We would like to add to this year's poppies year on year.....so keep knitting / crocheting – Emma & Margaret.



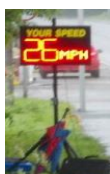
MACMILLAN COFFEE MORNINGS

Your Parish Council met on 10th September for the normal monthly meeting.

The minutes of the August meeting were agreed and should now be on the website.

The report from KCC Councillor Susan Carey was read out by the Parish Clerk.

Jenny Hollingsbee gave a short report which included amongst other things that:

If people see any fly tipping they can report it to the District Council, either via the website of phoning and then it can be removed.

The university at Canterbury that will be training GP's is expected to open next year. This may well benefit local GP's as they will require some work experience in local surgeries.

There were no updates from the Finance & General Purposes Committee to report; these Minutes once signed will be placed on the website.

Your Parish Clerk reported on the meeting with the Highways Steward, that recently took place. However, none of the work requested is going to be carried out unless the Parish Council is prepared to cover some or all of the costs.

More information has been requested and once anything has been agreed there will be an update in this newsletter.

The two planning applications that were on the agenda were supported and these were;

19/0739/FH – Land adjacent to **The Surgery**. Discharge of condition 6 (pond details) and condition 7 (play equipment)

The Clerk advised the Parish Councillors of the play equipment to be installed. The plans were circulated to the Parish Councillors present and the application was **supported**.

19/0932/FH – **Hale House**. Erection of single storey side & rear extension, following removal of existing kitchen. The plans for this application were circulated and discussed. All Parish Councillors present supported the application. There was a concern regarding the flat roof, but the application was supported.

A scheme of delegation was adopted; this is where who does what is agreed. The document, in full, can be found on the Parish Council website. It puts into words what has been happening since the Localism Act 2011 came in to force. Correspondence received through the post is now very little, but your Parish Council still does get some.

The most important received this month is a new regulation for websites that make it law they have to be easily accessible by people with various disabilities – psychological, intellectual and physical. Although your Parish Council does not have to comply until 23rd August 2020, we have started looking at ways we can achieve this.

After having received the information for training volunteers on the Speedwatch, the officer who will be coming out to inspect the sites that were used in the past is now on long term sick so there may be a delay in getting this going again. But if you have volunteered do please be patient.

The next meeting of your Parish Council is on Tuesday 8th October in the Durling Hall at 7pm.

We are sorry to report that there have been grave shortcomings in how regular safety inspections and repairs have been carried out in our social housing. This work is undertaken on behalf of four councils (Folkestone & Hythe, Canterbury, Dover and Thanet) by East Kent Housing. The problems are being rectified as a matter of urgency and Councillors will be considering how best to manage our homes in future. We may take the management back in-house. If any council house tenant would like us to meet with them to answer questions then please let us know and we will either meet with you in your home or at the council offices.

Jenny is the Councillor responsible for our Armed Forces Covenant which is a commitment from the Council to help Armed Forces personnel and their families. Folkestone & Hythe recently received a Silver Award for its work in this area. You can read more about this on the council's website.

We are very pleased to report that the District Council has bought Westenhanger Castle. The castle is currently used as a wedding and conference venue and this use will continue but we hope to improve access to the castle and make it the centrepiece of Otterpool Park Garden Town. We both joined a group of our fellow District Councillors on a tour of the Otterpool Park site and the castle on 20 September and heard more about the plans to make the most of the castle - opening up views, restoring the original approach from the Sellindge direction, restoring the moat and incorporating the 14 acres of parkland into the publicly accessible green space.

A 2-day study tour of garden towns was recently arranged for Councillors from the District Council and the nearest Parish Councils. Susan was able to join them and see the progress made at Alconbury which was an airfield. Two years ago it had a primary school but no occupied houses. People have now moved in and it also has a cricket pitch, an outdoor swimming pool, a business centre, shops and avenues of trees. The original Garden City of Letchworth was also on the itinerary and the plans for building more homes here were shared. We saw part of the three attractive new towns in the Cambridge area and one site where a developer had been able to build homes with no facilities (other than a new roundabout) because the Local Council had tried to block new developments (failing in its statutory duty to designate enough sites) and been overruled by the Planning Inspectorate.

Jenny attended the funeral of Derek Gosling who spent many years on the Steam Special Committee helping raise funds for village and national organisations. Our thoughts are with his family at this time.

Jenny attended the Parish Council and the Sports & Social Club meetings and helped at the Boot Fair. She also attended the AGM of the East Kent Hospitals. Susan supported the Craft Fair at the Village Hall on 15 September and was allowed to add a few stitches to a tapestry being created for St Mary's church.

A reminder that the next meeting of the Sellindge Surgery Patients Group is at 6.30pm on Monday 7 October at the Surgery and will start with a presentation from Ashford Clinical Commissioning Group on 'frailty'.

Anything I write about Brexit will be out of date by the time the newsletter is printed. However, the KCC website www.kent.gov.uk will be updated regularly and has links to information for both residents and businesses. KCC has also made arrangements to switch its call centre to Rochdale if there are problems. Kent Highways have a twitter account @KentHighways which reports traffic problems and local radio will have the latest information from KCC and other organisations. The new arrangements for dealing with delayed traffic for Eurotunnel and Dover Port (known as Operation Brock) should keep this traffic away from our local roads but it does require Kent Police and Highways England to work with Kent Highways and not revert to Operation Stack. KCC is still pressing the Government for other measures we believe will help such as more customs points outside Kent.

I'm pleased to report that KCC has launched a voucher scheme to top up the funding available to community schemes to improve access to superfast broadband. The scheme increases the funding from a maximum of £1,500 to £2,500 per household compared with elsewhere. You only need two households to be a community but the more neighbours who join the more affordable a scheme can become.

More information is on the KCC website (search for 'Kent Broadband Top Up voucher').

There was good news in September about the funding local government receives from the Government towards the cost of local services. Our two biggest budget problems are the large increase in the number of children assessed as needing extra help because of Special Educational Needs or Disability (SEND) and the rise in demand for Adult Social Care. We will receive extra funding for both these areas which will help us meet current demand.

Paul Carter is standing down as Leader of Kent County Council after 14 years in charge. We will elect a new Leader in October. Paul intends to carry on as a local member and wants to continue his work on the integration of social and health care and how to increase the number and take-up of apprenticeships for young people. Paul has put a tremendous amount of work into his role both in Kent and as Chairman of the County Council Network and few people in local government are as knowledgeable or committed as him. His will be big shoes to fill.

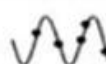
