Having met for its monthly meeting your Parish Councillors considered two planning applications; one supported with no further comments the other supported with, your Parish Council had not received any decisions made by Folkestone & Hyhe District Council.

There was a small amount of correspondence and this included a notice and a request about the Sports and Social Club having a bonfire night.

There were the monthly reports on the condition of the three AED's in the village and all were given a complete clean bill of health.

A Fairly long report covering the whole of the East and West North Downs Police area.

Jenny and Susan were in attendance and gave a useful and informative verbal report, but I won't steal their thunder as they will be placing their reports in the Newsletter.

The Parish Clerk had attended the Clerks National Annual Conference and explained that she had been offered a one off quote of £450.00 for a full sized metal Soldier to commemorate 75th VE day, however, one of the Parish Councillors was unsure about this and after a debate no action was taken.

You may have noted in the local newspaper about catalytic convertors being stolen overnight from parked vehicles. Do make sure that any alarms on your car is activated and if you see anything suspicious do phone the police, give as much information as you can. **DO NOT** approach anyone yourself.

Due to trying to get Highways England to clean the motorway bridge with little success, it was decided that the Parish Council would obtain the required paint and protective anti-graffiti top coat during this winter and carry out the work next year.

There were positive comments from last year so it was agreed to have the two small illuminated Christmas trees hanging from the Village sign again. It is hoped that with some extra funding and or grants so more decorations could be arranged to brighten up the village during this festive period.

Did you know that Folkestone & Hythe District Council has a self-build register? Self-build is not just about 'grand designs', it is also a good way to reduce costs for people wanting to get a foot on the housing ladder. Stamp duty is only paid on the value of the land not the completed house and you can claim back VAT on the allowable costs of your building materials. You also save money by building exactly what you want – the right number of bedrooms, bathrooms etc. and your choice of fittings. Self-build plots will be available in Otterpool Garden Town and it's worth looking at Graven Hill in Bicester (www.gravenhill.co.uk) to see how this can work.

Further shortcomings have emerged at East Kent Housing which manages our 3,619 council homes and, whilst work continues to put this right, we will be consulting about the best option for alternative management. Representatives from the Shepway Tenants and Leaseholders Board (STLB) joined the Folkestone & Hythe District Council's Overview and Scrutiny Committee on 15 October to present their views but if any tenants in Sellindge would like to speak directly with us we are happy to arrange a meeting.

Jenny is the District Council's representative on the Kent & Medway Police & Crime Panel which meets four times a year to review the work of our Police and Crime Commissioner Matthew Scott. At their September meeting she asked whether Kent Police were doing enough to deal with drug dealers openly dealing in our District. The panel next meets on 21 November and is webcast via the KCC website.

We both attended Sellindge Parish Council meeting on 08 October, Jenny also attended the Sellindge Primary School Harvest Assembly and a Governor Briefing. Jenny was also at the Patients' Participation Group at Sellindge Surgery and the meeting of the Sports and Social Club. On 30 October we will both be at an Education and Health briefing by KCC at Westenhanger Castle.

Finally, we would like to welcome new residents to the Village and if there is anything we can help you with please let us know.

FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Elham Valley Ward. susan.carey@kent.gov.uk 01303 670 561 Considerable preparations have been made by KCC in case of disruption following a 'No Deal Brexit' and as I have reported on these before. I will simply add that the KCC website will be kept up to date with news and that local radio is a good source of information if there are problems, as all the public agencies will keep them updated. KCC currently has two important consultations under way. The first is on our 'Community Wellbeing Services'. These are extra services (over and above the statutory care services we provide) for older people, adults living with

dementia, physical disabilities or sensory impairments. They are delivered by 52 voluntary and community organisations across Kent and cover activities such as volunteer run transport services, dementia cafes and befriending.

KCC is consulting about how best to support these services in the future so that they are more 'joined up' and reach the right people. The consultation is available on www.kent.gov.uk/wellbeingconsultation until 01 December. If you want a paper copy of this then please contact me.

KCC is also consulting on its 2020/21 budget and asking residents to tell us which KCC services are their priorities. People are often surprised by the range of services that KCC provides and the consultation is designed to explain this as well as collect your views on what matters most. It is available at www.kent.gov.uk/budget until 25 November. KCC has a new leader as, after 14 years in the role, Paul Carter stood down at our last Council meeting on 17 October and we elected Roger Gough in his place. Roger lives with his family in West Kent and his children attend state schools. He's a very bright, experienced Councillor and a thoroughly nice man. Roger will be campaigning for Kent to have the infrastructure in place to properly support the growth we've taken in homes and jobs as well as protecting the things that make Kent special. I'm very pleased to be joining his Cabinet with responsibility for Environment. I have recently been asked for help with the funding of replacement patio doors at the Sellindge Sports and Social Club and will be allocating £3,000 of my KCC Member Grant towards the project. I hope to also be helping with the cost of replacement windows at Sellindge Village Hall. If you have a good local project in need of funding, do please contact me.

STOUR DOWNS PARISH CHURCHES – ST MARY'S CHURCH SELLINDGE

I have recently got into a current TV drama called World on Fire, which starts in the days leading up to the outbreak of WW2 – 80 years ago. This TV drama captures the desperate attempt by many to avoid at all costs the outbreak of another war, whilst faced with the path of destruction being trod across Europe by the Nazi jackboot. In view of these actions, the voices calling to avoid war because of the unforgotten deep pain of the conflict of a previous generation were also joined with an opposing cry to make a stand, to fight for King and Country.

Whilst we rightly recognise the heroism, bravery and grit of those who answered the call to fight and defend against all that threatened our shores, democracy and neighbours, we might overlook the resolve of those who stood resolutely to their beliefs (and faced condemnation and punishment) in not taking up arms.

There are always voices from different sides, and in the tension of any kind of conflict the ability to hear what the other is saying and to lay aside the emotion to find common ground is lost. The dreadful conflicts we pause to remember this November- and those who were killed because of them- came as the middle ground of peaceful co-existence was left for a stand on either side. As it was in 1914, 1939 and now in many ways today in 2019, we lose the sense to hear each other when emotion and language are stirred up by polarised debate.

We have to learn from history to live well together for today and all our tomorrows.

In a time of uncertainty, let us pray we can be the voices of calm and the ears who hear.

And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace. (James 3:18)
