hythe Road, Pedlinge

This is the road to Hythe from Newingreen, where you go down Hythe Hill. Road closed from Thursday August 8th to approx. August 11th.

M20 Closures between junctions 10 and 11

Both London bound and coast bound full closure.

This is to install overhead gantries and resurface the Motorway.

Closed Friday August 2nd 10pm re-opening at 6am Saturday August 3rd. The motorway will be open all day on the Saturday but will close again Closed Saturday August 3rd 10pm re-opening at 6am on Mon Aug 5th.

The M20 will again be closed both London and Coast bound This is a full weekend closure.

Closed on Friday August 16th from 8pm and will not re-open until Monday August 19th at 6am.

As normal your Parish Council met at the beginning of July to consider items on an agenda. There are the usual heading, planning, finance etc. Below is a short precis of the meeting; the minutes will be placed on the website after they have been agreed. This report will also include issues that have been raised by various members of the public that have caused concern.

Under planning decisions, the detailed application for the second phase of the Taylor Wimpey development was agreed by the District Council. I hope you will be pleased to hear that all of the issues raised by the Parish Council when inspecting the plans, prior to approval were considered by TW and implemented.

The applications that were considered for comments were Y19/0697/FH, Holly Cottage. Erection of a detached garage and this was supported, and Y19/0562/FH, Horton Priory. Which was objected to on the grounds that the work had already been carried out and the application should have stated that is was a retrospective application. The other concern was a possible increase in the number of traffic movements.

Under the finance headings the Clerk read out the report from the internal auditor and this was adopted. If you would like to see a copy it can be viewed in the office.

Your Parish Council also discussed ways in which they could assist the Church in maintaining their graveyard, after which it was agreed that with the anonymous donations of two amounts of £300 the Parish Council would match this with another £300, making a total of £900 towards having the graveyard cleared to start with and then looking at ways it can be maintained for nature, but also with visitors in mind. More information will follow either from Rev. Chris or the Parish Council as the project progresses.

There was no correspondence to consider as everything that had been sent to your Clerk was forwarded to each Councillor by email, as information only.

Carried over from the last meeting or your Parish Council, was the subject of Susan and Jenny's contribution to the Newsletter each month. A Parish Councillor had been approached by a member of the public, asking for this to be placed on an agenda, as they felt it was politically biased. The discussion that took place was very detailed; the outcome was that both these reports should continue.

They were well received by Sellindge residents who found them useful to keep up to date with the work that both Susan and Jenny do within the village, and at both the District and County levels.

As a reminder please note that parking on the pavements and verges should not take place.

The road calming was put in as requested by a large number of residents when the TW development was being considered. It is hoped that these new verges can be planted with wild flowers later in the year to brighten up the village in the spring and summer to encourage bees, butterflies and other insects.

You will note that the editor has placed on the front page the dates for the Motorway closures for the coming weeks. These are a mixture of complete closures in both directions. Your Parish Council has been having meetings with Highways England on a number of occasions recently and due to these meetings we have been able to obtain improved diversion routes. It is hoped that the increased signage will encourage more vehicles to avoid the village. The next meeting of your Parish Council is on 13th August in the Durling Hall at 7pm, as always do come along if you have any questions you would like answered or alternatively rather than wait for the meeting each month you can email, phone or write to the Parish Clerk who will respond directly.

We want to highlight two issues in this month's report. The first is a grant scheme for new boilers, insulation or heating improvements set up under the Government's Energy Company Obligation scheme by the District Council. The grant can cover up to 100% of the cost and if your annual income is under £30,000 a year (after the cost of mortgage or rent) you could be eligible. The second issue is the welcome news that Folkestone & Hythe and Dover District Councils have won £422,000 Government funding for a joint initiative to help the homeless across both districts. The money will fund eight new posts at the charity Porchlight for specialist staff to work with the homeless to combat addictions, deal with mental health problems and generally address the behaviours that have led to rough sleeping. (This is on top of all the work that already goes on to help people who are homeless).

Since our last report Jenny represented our area at the Local Government Association conference where she met Mark Carney, Governor of the Bank of England. As our Armed Forces champion she also attended the 25th birthday party of the Royal Gurkha Rifles on 09 July at Sir John Moore barracks in Folkestone in the presence of HRH Prince Charles. Locally Susan attended the Strawberry tea at St Mary's Church which had an excellent presentation by local metal detectorists including coins found on the site of the new housing next to the Village Hall. Jenny attended the Patients Participation Group, the Sellindge School Summer Fair and helped at the Sellindge Sports & Social Club Boot Fair and we both attended the Parish Council meeting on 09 June.

There have been many complaints about the barrier and 50mph speed limit on the London bound M20 put in place in anticipation of Brexit. KCC Leader Paul Carter has written to Chris Grayling, Secretary of State for Transport, to press the case for this to be removed until needed and he has also added a protest about how Highways England (the Government Agency responsible for the national motorway network) are dealing with roadworks on the M2 which KCC believes should be done with partial closures and shorter hours over a longer period. Mike Whiting, the KCC Cabinet Member for Highways has written to Highways England about the M20 closures which have also been imposed with little thought for their impact on the KCC Highways network. I have also urged KCC's Director of Highways and the KCC staff who deal with Highways England do all they can to reduce the impact of their works on the communities that suffer when the motorway is closed and they have cancelled some of the planned roadworks on our network to cope with the traffic Highways England displaces. Your Parish Council has also been doing what it can and a meeting has been arranged with a representative of Highways England. Highways England have made some adjustments to their works but their priority remains their targets for motorway maintenance / building rather than their effect on us.

If you want to make your views known where they are welcomed then please go the KCC website and take part in the consultations currently under way. There's the 'Energy and Low Emissions Strategy' which aims to make Kent carbon neutral by 2050 (and KCC's own estate by 2030). This means reducing emissions to zero, eliminating poor air quality, reducing fuel poverty and delivering an affordable, clean and secure energy supply for Kent. There's also the 'Kent Biodiversity Strategy' which is about the restoration and creation of habitats for wildlife and plants. The other consultation I want to highlight is the 'Kent and Medway Domestic Abuse Strategy' an important issue that deserves more attention.
