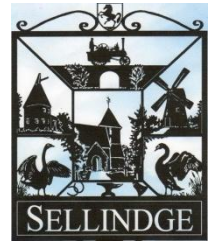

ROAD CLOSURES

HIGHWAYS ENGLAND M20 Closures between junctions 10 and 11

Both London bound and coast bound full closure.

This is to demolish the Highfield Lane Bridge over the Motorway. The M20 will be closed both London and Coast bound this is a full weekend closure.

Closed on Friday September 6th from 8pm and will not re-open until Monday September 9th at 6am.

As part of a contingency Highways England have also booked the weekend from Friday September 13th until Monday September 16th, but Highways England have **stressed** that this weekend will only be used in the event that due to extreme weather they were unable to do the demolition work in the first weekend.

The July Minutes were agreed are already on the website for anyone to read. Members of the public raised various issues which were all able to be answered, by either the Clerk or others in the hall.

With regards to planning, there was a report from the District Council on the proposed Otterpool Park, I have a copy in the office should any of you wish to have a look at it, or it can be found the Folkestone & Hythe website if you look for is a 'Post Consultation Planning Summary report'.

Other planning applications considered was one in Swan Lane; this was a retrospective application for a fence, Members supported this and voiced their surprise that an application was required – it appears there may have been changes to the planning policy which no-one had picked up – the application was supported.

With new Councillors, and new people in the village that may attend the Parish Council meetings, it was decided that there should be a proper policy for the public to understand the roles and when and when not they are allowed to speak, this policy will be placed on the website.

A final debate that took place was the amount of work load in the office, which has increased. An outstanding project is to photograph and log all of the headstones and other information on the burials, so if anyone of you is interested in helping with this please contact the Parish Council office and speak to the Clerk.

The next meeting is on 10th September, at 7pm in the Durling Hall so do try and come along.

SPEEDWATCH

For months now I have included a slip in the Sellindge Village News, for Speedwatch volunteers. We have had a few people come forward, but nowhere enough.

Speedwatch does work, when it was used a few years ago, there was a marked reduction in speeding.

One of the reasons that we got the reduction to 30MPH and the traffic calming was due to having Speedwatch. It is important that we monitor this section, proving that this section is working, may help the Parish Council prove the need for the whole Village to be reduced to 30MPH

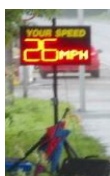
People reported via Speedwatch will on their 1st and 2nd get a warning letter from the Police, being reported a 3rd time and the Police will call round to see them, if they carry on they will start getting fines and points on their licence.

I have noticed on the various village Facebook pages, posts saying that there is a need for speed cameras at each end of the Village, some say one in the middle as well. Well we will not be getting these, due to there being no proof of any speeding problems in the Village.

However if we got the Speedwatch up and running again, we could build a strong evidence base, which the Parish Council could use to prove the point that there is a problem.

So have you an hour or two that you can volunteer for Speedwatch, the more people volunteer the less hours needed.

We have written before about the excellent 'No Use Empty project'. Launched in 2005 by KCC it has provided interest free loans to owners to bring empty properties back into use as homes and when the money is repaid it is recycled to deliver more schemes. So far 5,911 long-term empty properties have been brought back into use across Kent all of them meeting the 'decent home' standard. Since 2016, Folkestone & Hythe District Council has joined with KCC to 'turbo charge' the No Use Empty scheme with £300,000 per year (totalling £2.1m to date) to tackle some of the larger and more challenging projects in the District.

Now the scheme is being extended to include commercial properties with £1 million funding from the South East Local Enterprise Partnership. This money will be used to help redevelop eight commercial units and 28 residential units above them in the town centres of Dover, Folkestone and Thanet by March 2022. You can find out more about the scheme at www.no-use-empty.org.uk It's a great initiative that provides more homes and improves lives for everyone in the neighbourhood.

Another blight on our area is flytipping and we can all help to reduce this by being vigilant about how our own household waste is removed.

Everybody has a duty to ensure their waste ends up in the right place. This applies to any waste produced at home including household refuse, garden waste or bulkier waste, such as mattresses or white goods.

To check your rubbish is being disposed of correctly you should ask the following questions:

- **Name and vehicle details**
- **Where they are taking your waste**
- **Do they have an Upper Tier Waste Carriers' License?**

Anyone collecting waste from another person must have a license and you **must** ask to see a copy of their license **before** instructing them to do the job. You can call the Environment Agency on 08708 506 506 to request an instant waste carrier validation check, or check the public register online at

<https://environment.data.gov.uk/public-register/view/search-waste-carriers-brokers>

If they turn out not to be registered then please report them to the authorities.

The starting amount for commercial waste to be correctly disposed is around £60 so if you're only being asked £20 there is a good chance it's going to be dumped in our countryside.

The fine for a 'duty of care' offence is £150, with no early payment reduction. Like any fixed penalty notice, this will discharge your liability for the offence if paid, but if it's not paid then you may be prosecuted at the Magistrates' Court, where you could get a criminal record and an unlimited fine.

The District Council always investigate reports and seeks to track down and prosecute those responsible. If anyone wishes to report fly-tipping then please do so via:

Are we ready for Brexit in Kent? Well if not, it won't be for lack of effort. Plans were put in place for the anticipated date of 31 March and have now been updated for 31 October. Over £30m has been spent on improvements to the road network and there have been detailed plans agreed with Kent Police and other partners to cope with varying degrees of traffic problems. As ever we are hoping for the best but planning for the worst and there will be a paper of Brexit preparedness going to our County Council meeting on 12 September (papers available week in advance on website). As I write, we know that Chancellor of the Exchequer, Sajid Javid has announced an extra £2.1 billion is to be made available for no-deal Brexit preparation across the UK. Within this figure, the Chancellor is setting aside £344 million to help get new border and customs operations ready. This includes:

- An extra 500 border force officers, meaning up to 1,000 more officers this year.
- Boosting capacity to process UK passport applications this year, helping avoid delays.
- Doubling the support made available for customs agents to train new staff or invest in better IT so businesses can get the support they need to complete customs declarations.
- Improving transport infrastructure around ports and additional funding for 'Operation Brock' to manage traffic disruption in Kent.
- Enhancing support available on government helplines.

In welcoming this extra funding, KCC Leader Paul Carter said, 'We don't yet know whether we are going to have an acrimonious or an amicable split from Europe, but we simply must be prepared for all eventualities. Our preparedness for the March 31 EU Exit was pretty good from a transport perspective – working with the Department for Transport, Kent Police and other partners in preparing for delays at the ports of Folkestone and Dover. However, there were several significant unresolved issues back in March, and questions that were unanswered. These were mainly around how the customs clearance and paperwork system will operate and work.' KCC will continue to raise this issue until we are satisfied it is fully resolved.

Brexit is not the only matter affecting local government and with a new Prime Minister and team in place KCC has been pressing the case for more funding for infrastructure, care for the elderly, children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities as well as preparations for Brexit. There will be a paper on Brexit at our County Council meeting on 12 September which will be available on our website a week in advance

STOUR DOWNS PARISH CHURCHES – ST MARY'S CHURCH SELLINDGE

The 50th anniversary of man landing on the moon has been celebrated recently. The celebrations have reignited a debate about the purposes of such travel. There is a moral question about the huge resources space exploration requires. In early 1970, this challenge was summed up in a letter written by a nun, Sister Mary Jucunda, who was living and working in Zambia. She wrote to NASA shortly after the moon landings and asked how they could justify spending billions on the Apollo program while she was working with children who were starving because of poverty. The letter made it to the Associate Director of Science at NASA, Ernst Stuhlinger, who argued in his response that developments in technology to achieve space travel will have wide benefits here on earth. He cites, for instance, the use of satellites to monitor crops for the world to improve agricultural efficiency. Today farmers and fisherman of Africa and India can make use of satellite data on their mobile phones. The proportion of the world's population living in extreme poverty has nearly halved and the majority of the world's population now lives in "middle income" countries. Nevertheless, the challenge of hunger and lack of access to clean water remain. This is not because there is not enough to go around, but more a problem of sharing what we do have.

Thomas Hobbes, writing as long ago as the seventeenth century, argued that people often buy things, not because we need them, but because someone else wants them. If Hobbes is right, then everything in the universe potentially becomes a scarce good and there will never be enough to go around. We will only meet the challenge of relieving poverty and hunger when we relate to each other and when we seek to serve each other.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.' *Matthew 20:26-28*

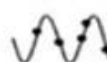
