The Children really enjoyed his visit. The event was well attended, and raised £203.75 for Sellindge Primary School.



THE STERLING AFFAIR

The latest novel from Sellindge-based author, Nathan Dylan Goodwin, has just been released.

The book, entitled *The Sterling Affair*, has received glowing reviews and featured at the top of Amazon's Historical Mystery charts around the world.

The story opens when an unannounced stranger turns up on main character, forensic genealogist Morton Farrier's doorstep, asking him to identify a man who had been secretly living under the name of her long-deceased brother. Morton uses his range of resources and research skills to help him deconstruct this mysterious man's life, ultimately leading him into the murky world of 1950s international affairs of state. Meanwhile, Morton is faced with his own alarmingly close DNA match which itself comes with far-reaching implications for the Farrier family.

This story is the eighth book in the genealogical crime mystery series, and is available in paperback and Kindle editions.

Councillors J Hollingsbee and S Carey were both unable to attend the 1st meeting of the New Year, due to other commitments, their short reports were read out however I will not precis them here, suffice to say their normal informative reports will be included elsewhere in the Newsletter.

There were the other normal headings of Finance, Planning etc., so below is a brief update. Minutes will be published on the Parish Council Website.

Under Planning your Council had no decisions to report, nor any applications to consider – this saved some time! Under Finance there was a number of items.

The Burial Grounds – both the old and New have had an updated survey of trees; some of these are in need of either remedial works to keep them healthy, with some needing to be cut down as they have died. Your Parish Council has agreed this work needs to be carried out and has asked for quote.

The survey found evidence of what might be bats living and or hibernating in a couple of the larger trees and further investigation will be required to keep these safe.

The Chairman reported that when he visited a couple of weeks ago rubbish had been dumped in the New Burial Ground. It would be appreciated if this did not take place.

In addition, your Parish Council is now working with Chris Denyer (Rev Chris) looking at ways the Churchyard can be maintained so that access is not a problem but, manages to keep and area for local insects, butterflies and months, but also the invertebrates that live in the area as well. More information as time goes on.

A debate took place regarding a traffic survey; it was finally decided that a traffic survey should take place and as your Parish Clerk I have been asked to contact the County Council. The survey will 'count' the total number of vehicles, but in addition will show how many small, large, and even larger lorries go through the village, as well as the number of cars, vans and motorcycles as well as their speed. Once we have this information we can lobby Highways England and Kent Highways to be more proactive when there are problems on the motorway.

Your Parish Council would like to receive suggestions on what you, as residents, would like to see on the 75th VE Day, so please me know as soon as possible, some money will be set aside. The 'Tommy' has now arrived and will before the day be erected – in a position yet to be agreed – so again any suggestions you may have do contact the office by phone or email or even visit. Opening hours can be found both on the website and the Newsletter. One other suggestion was made about having a newsletter every two months, events would still be advertised but if this helps with the costs it could be printed in full colour – what do you think? Again contact the office.

Finally, the budget for the coming year was agreed and this will be placed on the website; if you would like a copy on paper this can be supplied. The precept request, the money requested from Folkestone & Hythe District Council will be £50,000. Your Parish Councils budget was set at £68,946.00, less then precept request, as your Parish Council has included a contingency, not included before and also to set aside some funds for any new equipment that will be needed when your Parish Council takes over the running of the Village Green.

Some of you who have visited the office may have noted the poor condition it is in, and a survey has highlighted some issues with it. Your Parish Council is looking to obtain a replacement, this is because the one being supplied by Taylor Wimpey will not be built for another 2-3 years, and a newer port a cabin will cost less in the end, rather than expensive repairs.

Your Parish Council next meets on 11th February in the Durling Hall and you are welcome to attend; please bear in mind the meeting is a meeting held in public not a public meeting, however the Chairman will extend the time for members of the public if he feels it is required and even allows the meeting to be adjourned briefly, when members of the public may have information relating to the item being discussed, so please do come along.



Jenny.hollingsbee@folkestone-hythe.gov.uk 01303 812 066 susan.carey@folkestone-hythe.gov.uk 01303 670 561 Congratulations to our newly re-elected MP, Damian Collins who won an impressive 60% of the vote at the General Election on 12th December. Turnout in the constituency was 67% so well done as well to all of you for voting. Damian's vote was 35,483 votes giving him a majority of 21,337. Well done as well to the District Council staff who did all the administration of the election which is an enormous logistic feat. This year they will go through it all again for the Police and Crime Commissioner elections in May.

Now for some important news. At the most recent meeting of Folkestone & Hythe District Council on 18th December it was announced that we will spend £10m over the next 3 years to refurbish our existing Council homes and build a further 1,000 Council homes. This takes our commitment to 1,200 new Council homes over the next 10 years. This is a significant number of new homes for local people at affordable rents. If this wasn't enough excitement it was also announced that £10m will be ringfenced to fund climate change projects such as electric vehicles and charging points. The funding will come from £5m of reallocated reserves and then as necessary from prudential borrowing up to £15m, giving £20m across the two proposals. The Council's strong financial position after years of careful management and the plans for future land sales at Otterpool Park make this possible. We are both pleased and proud of these initiatives and hope they will be widely welcomed.

Copies of *Your District* magazine with news from the Council should be delivered to each household in February. It will also be available through the Council website which has recently been redesigned. We are still getting used to the changes and if you have comments on the new style website, please let the District Council know.

The Otterpool Park team at the District Council have held a series of meetings in December with the Parish Councils that encompass or neighbour the new Garden Town. A common theme was concern about existing highways problems caused whenever there are problems on the M20. There will therefore be a further meeting specifically arranged with Highways England to see what may be done.

FROM YOUR KCC COUNCILLOR Susan Carey, Elham Valley Ward. susan.carey@kent.gov.uk 01303 670 561

The decisive result of the General Election means we have certainty over many issues facing your County Council not least Brexit preparations. We no longer expect disruption on 31st January and Highways England plan to remove the much-loathed Operation Brock from the M20 by the end of January. This will of course mean that if there is cross Channel disruption due to bad weather, industrial action or other emergency, we will once again have Operation Stack and KCC is pressing the Government to do more to make trade between the UK and continent 'frictionless' by use of new technology for 'smart borders'.

I have been greatly enjoying getting to grips with my new responsibilities for Environment at Kent County Council. KCC has been working on environmental issue for many years and carbon emissions from our own buildings and activities have been on a downward trend for a long time. Looking at the work our officers are already engaged in, I am confident that KCC will be able to reach net zero-carbon. We will be sharing more details on the timescales for this in May 2020. I'm aware that many people want us to accelerate progress on this and I do as well. There's so much that has already been done and so much in progress. There's a £10m district heating project, public transport plans, solar panels on our buildings and opportunities for job creation in the new 'green' industries as well as further progress on reduction of domestic waste and improvement of recycling. These are projects largely in our direct control and what we call 'no regrets' actions – in other words projects that make sense for many reasons not just environmental and which we will not regret doing.

We have also committed that the **whole** of Kent (not just council-controlled activities) will be zero-carbon by 2050. This does not mean that nothing happens till 2050 as to reach this target an enormous amount must be done before then. Everyone will be able to contribute to this goal at an individual level, as a community, business or voluntary group level. I have asked the KCC officers to use our website to give advice on what makes the most impact. KCC has just launched a consultation about our next 5-year plan. It's been written with input from County Councillors as well as focus groups of Kent residents. Now every Kent resident has the chance to tell us if you think we have got the balance right. The ambition is to make Kent the best place to live, work, play, learn and invest in. The draft plan sets out seven outcomes to improve life in Kent. These are supported by a series of short and long-term objectives that we will deliver. The draft is clear about how we will work with partners and what we need from the Government. The document is, I believe, largely free of jargon and worth your attention. KCC has a track record of delivering on its 5 year plans so please go to www.kent.gov/5yearplan and tell us what you think. The consultation is open till 17 February 2020.

Plans for the expansion of Sellindge Primary School have now been submitted to Kent County Council and the reference number if you wish to look at the plans on the KCC website is KCC/FH/0628/2019. This first stage includes the construction of 6 new classrooms, a new landscaped play area, an increase in the size of the school playing field and additional parking. Comments on the application can be made via the website. I welcome this expansion of the school to accommodate increasing demand from our immediate area but if there are any concerns about the design, let me know so that I can raise them at the Planning Committee.

Rev. Chris' Thoughts

This part of the year brings about a time of decluttering. When January saw the Christmas decorations gone and the tidying up this entails, now we begin to look for the spring around the corner and perhaps think of the "spring clean" or the garden awaiting its post-winter clear up and readiness for spring. As well as in our homes, after the festive indulgences at the close of the year, in these infant months of a new year we are encouraged to attempt to live healthier and think about our diet and exercise. Indeed, the former has suddenly become entwined with the encouragement to live a greener, more sustainable life, with the proliferation of "Veganuary". I haven't yet discovered what the buzz word is for February... Maybe I could start one around the Vicar's well-known partiality-we could drink more tea in Feb-BREW-ary?
